Charity Ride

On the 25th September 2016 the motorcycling group I co-run is holding a charity ride in aid of Yorkshire Air Ambulance. Regrettably the weather changed for the Bank Holiday weekend which turned out to be a damp squib. So far it has been a poor season which started late. Hopefully the season will extend into the late Autumn

Some of our young folk find it amusing to write obscenities about themselves in the bus shelter, on walls and even seats. They would be more resourceful if they cleaned up these areas, for many find their scribblings repulsive.

All members of Muker Parish Council agreed that they were against restrictions on coaches which were essential to local businesses and other visitors to Swaledale. Coun. Porter also said he agreed with a recent letter in the press from Mr Beckwith about vegetation encroaching the highway. It is time the Highway authority paid

more attention to the roads in the Dale. The PC have been pressing for road improvements in the Upper Dale for a number of years.

Insp John Fowler, the local Area Commander, detailed the current Local Area Policing Scheme introduced in 1995 . . . He confirmed that the Swaledale beat would not close or be withdrawn and that the officer would remain resident in the area.

In our March issue we detailed a competition organised by Royal Mail and sponsored by the Practical Photography magazine, titled 'The Great British Post Office.' Michael Tarn Billingham won the first prize photography equipment worth up to £10,000 with an unusual photograph of Reeth Post Office. The photograph is a spectacular shot of Reeth Post Office taken early on a February evening. It features the lights of the Post Office and the recently erected traditional decorative light which is part of the Yorkshire Dales National Park and Richmondshire District Council improved amenity lighting scheme for Reeth, with a new moon rising over a snow covered Fremington Edge.

Richmondshire Concerts

The Richmondshire Concerts season opens on 24th September with a performance by one of the great classical string quartets.

The Allegri Quartet is the longestestablished chamber ensemble in Britain Its membership and its repertoire have been regularly renewed over six decades, and the quartet is famed for its fresh and sparkling interpretations. As well as performing a recent quartet commissioned from Alec Roth, the group will be joined by violist Graham Oppenheimer for two fine quintets by Mozart and Brahms.

October brings a varied programme from the 10-piece North East Brass Ensemble. In December the Cleveland Chamber Orchestra packs the stage for two popular string pieces by Dvorak and Holst, followed by Vivaldi's incomparable Four Seasons with Opera North's David Greed as violin soloist.

The Frith Piano Quartet appears in January, joined by double bass for a programme including Schubert's famous Trout Quintet. Then the Piatti Quartet returns to Richmond for an evening which ends with Beethoven's late Opus 130 Quartet with the mighty Grosse Fuge option.

Finally, the much loved Carducci Quartet closes the season with a huge programme of Haydn, Glass, Shostakovich, Webern and more Beethoven.

Concerts are at 7:30 on Saturdays, in the Influence Church, a comfortable ex-cinema in Richmond. Tickets are £14 from www.rsconcerts.org or Richmond's Castle Hill Bookshop, or at the door, subject to availability, and there's an attractive £42 six-concert seasonticket option.

The society has seen record attendances in recent years - hardly surprising, with a programme like this - so early booking is advised.



Flu Clinics

For those who are unable to attend the

clinic on the 15th September between 2pm-4pm, we are running catch up sessions, so please contact the practice for further details. Just to clarify, eligibility is defined by those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, or those who suffer from the following conditions:

- Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)
- Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure, angina)
- Chronic Kidney Disease
- Chronic Liver Disease
- Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease, strokes)
- Diabetes
- Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs)

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some people in the groups above it can even be life-threatening. I can't recommend the 'flu vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible. I will be joining you with my annual jab.

Pregnant women and some young children are also eligible for a 'flu vaccination, but the practice will contact you directly to arrange vaccination.

Primary Care Cancer Nurse

I am very pleased to report that we are the recipients of a new nurse at the practice. Sarah Truman is a specialist cancer nurse who has taken up a new which has been funded Macmillan Cancer Care for the next 18 months. She will be based in the Dales at Reeth and Aysgarth and her job is to act as the link between hospital and the community for patients with cancer. I met her last week and we think she has an important part to play when people are diagnosed with cancer. This is a very difficult time, when people are given bad news and treatment seems a long way off, as often specialist teams have to meet and formulate whether this treatment plan. chemotherapy, radiotherapy, surgery or a combination of these. There may be extra tests required to help guide the specialists.

From my experience, there are always lots of questions and uncertainty until all the information is available and the specialists have made their decisions, and I think Sarah will have a critical role here supporting people and those closest to them over these difficult days, using her links with the hospital teams and the practice. I will be introducing her to our patients over the next few weeks, and indeed as patients receive their diagnoses.



Astronomy in the Two Dales

September, the ninth month of the year, named after the seventh month of the old Latin calendar, which became obsolete in 153AD, when Christmas was in November and New Year was in March. Confused? You will be.

The new moon is upon us on the 1st, the best time to view the Milky Way and any faint deep sky objects such as galaxies or nebulas; there is also a solar eclipse on this day BUT only visible from Africa.

