



We waited 10 like to receive email news updates. minutes to let the bees settle down after their journey Debbie and John then transferred one frame at a time into the new hive. Debbie had kindly marked our Queen to make it easier to spot her, and we could make sure she was safely inside the new hive. The hive is fenced off and has brushwood screening to direct the flight of the bees away from the church and side gates. The bees will forage on willow and a variety of wildflowers to begin with - look out for them around Grinton, they look very different from bumblebees. They will seek out both pollen (for their protein) and nectar (for their energy), and the colony is already producing honey. Bats A group of bat watchers gathered in the churchyard as the final concert of the 2014 Festival was ending. Some concert goers were a bit surprised to meet a group gathered around the east end of the church, with their hoods up and faces covered (against midges!), and pointing black boxes into the sky (bat detectors...). There were lots of midges around (plenty of bat food) but the group only tracked about half a dozen pipistrelles - it was probably a bit cold and wet for them to be out. Last year, as we tracked the bats with volunteers form the North Yorkshire Bat Group, we heard a Noctule bat flying round the churchyard (this is the biggest British bat, the size of a song thrush). We were able to record its call this time, so the next thing is to try to work out where it is roosting. They like hollow trees, so it could

SAVE OUR BUS SERVICE - REETH - KELD - WE NEED YOUR HELP

You will probably be aware that our Bus Service between Reeth and Keld was cut in late April. Since then residents of Upper Swaledale have been campaigning to try and re-instate the service. Our campaign has included contacting local Councillors, our local MP William Hague, both a paper and an online petition and also two public meetings in Muker Public Hall.

We also put together a number of case studies showing how these cuts had affected parts of our community e.g. people relying on the bus for work, doctor's appointments and for after school activities. The case studies also showed how the cuts affected local businesses and the impact on tourism to the dale. We have been helped a great deal by The Campaign for Better Transport who are a National Organisation and we have also had a great deal of support from both local residents and visitors to the Dale.

We have been successful in that an alternative service is currently being provided using the local Little White Bus. However it is on a short-term trial basis. The trial will last three months and we are doing everything in our power to ensure that the service is well advertised and well used, so that we can show North Yorkshire County Council that this is a service that should never have been cut. Please help us to keep the scheduled service running by using the bus between Reeth and Keld and also wherever possible letting people know that the service is available for use.





MEDICAL PROVISION DURING THE TOUR DE FRANCE

Most of you I am sure cannot help but notice that there will be a few people cycling through our area at the beginning of July. Medical support plans for the big day are well in hand and we are working with our colleagues in the Yorkshire Ambulance Service to provide care to all the visitors and locals over the weekend. Whilst the focus seems to be on the big day and the Mountain Rescue Team pulling people out of the Buttertubs, we are slightly apprehensive about how the large number of visitors will affect GP services in the run up to the event. If the forecasts are to be believed, the local population in Swaledale could increase by up to twenty times. The practice operates at or about capacity most days and we are concerned about large numbers of visitors overwhelming the medical centre. On any given day, I would estimate that 1 in a 100 people suffer some sort of minor illness or injury. This could result in up to 200 people needing attention during the peak of the event! NHS England has stated that there are no extra resources (doctors, nurses etc) to put forward if this were to happen. In order to prepare ourselves and to

enable us to continue to provide existing care for locals, we have taken the following steps:

We have cancelled all evening routine GP appointments on the week prior to the Tour; morning surgeries will remain the same.

We would ask that guesthouse owners, campsite owners etc...to advise visitors to call 111 for health advice before coming to the practice. It may be that the visitor needs an alternative service or may not need to be seen at all and some advice would suffice.

Please try and collect repeat prescriptions early to avoid the week before the race- the dispensary staff are happy to put an early order through if this helps.

Please use the car park for dropping off/ collecting if possible during the week before the race to avoid congestion and allow emergency access.

All these things may change as the event unfolds. Even now, the numbers seem hard to comprehend. We will keep you all posted with a notice board outside the practice nearer the time. Hopefully, with a few changes, we can keep things running smoothly and provide a positive experience for everyone!

"I'm now up to 250 miles a week in training and feeling well up for the challenge.

"Initially, it was just a bit of joshing between the CEOs but it's become more serious because I can't believe they will look as good as me in Lycra. I should add that I'm doing twice as many miles as they are on the ride, but I'm still confident in doing it in half their time."

Tony Clark, Managing Director of Richmondshire District Council, said: "It is an exciting time for Richmondshire and we are delighted that the Tour de France will be making its way through our District on July 5. This cycle ride is the perfect starting block for what promises to be a momentous occasion for Yorkshire."

The Grand Départ Stage 1 will leave Leeds on July 5 for a breath-taking, 190-kilometre ride through the National Park to Harrogate. The route will go along Wharfedale, Bishopdale, Wensleydale and Swaledale. with climbs over Kidstones from Wharfedale into Bishopdale. Buttertubs Pass from Wensleydale to Swaledale and then out of Grinton towards Levburn.

And on the following day, the cyclists will skirt through the southern edge of the National Park as they ride past Bolton Abbey on their way from York to Sheffield.

David joked: "The bike ride is a really good way of promoting the Grand Départ because there's hardly been any publicity about it!"
