Reeth-Grinton Motorway

Yorkshire Dales Rangers and Volunteers have been hard at work improving the Park Field path, between Reeth Bridge and Grinton Bridge.

On a few occasions I'd noticed wheelchair users having to by-pass this route due to its kissing gate at the Fremington end and the steps up to Grinton Bridge at the other, making it inaccessible to them. These features would also exclude parents pushchairs; the alternative being a narrow pavement alongside the main road. The surface, too, was becoming increasingly narrow and muddy in places. As we are always looking to improve accessibility this job was a likely candidate for funding from our "Access for All" work programme.

After some serious negotiation with the respective land owners and tenants the project began in February. The first thing to consider was how we could remove unnecessary barriers. There were always going to be a lot of gates to keep those giddy lambs enclosed but we have managed to make them all wider and self closing. There is

now one fewer – which hasn't gone lunnoticed!

Secondly we had to bypass the bridge steps. With Mr Brown's agreement we now have a short Permissive Footpath which allows users to get to the roadside without having to scale the steps. To finish off we have topped up the surface material to make it a lot drier.

Projects like these are always hard work - and not just physically. There has been much negotiation and cooperation but now we have a really good improvement to a footpath which is used as much by local people as visitors. I have been getting a lot of positive comments: when they come from locals, it means all the more.

Thanks go to our hard working Dales Volunteers and volunteers from Phoenix House on Catterick Garrison as well as the farmers who have helped to bring this project to life.



Dales Cup Final Reeth AFC V Unicorn FC 9th May 2015

(at Ferrand Park, Spennithorne)

Reeth got off to a dream start, Joe Woodall turning in the rebound on 6 minutes, as the Unicorn 'keeper could only parry Stephen Allison's shot. A good omen: in all rounds of the competition when Reeth scored first they went on to win. They continued their lively start, but chances went begging and when Unicorn striker Shaun Charlton was left unmarked on the half hour, he trapped a pass and turned to fire low inside the post to level the score.

Reeth had the better of the half. but it remained one all at the break and as the match resumed it was clear that Unicorn had raised their game. Reeth were slow to settle and were caught only 4 minutes after the restart. Unicorn, taking a 2-1 lead, courtesy of a wickedly deflected shot defender's leg. They continued to frustrate Reeth's efforts to find their first half rhythm and only a brilliant, instinctive save by Reeth goalie, Mark Butcher, palming a bullet of a strike by Unicorn's Tom Keegan, averted another goal.

As the match ticked on to 90 minutes, Unicorn looked to have edged a victory that would see them lift the cup. Reeth, however, summoned up a final push and, in the 91st minute, Karl Longden broke through the opposition back line to collect a long pass and striding on had only the advancing goalkeeper to beat, as the Reeth supporters roared him on. He struck his

shot, but hit the Unicorn stopper. Fortunately, the ball came back to him and keeping his composure he calmly headed in, over the stranded 'keeper, for a dramatic equaliser, sending the crowd wild.

Extra time belonged to Reeth, who, shrugging off their sluggish second half, found their game again. Ten minutes into the first period, full-back Michael (Bodge) Roger tracked down the right and swept in an angled shot from 30 yards, past the bemused goalkeeper, to put them 3-2 up.

They spurned a series of excellent chances to put the tie to bed, including a Stephen Allison header against the bar, until, 9 minutes of the second period gone, they got their reward. Stephen Allison's shot came back off the foot of the post and substitute Stephen Fleming made amends for an earlier miss by rifling the ball into the roof of the net, to ensure Reeth got their hands on the trophy, running out Dales Cup winners by 4 goals to 2.

Grinton Bells

One of the features of St Andrews Church in Grinton is its six bells. The oldest bell dates from 1693. The bells are rung regularly for church services and weddings and on other notable occasions. There is an active group of ringers whom you may have heard practicing on Friday evenings. In addition there are frequent visits from bell ringers from other parts of the country.

There was a major refurbishment of the church in 1896 and at that time three of the bells were recast, but in 1926 a new frame was installed and the bells rehung. Although the frame that was installed had space for eight bells, the tower has only ever had six bells. We don't know why only six bells were hung, and can only guess that the money ran out.

There is now a major opportunity to add the two missing bells. As you may have read, St Mary's in Richmond is launching an appeal to replace all of its current bells so as part of this project, Grinton has been offered two bells. Of course it is not simply a matter of moving the bells. Taylor's, the bell foundry in Loughborough has assessed our bells and has determined that one of the Richmond bells can be retuned and a further bell can be made to make up the ring of eight.