The full moon arrives on the 16th, known as the Harvest Moon, so gather your marrows and head for the nearest church. All this is followed by the equinox on the 22nd as we head into autumn and the return of longer nights. [There is always one cheerful soul who delights is reminding us of that.]

The planets are all performing in the southern sky, with Venus and Jupiter setting in the west by 9.00pm

and Mars and Saturn setting in the south west by 11.30 pm. Neptune, that distant blue ball, is at its closest approach to earth, however a large telescope will be required to see it, as it is 4.50×109 km away from the Sun. Mercury is also visible to very careful observers on the 28th, as it is at its farthest position away from the Sun, and visible in the east just before sunrise. DO NOT LOOK THROUGH TELESCOPES OR BINOCCULARS AT THE SUN.

The perils of space flight have finally been revealed: studies into astronaut health showed that travelling beyond the earth's atmosphere greatly increases the risk of cardiovascular problems with almost half of the Apollo astronauts havina died cardiovascular disorders. Considering the health of these people before they left earth and the medical care they have received since returning from deep space missions, the rate of death is 4-5 times higher than someone who stayed on earth. This is because of the effect of exposure to deep space

why the Russian space agency refused to send men to the moon. These new findings present much difficulty for the future missions that hoped to send manned craft to Mars. Will the crew arrive safely or will they end up being cooked like a tin of ham on their six month journey?

Whatever happens to the future of space flight and in particular, manned missions, the days of just building a rocket without thought for crew

radiation and is one of the main reasons safety and survival are well and truly over, as if this medical evidence is ignored, the subsequent death of anybody on a space flight would be the equivalent of murder.

So if any of you have signed up for and with nothing to protect the people the SpaceX mission to Mars and you suddenly find yourself getting request to provide yourself with lead lined under garments, perhaps it is time to think again.

Reeth Brass Band – History up to 1905

In the mid 19th century there were 1,000 lead miners living in Reeth. Music was an important part of life, as much then as it is now, and there were strong connections with other miners' bands. It is thought that there would be a brass band in Reeth right back to that time.

It is known that the band existed prior to 1905. Detailed documentary evidence has recently come to light covering the period from that year. It is clear that new instruments and equipment were purchased, to replace those existing at the time. Old rules were also applied following meetings held in Reeth from 20th June to 31st December 1905.

Two of the bands old minute books have recently come in to my possession, following the death of our past President David (Tubby) Allinson. They show in some detail the events that took place with the band from 20th June 1905. I am however struggling to

find history prior to that date.

Do I Need To Complete A Tax Return?

'Tax doesn't have to be taxing,' is the famous motto the taxman used in its advertising campaigns.

HMRC will not necessarily prompt you to complete a tax return. If your circumstances fit any of the criteria set by HMRC then you are legally required to submit a tax return, and you must notify HMRC by 5th October following the tax year end.

The tax year is from 6 April to 5 April. You'll need to send a tax return if, in the last tax year:

- you were self-employed
- you received £2,500 or more in untaxed income, eg from renting out a property or savings and investments - contact HMRC if it was less than £2,500
- your savings or investment income was £10,000 or more before tax
- you were a company director

- unless it was for a non-profit organisation (eg a charity) and you didn't get any pay or benefits, like a company car
- your income (or your partner's) was over £50,000 and one of you claimed Child Benefit
- you had income from abroad that may be taxable
- you lived abroad and had a UK income
- you received dividends from shares and you're a higher or additional rate taxpayer - but if you don't need to send a return for any other reason contact HMRC
- your income was over £100,000
- you were a trustee of a trust or registered pension scheme
- you had a P800 from HMRC saying you didn't pay enough tax last year and you didn't pay what you owe through your tax code or with a voluntary payment
- you made profits from selling things like shares, a second home or other chargeable assets and need to pay

Capital Gains Tax (CGT). If your capital gains, after claiming allowable costs, are within the CGT annual allowance (£11,100 in 2015/16), then you don't need to complete a tax return just for this. However, if your gains are below the tax-free allowance, you need to tell HMRC if:

- you disposed of chargeable assets with an overall worth of more than 4 times the Capital Gains Tax allowance - this works out as £44,400 for the 2015 to 2016 tax year
- you have capital losses that you want to claim.

If you get an email or letter from HMRC telling you to send a return, you must send it by 31st October if submitting a paper copy or 31st

Capital Gains Tax (CGT). If your January if submitting online - even if capital gains, after claiming you don't have any tax to pay. The late allowable costs, are within the CGT filing penalty is £100.

Claiming tax relief

Complete a tax return to claim money back from HMRC for:

- donations to charity
- private pension contributions as a higher or additional rate taxpayer, or if your scheme isn't set up for automatic tax relief
- work expenses over £2,500 if they're less and you don't need to send a return for any other reason, contact HMRC instead

Playground equipment: Signs of wear and tear to the equipment and safety matting had been reported and repairs were in hand. A RoSPA inspection was scheduled for September.

Remembrance Sunday: Road closure applications had been made for Remembrance Sunday and November 11. Coast to Coast Walk: The council would support a petition in favour of upgrading of the Coast to Coast walk to a National Trail.

