



# St Andrew's Grinton Bells Update

Originally the plan was to retune one of the Richmond bells and remake another. Unfortunately St Mary's Church in Richmond has still got some way to go in its appeal. With the agreement of St Mary's, we have now decided to add two completely new

bells to the tower at Grinton. The bells have now been ordered from Taylor's Bell Foundry in Loughborough and will take three to four months to make.

We are likely to be able to hang the new bells next Spring, along with the essential maintenance and safety installation which is required.

#### **Save Those Stamps**

This is a plea to all of you to save your stamps to raise money for charity.

I collect the stamps and sell them to my agent who pays us appropriate rate at the time. He in turn will sell them on to stamp collectors and dealers throughout the UK overseas. The stamp buying business covers many sectors, but the main ones are obviously to fill gaps in someone's collection and to look out for stamps that are imperfect such as faulty perforations (too many or too few). colouration of stamp, printing error, watermarks and so on.

Due to franking and email the amount of stamps that are coming in is at an all time low so everyone who sends even a couple of stamps is raising money for us. Also the Post Office now frequently use the gold horizon labels - but we do also collect those.

Items such as collections and special editions are sold at auction, usually with a reserve on the item. We have just had a great result: at an auction, selling five items for £3,335. One stamp album went for £2,400. That was a once in a life time sale.

Over the financial year of 2014-2015 we raised an amazing £21,458 - mainly for the RNIB but also for Alzheimers. Our target for this

financial year is £25,000 so we need more supporters to achieve this figure. To reach our target we need to collect approximately 15,000,000 stamps. There are around 6000 stamps to a kilo.

If stamps have the perforations cut off they are totally worthless. If it easier just tear with plenty paper round and I will sort them.



# Reeth Community Orchard Apple Day

The weather is invariably terrible for Apple Day. It is a given. More reliable than a rain dance. And it certainly did rain. But mercifully, this year, it wasn't also perishingly cold.

We'd had a bumper harvest - picked mostly by ladies "of a certain age" (plus one mere 50 year old) and some very enthusiastic and acrobatic children, who managed to come away from their efforts with all limbs intact. Very grateful thanks are extended to all.

So there was a wide variety of apples for sale. And our usual informative display of many more. But we missed our "apple expert" John - kept away by ill health - and his wife Judy, who always brought wonderful cakes for the workers. Instead Jane Davies very kindly stepped in with apple muffins. (You can see where my priorities lie.)

After a slow start the crowds braved the elements. A big draw is always Gordon's apple press, or juicer, with new muscle turning the wheel this year in the shape of the sainted Pete and Derek. Children love to watch the process and are encouraged to have a go. For every 10kg of apples we produce approx 5 litres of juice - a mix of cooking and eating apples, previously chopped and frozen to soften them - to produce a slightly tart and pure juice, with no added sugar needed.

We were pleased to welcome a small group from Cumbria with apples to press. Something we have tried to encourage. They are planning to set up a community orchard of their own.

# Astronomy in the Two Dales

Well, here it is, December and in the style of advent, what astronomical presents do we have?

On the morning of the 7th of December we are gifted with a conjunction of the Moon and Venus, which will be visible in the East before sunrise.

We take delivery of a new Moon on the 11th and this is fantastic news as the night sky will be unpolluted by moonlight because two days later old Santa drops the Geminid meteor shower down our chimney. This is the be all and end all of meteor showers, between 2.00am and 3.00am on the 14th when 100-120 multi-coloured meteors per hour may be seen. The shower itself runs from the 7th to the 17th so the numbers seen will gradually increase until the peak on the 13th-14th.

The constellation of Gemini will be visible to the south above and to the left of Orion. Wrap up warmly, take a

flask of seasonal liquid and watch the remains of asteroid 3200 Phaethon smash into our upper atmosphere.

After a week to recover we have the arrival of winter with the December Solstice and our shortest period of daylight. For those of us who celebrate such things, the solstice is at 4.48 am on the 22nd, so get those bonfires lit.

But wait, another boon: the Ursid meteor shower peaks on the morning of the 22nd as well. The dust of comet Tuttle will streak across the early morning sky. This is in no way comparable to the Geminids, as there will be only 10 or so meteors an hour, radiating from the constellation of Ursa Minor in a northerly direction, but it is just another excuse to be out in the dark with five layers of clothing and a jug of mead to boot.



Finally we get a full moon and of course it is on Christmas Day, our final present of 2015. This will occur at 11.11pm on the 25th, and will illuminate the hopefully clear night skies for those with wobbly legs as they wend their way home.

# Windows 10 roll out woes

Over the last few weeks problems have continued. I have had many requests for help from people who have taken the plunge and upgraded to Windows 10. I am sure I am hearing on the few bad cases where something has gone wrong but in the last week I have looked at three computers that failed to upgrade properly and basically turned into an oversized paperweight. It would be really helpful if you could help your friends by spreading the word that it is probably best to wait to upgrade until spring time.