We believe this is an unparalleled opportunity and will preserve and develop ringing in the dale for generations to come.

The total cost of the project is estimated at £21,000 of which £12,000 is the cost of the new bells

and their installation, and £9,000 is the cost of urgent work required to keep the bells in ringable order.

We are now launching an appeal to cover the costs of this project. Some grants are available, but require matched funding. It will be possible to engrave the new bell with donors names or in memory of loved ones.

There will be fundraising events taking place over the next few months and we hope you will be able to support these. In the meantime, donations can Wilkinson. be sent to John Churchwarden. Topside House. Marrick, Richmond, Cheques should be Grinton Church made payable to Council. Astronomy in the Two Dales

Summer is here! On June 21st at 17.38 pm the

summer solstice occurs, marking the mid-point of our year with short nights and long days, an astronomer's worst nightmare -there is nothing more we astronomers like than clear dark skies (and freezing cold temperatures).


This month we have two opportunities to view the inner planets when they are at their furthest point from our sun.

On the 6th of June the planet Venus reaches greatest eastern elongation of 45.4 degrees from the Sun. This is the best time to view Venus since it will be at its highest above the horizon, Look for the bright planet in the western sky after sunset. If you are using binoculars see if you can see the line dividing the sunlit and darkside of the planet - which should appear as a halfdisk The 6th of June is also the final night of Astronomy Watch on the green in Reeth, check Reethastro.org website for weather information and confirmation of the event going ahead or look outside and see if the sky is

clear, wrap up well and come down to the green after 10.00 pm.

On the 24th of June the planet Mercury also reaches greatest western elongation of 22.5 degrees from the Sun. This is the best time to view Mercury since it will be at its highest point above the horizon in the morning sky. Look for the planet low in the eastern sky just before sunrise. But be careful if using binoculars or telescopes and stop before the sun rises.

The moon is full on the 2nd and after about 10.45 can be seen near a bright object in the southern sky. This is the planet Saturn , which rises much earlier but only becomes visible when the sky begins to darken. In the western sky Jupiter is setting and just to its left can be seen a bright star, Regulus, part of the constellation of Leo, the lion. Mythology has it that this is the Nemean lion whose hide no

weapon could pierce, killed by Hercules, the Greek hero, who stunned it with his club and then strangled it. So beware of men carrying clubs and declaring themselves to be cat inspectors.

Stay Safe: Never look directly at the sun, and never look in its direction when using binoculars or telescopes. If going out after dark, wrap up warm and make sure someone knows where you are.

The Swaledale Big Dig

The Big Dig is progressing well. At the time of writing we have dug 29 test pits. By the time you read this it will be around 35, mainly in Reeth and now we move on to Fremington and Grinton.

We hope that one of the lasting legacies of the Big Dig will be an enhanced interest in the history of our local villages and particularly the newly formed Local History Group. Members of this group have been active in transcribing the local tithe apportionments which show who owned what and lived where in 1844. They completed the Grinton apportionment which fully is now searchable via the SWAAG database at www.swaag.org following the 'Archival info and docs' button in the Bia Dia section of the home page.

The group is now working on the Reeth tithe apportionment. For those without internet access, the transcriptions will be available at the North Yorkshire County Record Office, Northallerton.

The Grinton tithe apportionment includes some interesting field names which can give us clues as to life in the middle of the 19th century. For example, there are a number of fields with corn in their names, indicating a corn field either then or in earlier times. Note that at that time 'corn' was used as a generic term for wheat, rye, barley and oats. As far as am I aware no corn is now grown in this part of Swaledale.

We also have Great and Little Marlpit where 'marl', a calcareous clay, was dug to fertilise the fields. Other field names are less obvious; for example: Whalsey, East and West Silkwit, Stelling Close, Scroggs, Pease Buggin, Mirk Gill, Gruel Mire, Cuddy Spout, Cullen Green and Boggle Style Close. A 'boggle' is an early term for a ghost or spirit. Was this a field in which ghosts were seen? If you know what any of these field names mean then please let us know.

Finally, our test-pitting will continue in Fremington on 20th/21st June and in Grinton over the weekend of 18th/19th July. We will also have a pit on Reeth Green during the Swaledale Festival on Friday 29th May.

