

We would like to thank the Orchard Group for allowing us to stage our fourth Annual Tea party in the wonderful community garden in August. It was a very convivial occasion, and thank you everyone who baked, helped and came, and some did all three! The rain held off until we had finished and everyone appreciated the glorious surroundings. We raised a handsome £300 thanks to you all. See some photographs taken that day by Stuart Howat on our website, under Your Photos of the Museum. Our exhibition 'People of the Dale' has been an immense success; with visitors from far and wide. Adrian Croft who was back in Reeth from Australia, not only visited us to see the panel on his father Cuthbert, but also brought us copies of letters written by Jabez Raisbeck from the 1880-90s. #### THE CHILDREN'S SOCIETY

Every year, around 100,000 children and young people under 16 in the UK run away from home. Each one of them is someone's daughter, someone's son - yet shockingly two in three of these children and young people won't be reported missing by a parent or indeed any adult in whose care they would have been.

Alone and on the street, many of these children face real and immediate danger from adults that may harm and exploit them. The Childrens' Society works to keep children and young people safe and with your help will continue doing so.

It relies heavily on voluntary contributions. One way money is collected is by a volunteer becoming a Children's Society Boxholder. Each year house boxes raise over £2million - that is enough to cover at least four projects' running costs for an entire year.

It is now time for the annual opening of our boxes so there will be a tea party at the Vicarage, Reeth on Wednesday 15th October from 2.00 pm - 4.30 pm when the money will be counted. If it's not possible for you to come that afternoon you may leave your box at the Vicarage in advance or contact Pauline Oldershaw on 886790 for other arrangements to be made. If you are not a box holder, but would like to join us for a cup of tea, you are very welcome. £50 raised that afternoon would provide basic provisions including warm clothes, toiletries and a blanket for five homeless young people. #### MYTHICAL MAZE

Regular users of the library at Hudson House may have been mystified at the sudden appearance of many more junior members using the library over the summer period. The reason for this was that we were running the Summer Reading Challenge, in conjunction with North Yorkshire Libraries, for children at Reeth and Gunnerside and Arkengarthdale Schools.

The more books they read, the more "rewards" they achieved, in the form of scented stickers to attach to a Mythical Maze fold-out poster, book marks and fridge magnets. The ultimate prize was a gold medal, complete with red ribbon, which they were awarded as soon as they had read six books. The final accolade was the presentation of a Mythical Maze certificate, theirs to keep and frame for posterity.

We increased our stock of children's books for the Reading Challenge so that they had plenty to choose from, but some young readers' appetites were so voracious that instead of the minimum of six books needed to complete the challenge, they gobbled up many more.

Children's reading can "dip" during the long summer holidays. The annual Summer Reading Challenge helps get three quarters of a million children into libraries to keep up their reading skills and confidence. It's supported by the Arts Council England and the Reading Agency and is aimed at children aged four to eleven.

## HARDRAW SCAR BRASS BAND

The fine weekend saw hundreds of people going to Hardraw Scar high up in Wensleydale, deep in the Yorkshire Dales. The attraction was the Hardraw Brass Band Contest, the oldest open air contest in the country. Thirteen brass bands came to compete including Besses' o' th Barn who last took part in 1889, having been banned from entering due to having won the competition three times in a row. The wonderful setting is used for the competition through the generosity of the owner Mark Thompson of the Green Dragon, Hardraw. The local representation in the contest was Leyburn Band competing against such heavy weights as Besses, Hade Edge, Durham Miners Association Band and other bands of all standards.

The audience was treated to a feast of music as each of the bands gave a 20mins performance of their own choice. The adjudicator was Ian Brownbill.

The section for 4<sup>th</sup> and ungraded bands was won by Leyburn who so impressed the adjudicator that they were awarded 195 points. This was more than any other band in the competition and was a real triumph for the local dales band and their conductor Rebecca Lundberg. Leyburn also won the award in their class for the Best Hymn, The Best March, the Best Bass Section and their conductor Rebecca Lundberg won the award for the Conductor of the band with most points. - Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)
- Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure)
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Chronic Liver Disease
- Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease)

Diabetes

Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some, it car even be life-threatening. I can't recommend the 'fly vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible. I will be joining you with my annual jab.
