Post Office News

Another Scam

One of our customers recently came in to say that he had received an e-mail, apparently from DVLA, informing him that he was due a refund of vehicle tax. His suspicions had been raised as he had only recently renewed his vehicle tax and was not aware of any refund due. so he contacted DVLA.

In response the DVLA confirmed that the e-mail was not from them and stated: "The DVLA is aware of an e-mail scam that asks drivers to verify their driving license and vehicle tax details via an online link. The e-mail, which wrongly claims to have been sent from DVLA, appears to be an attempt to trick drivers into providing personal details. We strongly advise anyone who receives one of these or a similar e-mail, to ignore it and not to follow the instructions given."

As always, be very wary of any e-mails asking you to verify personal or banking details on line. If in doubt, contact the organisation yourself (as our customer did) and check to see if the e-mail - or telephone call - is legitimate.

Heritage Lottery Fund Support For Holy Trinity Church

Holy Trinity church at Low Row has received a confirmed grant of £19,900 from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) for essential repairs to be carried out to the stonework and glazing of the north windows, the east window and two of the south windows. The gallery and vestry windows will also be reglazed.

Detailed examinations were carried out last year and specialist reports were received from a glazier which recommended what needed to be done. Work will start in the next few weeks and is likely to continue for some months, though the intention is that the church will remain open for services and visitors as usual.

The church sits snugly within the magnificent and wild Dales scenery. A Victorian chapel in the Early English style, it has plain leaded glass windows and little decoration. Its attraction lies in its lightness and simplicity.

It has been an important focus for village life since 1840 and continues to be a place of interest for visitors and locals alike. As well as regular services, weddings, baptisms and funerals, it hosts village events and concerts, including some for the annual Swaledale Festival

One of the churchwardens, Andrew Bedford, said: "We're delighted that the Heritage Lottery Fund has given us this support. The church has provided a place of peace and tranquillity for everyone for the past 170 years and it's great to know that we are a step closer to preserving it for another century.

"Even though the church will have some windows boarded up while the work goes on, it will be 'business as usual' as far as the life of the church is concerned, with Sunday services, weddings, baptisms and funerals all going on as normal. We'll also continue to encourage visitors to come and appreciate the beauty of the church and its incomparable setting."

Explaining the importance of the HLF support, Fiona Spiers, Head of HLF Yorkshire and Humber, said; "There is a place of worship in almost every ward, village and town across the Yorkshire and Humber region, providing a very powerful visual connection with our past. This award to Holy Trinity will help secure the immediate future of the church enabling its continued use within the community and allow people to learn more about the stories and heritage of the building."



Astronomy in the Two Dales

At the time this is being hastily written, to meet

the deadline of he who wears shorts, the final Astronomy Watch on Reeth green has just occurred and we would like to take a moment to thank all the people, an estimated 200 of you, who braved the chilly weather and bracing winds to support the 3 days of astronomy.

Whilst the weather may not have been perfect, the planets Venus, Jupiter and Saturn did their best to provide us with something to look at and while the poor seeing conditions prevented observation of some of the more exotic deep sky objects, some stars appeared for us to view.

We would also like to thank Marcus Grover, from Grover's optic shop, who risked getting blown back to Northallerton by 60 mph winds as he set up his stand on the green.

In July there is a conjunction of Venus and Jupiter that will be visible in the evening sky. The two bright planets will appear to be extremely close together, appearing only 0.3 degrees apart. Look for this impressive sight in the western sky just after sunset, before they disappear behind the hills.

There is also the Delta Aquarids meteor shower. This is an average shower that can produce up to 20 meteors per hour at its peak. It is produced by debris left behind by comets Marsden and Kracht. This will be visible from July 12 to August 23

and peaks this year on the night of July 28 and morning of July 29. Unfortunately the nearly full moon will block out all but the brightest meteors, however some of the brightest will still be visible. The meteors will be seen in the constellation of Aquarius, so look in a south easterly direction but can appear anywhere in the sky.

This month we shall take a look at one of the easily recognisable groups of stars, the Plough.



The Plough is composed of the seven brightest stars of the constellation Ursa Major, so the technical term for the Plough is an asterism. In our part of the world it is sometimes referred to as the butcher's cleaver and Charlie's Wain or Charlie's Wagon. The Plough is made up of the following stars Dubhe, Merak, Phecda, Megrez, Alioth, Mizar and Alkaid. Mizar has a close companion called Alcor. If you can make out the 2 stars with the naked eye, then you would qualify for training as an archer in ancient times.

Stay Safe: Never look directly at the sun, and never look in its direction when using binoculars or telescopes. If going out after dark, wrap up warm and make sure someone knows where you are.

Currently all three year old children are entitled to up to 15 hours of free early education in a setting of parents' choice. the and Government intention is to raise this to 30 hours a week for working parents from September 2016.