In the meantime here are a few hints if you decide to upgrade anyway:

- 1) Make sure you have a good solid backup of your system before you start so that if the worse happens you are not left in a mess.
- 2) If you upgrade and have problems you have a 30 day window to revert to your old version of Windows Click Start > PC Settings > Update and

Recovery and the option to revert should be there - note after 30 days that option disappears.

3) If you have upgraded from Windows 7 or miss the start menu you can install Classic Shell to put it back. Things then behave remarkably like and Windows 7 again. It is free from www.classicshell.net: or there is a rather more polished Start replacement called Start 10, available cheaply from www.stardock.com/ products/start10. Incidentally, you can also get a version for Windows 8/8.1 called Star8 here www.stardock.com/ products/start8

# Download Websites and scams/trickery

I have noticed that when people are looking for a program to download (either a new program or and upgrade to one you already have installed) there is a tendency to type what you are looking for into a search engine. Quite a lot of people then click the first thing that appears in the list.

This is an approach almost guaranteed to get your computer infected with rubbish. You will probably get what you were looking for, but it

So many people have said to me over the years: "I don't know where that came from. I never downloaded it or asked for it."

By far the worst culprits are the 'download' websites. In order to make money, most products end up bundled with other things that pay the company to put the stuff on your computer. These 'bonus' gifts can be anything from unwanted toolbars, changing your home page or search engine, fake security software - or even real security software that then conflicts with existing products you have.

The big problem is that most of this stuff isn't considered virus behaviour and the majority of goes through your antivirus without giving any warning. The rule is to look-and-read before you click. If you have a list of results in front of you ONLY EVER click on links where the printed website name belongs to the manufacturer of the product. For example if you are updating Adobe Flash make sure the you are going says adobe.com and not something like softonic.com or download.com. This isn't a 100% solution as even then

will also more than likely come with a Adobe may download Google Toolbar as part of the download. Make sure you read everything and untick the things you know you don't need.

Their studies culminated in a whole-school visit to Ripley Castle where everyone had the opportunity to dress up in medieval costume. It not only added to the authenticity of the day but made the children appreciate how cumbersome some of the clothing was to wear in days gone by.

The KS2 children have been studying castles, which tied in perfectly with the visit to Ripley. They have also focused on rivers for their key curriculum subject and have learned about the effects they have on our landscape.

We are delighted to welcome Rev. Alison Steward-Smith, our curate, who is coming in to school on a regular basis to teach music to both classes. We were really appreciative of her help with our harvest songs, which we performed in Arkengarthdale Church in October and are thrilled that she will be working with us on our Christmas concert - more of that later. Alison, who is also a languages teacher, is teaching French to the KS2 class on a weekly basis.

Our Forest School activities continue to be a great asset to the school and we would like to extend a huge thank you to Alan and Peter Richardson, who so kindly and freely

gave of their time to make a gateway into the Birks Wood next to the school. This makes it quick, safe and easy for staff and children to access the wood. We have recently received a grant, from the Ernest Cook Trust, which has helped us purchase a tepee and various tools for the outdoors which will greatly enhance the children's learning experience.

On Friday 4th December we are hosting The Magic Woods event in our tepee. Do come along and join us to find out if there are some magical creatures living the woods, as we look for fairies, spirits and other mythical creatures that might just be hiding in the tree. admin@arkengarthdale.n-Contact yorks.sch.uk or 01748 884335 for booking information. The event will be led by teachers (Forest School leaders) and is suitable for 0-4 year olds with a supervising adult. Toilet and handwashing facilities are available in the school. Please wear wellies and warm outdoor clothing. Tea, coffee, juice and biscuits are provided. The event will take place in our third classroom: woodland adjacent to the school. There is no charge.

While on the subject of the great outdoors, our five year 6 children recently returned from East Barnby, following a 5-day residential course. They joined the year 6 pupils from Richmond Methodist School and were lucky to enjoy a week of wall-to-wall sunshine. They took part in some fabulous activities, from beck scrambling to canoeing.

Sport continues to play a very important role in school and the KS2 children have taken part in football and netball tournaments this term. The KS1

pupils have enjoyed α series successful gymnastic sessions at Colburn Leisure Centre and we extended this to include KS2 children towards the end of the term.

So, I started by saying Christmas is coming and with that comes some sad news for me. At the end of this term I will be saying a very fond farewell to my colleagues, governors and the children at Arkengarthdale School. It has been an enormous pleasure to lead the school over the last 3 years, it is the most wonderful place for children to be educated and I will miss it greatly. However, I leave the school in the very capable hands of Helen Ring, who will take over the headship in January.

Before I sign off, please do put some other dates in your diary. You are warmly invited to our Christmas concert, which takes place at 6pm on Friday 11th December Arkengarthdale Church, we would love to see you there. The children will also be singing at the Christmas Carol Service at 6pm on Sunday 20th December, so we look forward to welcoming you.