Although we refer to 'digging' a test-pit there is very little hard work involved. If you can do gardening, you can do the Big Dig. Some jobs like sieving, recording and washing finds can done whilst sitting (if you bring your own chair!). If you are able to help then please do get in touch.

Upper Dales Family History Group

Our April speaker was Dr David Severs who had not only researched his clock making ancestor Hugh Pannell but had also traced over one hundred and twenty of the clocks and watches made by him and his son.

Hugh Pannell was born in Stokesley in 1721 and was apprenticed there before moving to the more prosperous town of Northallerton where there were more customers for his wares. As his business grew Hugh was able to invest in property and David had traced various shops and houses that he had owned or occupied, using the Deeds Register as well as Manorial Court Records, Quarter Sessions and Rating Assessments.

David showed slides of the clocks, many of which had distinctive or unusual features. Clocks could be made to run for 30 hours, 8 days or even 30 days before needing to be wound. Most of the Pannell pieces were 8 day clocks, implying that the Northallerton clients were rich enough to afford the more expensive mechanisms.

He illustrated different styles of clock faces, explaining that a law had required the clock maker to put his name on the dial and also the town where it was made.

A number had additional functions such as the phases of the moon and the date. As time went on brass dials went out of fashion in favour of painted ones which did not tarnish and often had beautiful illustrations in the corners. Different styles of numbering also helped him to work out when the clock


was made.

News From Dr Brookes

Falls Prevention Scheme

The practice is pleased to announce that we are to become a pilot for an ambitious project to help prevent and reduce falls in the over 75s. The project was devised at the practice and given the go ahead by the Hambleton, Richmondshire and Whitby Clinical Commissioning Group.

Falls are a major cause of injury, disability and death in the older age group. There is no simple quick fix and so the project attempts to work on many different variables which have been shown to contribute towards fall risk.

Part project involves of the providing a falls seminar for the community. Anyone is welcome to attend this. There will be a variety of workshops and speakers covering osteoporosis subjects such αs prevention, exercise. home improvements practical and also sessions on how to get off the floor if you do have a fall as well as checks on walking sticks and aids. The seminar will be held at Reeth Memorial Hall on Thursday 11th June at 2pm. It is free to attend and refreshments will be provided. In addition, all over 75 year olds registered with the practice will receive a free falls prevention booklet, which has been designed by the practice.

This is an exciting project for us, particularly as this was the only

successful bid out of all the practices in the Clinical Commissioning Group. We hope that it can reduce injury and hospital admissions associated with falls and will be reporting on our findings at the end of the year.

Care Quality Commission Inspection

The practice received its first scheduled inspection from the Care Quality Commission (CQC) on 1st May. This is very similar to an Ofsted inspection in schools.

The CQC inspectors look at every aspect of the practice, from antibiotic prescribing data to how often the curtains are cleaned, in order to make sure our service is safe, effective, caring, responsive and well led. The inspection lasted just under six hours.

We are very grateful to everyone who completed a CQC comments card or came to the practice to speak to the inspection team. The feedback we received from the inspectors was very positive, although the final grading will not be known for about eight weeks.



Grinton Conservation

Bats: We held the first bat count of the season on 1st April but the weather was still cold and no bats were seen.

Brigitte returned the following week, as it had warmed up, finding that the bats had returned from their winter hibernation. The bats were very vocal, having a good discussion before leaving for their niaht's foragina. Brigitte counted twenty soprano pipistrelles and six common pipistrelles. It is still early in the season so hopefully the numbers will increase in this maternity roost and there will be plenty of young.

Do come along and enjoy the spectacle these fascinating creatures provide - details below.

Bees: numbers are increasing steadily and all appear to be healthy. We've refed them the spare honey left from the winter. They are now busy bringing in nectar and pollen from spring flowers on warm days, but with the sudden dips in temperature, we are not out of the woods yet. We are hoping to split the colony in the next month so we can fill our two other hives.

Coordinator: Would you like to support Project Conservation without getting your hands dirty? We need someone to help coordinate news and Enthusiasm activities. is more important than experience. If you'd like to know more call Catherine on 884780. Labyrinth: Kevin Pellatt has organised a labyrinth for the churchyard during the Swaledale festival. There will be guidance leaflets available, including an explanation on how to "experience" the labyrinth.