The Swaledale Big Dig

We are continuing to make good progress with The Big Dig. At the time of writing we have dug 35 test pits: 33 in Reeth and 2 in Fremington. By the time you read this it will be around 40, as we move our focus on to Fremington and Grinton.

In May we dug our first two testpits in Fremington. These produced a good amount of medieval pottery. suggesting that the medieval village extended further to the West than it does today. We hope that further pits in the village during our June digging weekend will give us better understanding of how Fremington developed in medieval times.

One significant outcome of the Big Dig is the creation of a Local History Group. Members of the group have been active in transcribing the local tithe apportionments which show who owned what and lived where in 1844. They have completed the Grinton apportionment and should have finished the same for Reeth by the time you read this. You can search these via the SWAAG database at www.swaaq.org by following the 'Archival info and docs' button in the Big Dig section of the home page. For those without internet access, the transcriptions will be available at the North Yorkshire County Record Office, Northallerton,

Finally, our test-pitting will continue in Grinton over the weekend of $18^{th}/19^{th}$ July. Opportunities to join our test pitting programme are coming to an end as this is the second and last year of the Big Dig. Although we refer to 'digging' a test-pit there is very little hard work involved. If you can do gardening, you can do the Big Dig. Some jobs like sieving, recording and washing finds can be done whilst sitting (if you bring your own chair!). If you are able to help then please do get in touch.

Local Community First Responders: Can You Help Us To Help You?

Reeth and Grinton Community First Responders cover, despite what our title may suggest, most of Swaledale, all of Arkengarthdale and points in between. We are volunteers, trained and supported by North Yorkshire Ambulance Service to provide preambulance basic life support in the event of Red 1 and Red 2 emergency calls. These are 999 calls for an ambulance to attend life threatening incidents such as heart attack, stroke, choking, fitting, unconsciousness, chest pains, breathing difficulties, etc., but not trauma.

Because the nearest ambulance stations are Richmond and Bainbridge, local volunteers can reach a distressed patient quickly and provide emergency care until the ambulance arrives. Please remember, in an emergency call 999 and ask for 'Ambulance' and the ambulance response desk will simultaneously despatch an ambulance and the Community First Responder on duty.

The Dales are now filling with our visitors for the summer season and we should remember that it is important that all road users are courteous and that we need to share our highways with others. Our Responder vehicles are our own cars and therefore indistinguishable from other road users, except we will have a Community First Responder sign on the sides.





Windows 10 Is On Its Way

No one seems to be asking what happened to Windows 9, but Windows 10 is going to be released later this year.

According to press reports Windows 10 will be a free upgrade for Windows 7 and Windows 8 users for the first 12 months after its release. After 12 months you will need to pay for the upgrade.

So what is happening?

Firstly, Microsoft are addressing some of the issues that caused so much upset when Windows 8 originally appeared. For anyone using Windows 8 you will have seen the start screen that replaced the long familiar Windows Start Menu. For anyone still using Windows 7 or earlier this a full screen presentation of Apps that are installed. These are not like traditional Windows programs and huge amounts confusion have arisen over the naming of this new style - originally called

Metro. Microsoft had to back track after getting into a trademark dispute with the German company called Metro and changed the name to Modern.

They adopted the name Universal Apps. Typically they do smaller tasks, take over the whole screen and feel very similar to apps you may have experienced on smart phones and tablets. In fact Universal apps are designed to work on any Windows 8 or later devices - phones, tablets and unlike normal computers programs which really only work on computers.

Some people like this app based approach on a computer (laptop or desktop) but I have never felt they work terribly well, especially computers that don't have touch screens. It led to a way of working that felt a little schizophrenic - constantly swapping backwards and forwards between a traditional style of Windows and the new start page.

Microsoft is addressing this in a fairly sensible way: If you use Windows 10 on a device which has a touch screen it will automatically start on the Start page and work rather like a tablet; but if you are using a mouse and keyboard it will start on the traditional windows desktop with a modified start menu that will be at least familiar to Windows XP, Visa and 7 users. The new menu will mostly work in the same way

as earlier start menus except that the final version. there will be a panel including access to the Start Screen Apps.

It remains to be seen whether this approach will win over the Windows 8 haters or annoy the Windows 8 lovers. Just as with Windows 8, third party companies are already developing programs to replace the new start menu with a more traditional one.

Secondly, Windows 10 will see the beginning of the end of Internet Explorer. It is likely to be available in Windows 10 but you will have to go searching for it.

My guess is at some point it will disappear altogether. Microsoft are building a new application for browsing the internet, Codenamed Spartan, Microsoft have just announced that this will be called Microsoft Edge in

As more information about release dates become clear I will write more about Windows 10 but I would advise not to download and install the free upgrade immediately after release: Give it a few months and let them clear up the inevitable teething problems.


