#### Reeth Parish Council July 2015

Air crash memorial: Coun Kendall distributed information about the fatal air crash on Fremington Edge in 1943 involving members of the Canadian air force. The clerk would look into the cost of a possible memorial plaque and a decision would be taken later on the best site for it.

Fire and rescue service: Members were advised of an online survey for the North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue consultation process through their website. Public comment was welcomed although the proposals would not directly affect the Reeth service.

**Scott Trial:** The clerk had written a letter of support for the planning application and understood that permission had now been granted.

**Local transport:** Information on the latest local transport plan consultation would be circulated to members.

**Playground:** A RoSPA inspection of the playground equipment would be carried out in September.

Village pound: Tenders for the use of the pound had been invited through the local press.

**Street lights:** Coun Frankland reported that faulty lights had now been fixed apart from one near Quaker Close flats which was not the responsibility of the district council.

A number of trees needed to be cut back as they were causing further damage to the wall. Complaints had also been received about a rose bush overhanging the pavement and the householder would be asked to trim it back.

**Reeth green:** The clerk had obtained a copy of the original 1992 agreement with Lord Peel regarding the use of the green and its maintenance.

Parking: Residents who had parked on land at the bottom of the village for many years had complained about new BT signs preventing this. It was understood that this was because parked vehicles would block access to the new telephone cabinet. There was a lengthy discussion regarding parking around the village which was becoming increasing problem for both an residents and visitors. Councillors will continue to look into the situation although there is no obvious solution.

**Recycling and bins:** Coun Beal would follow up problems with the cardboard recycling skip and dog waste bins not being emptied frequently enough.

**Defibrillator:** The clerk would look into the possibility of getting one for Reeth for use in emergencies. **Tracy Little**

#### Park Volunteers Get Stoned, Man

National Park Volunteers, known as Dales Volunteers or DVs, will turn their hand to most tasks which are likely to improve people's enjoyment, access to or knowledge of the Yorkshire Dales. They are a very diverse group of people with an equally diverse range of skills. There are about 220 in total and they gave 5561 days of work last year mainly surveying, practical work or leading guided walks. That's like having an extra 25 full time staff!

Recently one of our DVs came to me with a copy of the Dalesman magazine's June letter page. A Mr Musgrave of York had written in to highlight the poor condition of the stone man or cairn at Fell End above Arkle Town and Storthwaite Hall. It had been collapsed for some time, I believe, so this was a general call to anyone who might be willing or able to rebuild it. To our trusty DVs this was a challenge to rise to - even if it was all the way up on Fremington Edge!

The origins, age or purpose of such Stone Men, a tall monolith in a prominent position on an escarpment or scar, is debatable but they definitely hold a certain affection for local people and walkers, who find them useful and reassuring location references. This one's main appeal could be that it marks the best view point up and down dale. I'm sure there are many of you out there who know this one and something about it. Apparently you can run there and back from Reeth in about 40 minutes if you're looking for α challenge!



I decided that this request was something we could help with so set about putting a plan into action. Once I'd got the all clear from the landowner, a crew of our finest stone wallers were assembled and despatched on a rather blustery day to set to work. In just a couple of hours they had stripped out the broken remains and started rebuilding with the copious amounts of stone available. They created a whole new Stone Man which can once again be seen clearly from the Arkengarthdale Road.

So when you're **p**assing, whether far below on the road or up close on "The Edge", spare a thought for our hardy and dedicated Dales Volunteers. No job too small, all tasks considered!

#### It's 'Flu Jab Time Again!

It is hard to believe it's that time of year again

when the bugs and bacteria start to make us all suffer. For those who are eligible, the combined influenza vaccine will be available and we are holding our 'Flu Clinic on Thursday 8th October 2015 between 1400hrs and 1630hrs.

Those who are in the eligible or 'at risk' groups can just turn up for their vaccine as before. Just to clarify, eligibility is defined by those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, and those who suffer from the following conditions:

- Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)
- Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure)
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Chronic Liver Disease
- Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease)
- Diabetes
- Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some, it can even be life-threatening. I can't recommend the 'flu vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible. I will be joining you with my annual jab.


If for any reason, you are unable to attend on the 8th October, please do let us know as soon as possible.

Thank you to all those who attended our seminar in June - about a guarter of the over 75s were present and almost half of over 75s have participated osteoporosis our in assessment. Over the coming months, we will be examining hospital and ambulance service data to see if the interventions have made a difference on the numbers of falls and injuries as a result of falling. #### **Dog Fouling: A Reminder**

A reminder to those people who are still leaving dog faeces in and around Reeth:

The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 applies to any land which is open to the air and to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access, with or without payment. This includes highways with a speed limit of 40 mph or less; pavements; verges; open spaces such as village greens, parks and play areas; and public rights of way such as footpaths and bridleways.

The Act states that owners must clear up after their dogs. This can be done by using a 'poop scoop' or plastic bag - anything that will safely remove the faeces from the land before being disposed of in a sealed bag. Dog waste bins are provided throughout the area to encourage dog owners to clean up after their pets; dog waste can also be placed in your domestic bin - but not in the green bin!

If a dog defecates at any time on relevant land and the person in charge of the dog at that time fails to remove the faeces from the land, that person is guilty of an offence. If the offence is witnessed then they may be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of £50. If that fine is left unpaid or contested, the Richmondshire District Council will take action through the courts which carries fines of up to £1,000, a criminal record, and possible court costs.