Willow Weaving: Expert weaver Leilah Vyner helped us create a bench, to allow people to enjoy the quiet space of the west end of the churchyard. Group helpers worked on some fantastic fish shaped arms for the simple birch bench, Leilah is completing these for us and fixing them to the bench. We may be able to infill the back of the bench by weaving that too. Meanwhile, look out for future events, and find the bench and enjoy it! The Diocese Mission Innovation Fund funded the bench, as it fulfils one of the Christian '7 Marks of Mission' - that of 'safeguarding the integrity of creation' - and to recognise the conservation group's work.

Your Little White Bus Service 30

The bus has been running since April, with paid drivers and also volunteer drivers from Reeth, Gunnerside, and Muker. To sustain it we obviously need as many passengers as possible. Here are some suggestions for using the bus for both locals and visitors:

From Up Dale

- Using the scheduled service, spend around 2 hours in Reeth (10.40 to 12.30, or 14.00 to 16.00) before returning up dale
- Spend at least one hour in Richmond (11.05 to 12.05, or 14.25 to 15.35) or four and a half hours (11.05 to 15.35)
- Use the four and a half hours in Richmond to go to Darlington and back. (A 35 minute journey each way, with buses every 20 minutes.)
- Using the on demand service, spend all day in Richmond (8.55 until 17.35) or most of the day in Darlington using connecting buses.
- Using the on demand service, catch any train leaving Darlington after 9.45, or, using the scheduled service, any train leaving after 11.45
- · Using the on demand service, get

back up dale from any train arriving in Darlington before 16.40, or, using the scheduled bus service, any train arriving before 14.30

From Reeth or Richmond

- Use the first bus in the morning to travel up dale and then walk back as far as you like before catching the early or late afternoon bus back to your start point.
- Or, drive up dale, park your car and use the bus to walk sections of the coast to coast.
- Choose to walk over the tops or by the riverside. Approximate distances from Keld: Muker 3 miles; Gunnerside 6 miles; Reeth 12 miles.
- From Richmond, spend between one and two hours, or up to eight hours, in Reeth - walking, visiting the market on Fridays - or up to seven hours in Gunnerside, Muker or Keld.

Please note: The driver will drop you off anywhere safe on route in the upper dale or pick you up if you wave him/her down.

Dogs and bikes are free. There is space for two cycles (best to phone to check availability). Go uphill by bus and cycle down: Tour de France for softies.

Reeth Parish Council April 2015

Public transport: Councillors were informed of changes to the bus service between Keld and Richmond which had come into force from April 13. Partly using a ring to ride arrangement this meant that there were now four return services a day to Keld including early morning and evening trips.

Highways: Plans were distributed of proposed surface dressing in the area. Coun Allinson had inspected the setts around the green and reported that a large number of them were out of place with a similar situation near Quaker Close flats. A Highways representative would be invited to meet the green wardens and inspect the whole village to make a full list of repairs required.

Cycle ride: Notice was received of a cycle ride on May 16 when around 400 riders will pass through the parish during the day, mostly in small groups.

Water supply: Yorkshire Water's work to upgrade the water supply in the dale was likely to close the Arkengarthdale Road for a matter of weeks, probably in September. The clerk was asked to write a letter pointing out the disruption this would cause to residents and in particular to children travelling to school.

Playground: An RDC inspection had suggested that some seats on the swings needed replacing. This will be looked into.

Goal posts: Concerns were raised about liability for damage to property or vehicles caused by the use of goal posts on the green and also whether the council had the right to erect

anything on the green. The legal restrictions would be looked into before any decision could be taken. A member of the public present suggested that if it was found that the restrictions allowed it, the council should consider putting posts and chain links alongside part of the green to prevent parking on areas which were easily damaged.

Traffic control: District Councillor Richard Beal had raised concerns with the police about speeding on the Arkengarthdale Road. They would be looking into this, probably using a speed data logger.

Memorial Hall: The Memorial Hall accounts were received and queries would be referred back to the treasurer.

Healaugh green: The grant from the Community Opportunities Fund had been passed and the grasscreting of the damaged area of green would go ahead.

Housing: Councillors would support an application by a Healaugh family to have the local occupancy clause removed from their property as it was making it impossible to sell and would be counter-productive if it forced them to move out of the area in order to buy a family sized home.

Village pound: No rent had been received for the Pound and the clerk would find out if the current tenant wished to renew the lease since he no longer lived in the village.

Street lights: A number of lights had not yet been repaired and others were now not working in Quaker Close, Langhorne Drive and Back Lane. They would all be reported again.