Reeth Library at Hudson House has just celebrated its 3rd Birthday. When I say celebrated, unfortunately it didn't quite run to champagne and smoked salmon, more a coffee and cake affair but it seemed worth celebrating the fact that Reeth has its own library, run entirely by volunteers and we have been open 3 years.

For anyone who still doesn't know about the Library or who hasn't found it yet, you might like to know that it is part of the NYCC Library Service and all the books are supplied by the County Library. It is based at Hudson House and is open 7 days per week including Bank Holidays (apart from Christmas) and the opening hours are 10.00 a.m. -3.30 p.m. but vary slightly in the winter. A volunteer goes in every day for a short time but the system is mainly self -service.

We have approximately 2,000 books ranging from adult fiction and nonfiction through large print books, children's books and picture books and a quarter of the stock is changed every three months. There is also a small stock of audio books which are changed every month. In addition to this it is possible to order a specific book.

But as with every other local business or facility, the Library is only viable as long as enough people use it. We have to supply statistics regularly showing how many books have been borrowed and in what category.

As ever, it is a case of use it or lose it; so please come and see what a great asset it is and what a loss it would be if it were to close.





Astronomy in the Two Dales

This month we have reached the end of


summer and the beginning of the astronomy season as the nights grow ever longer.

Our first target for observation is the giant planet Neptune, which is at its closest approach to earth on the 1st. However, this mighty sphere of and ice frozen gas is still 4,459,504,400km away and appears as a tiny blue dot in all but the largest telescopes. If you do have access to N.A.S.A style equipment, then Neptune rises in the east at 9.30pm and sets in the west just before dawn, and could

you let me know as I would like a look too.

This month the new moon is due on the 13th. There is also a partial solar eclipse on this day, however it is not visible from our part of the world, but. we have other wonders to enjoy. On the 23rd of September at 8.21am we reach the vernal equinox, the official beginning of autumn. This is followed on the 28th by the full moon and it is once again a supermoon, being at its closest approach to earth this year. Combined with this we have a total eclipse of the moon on the same day, so the night of the 27th and the morning of the 28th will be great for astronomy as the darkened face of the moon will bring the stars out.

Moonrise occurs at 7.30 pm on the 27th, with the total eclipse expected



at 2.47am on the 28th, the eclipse being caused by the earth coming in between the sun and moon and blocking the sun's light. As this is early on a Monday morning I see no problem for many of you being late to work that day after an all night observation of the event, as all your employers are so understanding of such matters!

The moon is in the constellation of Pisces, the fishes, and is actually conjunct with Uranus, another icy world far away in the outer fringes of our solar system at a distance of 3,006,224,700km. Pisces is associated with Aphrodite and Eros, who escaped from the monster Typhon, by leaping sea and transforming into the themselves into fish. In order not to lose each other, they tied themselves together with rope. The Romans adopted the Greek legend, with Venus and Cupid acting as the counterparts for Aphrodite and Eros.

#### **Are We All Foreigners?**

In Britain today we find a growing concern about the absorption of refugees and asylum seekers arriving on our shores. I think we often forget that most of us, English, Scottish, Irish and Welsh, spring from incomers who settled here over the centuries. Norsemen, Hugenots, Jews, Asians, Germans or West Indians, to name just a few. Our DNAs would reveal some interesting facts.

We still feel incensed at the thought of strangers arriving on our shores and benefiting from our living standards. 'Not in my patch', is our knee jerk reaction. But, the problem is not new. I have been looking at some of the North Riding Quarter Session records. What do I find but reports from 1610 referring to the branding of men guilty of being 'vagabonds', who were trying to find work locally. The women were supposed to be whipped. These were people we would call refugees, economic roaming the country looking for work. They were most likely leaving their impoverished villages in the hope of a better life for their families

In Richmond in the 16th century it was forbidden to let property or have a

lodger without special permission and assurance that the tenant had sufficient income to live without help from the town. There was a fine of 20s if someone gave lodging to a vagabond or a 'dishonest woman to be delivered of a child within the town'. They were even after single mothers in those days! Strangers in 1608 had to provide a bond stating that they would not become the charge of the town. They were forbidden from cutting wood for fuel in Whitcliff woods unless 'legal settlement' had been granted. This was only given after someone had lived and worked in the district for several years. It sounds a bit familiar.

Until the Poor Law reforms of 1834 it was the local parish Select Vestry who dispensed help for the poor. This could result in some quite arbitrary



decisions as to who were the 'deserving | poor' or the 'undeserving poor'. Vagabonds strangers were and frequently carted off back to their places of origin, in spite of dire poverty. With a small population throughout nation the it seems surprising this was such an issue, however the sparse population meant there were fewer people to raise the tax to cover help for the poor which had been expected since Elizabethan times.

After the reform of the Poor Law in 1834, local parishes elected Union Guardians who were answerable to the Poor Law Commissioners in London. Reeth Guardians were a bit of a headache for the Commissioners Once they argued that keeping people in the workhouse, considered to some extent as a punishment for the feckless poor, was more costly than giving out help when needed in hard times experienced by the local inhabitants. In 1837 Reeth Guardians requested that a man who had work, but insufficient money to feed his family, should be allowed to remain in employment and have his family moved to the Workhouse. "No," said the Commissioners: this might

encourage others to have big families who would then be looked after in the workhouse, giving them an advantage over those who supported their families by hard work and industry.

The Commissioners did however listen to Reeth Union when they asked to give temporary relief to vagrants who were 'dying of hunger on the streets'. This was allowed so long as they did not expect to be reimbursed for this charitable act to strangers.

Attitudes don't seem to change very much, do they? I do wonder how my own ancestors came to Britain.