Dog fouling: Notices had now been erected around the grass outside the ice cream parlour marking it as a 'clean' area. Coun Frankland reported that one notice had already been removed and he had been informed of one dog owner deliberately ignoring the request on the grounds that it didn't apply to local residents.

It was agreed that the new dog waste bin on the Arkengarthdale road should be sited on the village side of the cattle grid, subject to approval.

Street lights: A number of street lights were still out of order in spite of being reported.

Parking: The clerk had studied the plan showing the extent of highways and village green around Reeth and reported that the situation in places was unclear. Work was ongoing to fix posts and chains around certain areas of the green which suffered most damage from parking. The possibility of using a field near the village centre for parking was being followed up with the owners. The grasscreted parking area in Healaugh would be inspected by the

district council on July 26.

Charitable donations: Members discussed the council's policy on requests for donations and agreed to continue treating all applications on an ad hoc basis based on the benefits to the local community.

Village Pound: The current tenants of the pound were keen to continue renting it and to sort out the problems with the soil if at all possible. The council would get professional advice from a surveyor before deciding the way forward.

Pavements and roads: Coun Frankland reported a number of broken paving slabs near the bottom shop and holes in the road by the fire station and the entrance to Place Hill. Repairs were also needed on Back Lane.

Water leak: The recurrent leak in the road outside Ivy Cottage had been inspected but not repaired.

Rubbish collection: Coun Beal would be asked to report the state of the recycling area to the district council as well as the bins in the playground and on the green which were not being emptied often enough.

Defibrillator: The clerk and Coun Longstaff would consider possible sites for a defibrillator in Healaugh.

Village green: The apparently abandoned car which had been left on the green for some time had now been removed. A Flymo which was now surplus to requirements for cutting the green would be advertised for sale.

Police matters: As the local PCSO was unavailable to attend on Monday evenings Coun Beal would meet with her in advance and report back to the council meetings.

Crime in the 2 Dales

Firstly I would like to inform those in the area of Reeth that the yellow free telephone situated to the right hand side at the front of Hudson House is now working as a new telephone has been installed. This telephone can be used to contact North Yorkshire Police directly 24/7 via the staff at the Control Room. They will be more than happy to take any information about any incidents, suspicious persons or vehicles.

Regular drop-in surgeries are still held in Reeth at Hudson House if you would like to pop in. If I am not available and the information or issues need to be acted upon straightaway then pass the information to the Control Room staff by using the telephone.

Last month we received several reports of attempted fraud where unknown persons were trying to gain large sums of money from people's personal accounts. Terminate any phone calls immediately and do not open up unfamiliar emails but delete straightaway. Do not give out any personal details via your telephone, mobile or emails.

A possible suspect person and vehicle were seen in the area of Keld taking interest in the buildings and spending some time in the area. We received several reports of groups of males with Lurcher dogs in and around Grinton and Marske. The males and vehicles encountered by Police officers were checked and suitably dealt with. A suspect vehicle was also seen in Low Row.

When travelling around the roads in the Dales it is noticeable that we have an increase in motor vehicles, tractors. cyclists and walkers. Some walkers cannot always be seen clearly or are forced into going onto the wrong side of the road instead of facing the oncoming traffic due to the lack of pavements or walkways. There has been an increasing number of vehicles parked on pavements. Do not park on footpaths or pavements this only encourages drivers to try and squeeze by and consequently damage the vehicle. Pedestrians are also put at risk by being forced to walk on the road when a vehicle is parked across the pavement. It is safer to park on the road as other vehicles are more likely to stop and pull in until there is sufficient room to get by.

We are looking for volunteers for Reeth Youth Club which has always been well attended in the past but due to lack of volunteers had to close. 

Rock formation from the Ordovician to the Carboniferous: Basement strata, limestone, sandstone, grit stone and coal measures; tectonic and erosional processes relevant to quarries; geology visible in vernacular buildings and field walls; prehistoric exploitation of stone resources

Week 2 Limestone, on Tuesday 27 September. The history and archaeology of limestone quarrying and lime burning in the Yorkshire Dales, not forgetting the quarrymen and lime burners.

Week 3 Sandstone, on Tuesday 18 October. The history and archaeology of sandstone quarrying across the West Riding Pennines, not forgetting the delvers, flag fettlers and others.

Dr Johnson originally trained as a historian and historical geographer and now has research interests in historical economic activities rural in northern uplands, early settlement in the Dales, and quarrying. He has surveyed lime kiln sites in the field across and beyond the Dales National Park and the whole Westmorland. He has recently published Quarrying in the Yorkshire Pennines: an Illustrated History.

Computer Corner

With Carol Haynes of Dales Computer Services

Windows: Where Has Safe Mode Gone?

Safe Mode is a way of starting your computer when it has problems starting normally and allows you to solve problems. It can be useful at other times too

Up until Windows 7 you could always start your computer in Safe Mode by rapidly tapping the F8 key when switching on or restarting your computer and you would then be presented with the "Advanced Startup Screen" for where you could choose the various Safe Mode Options.

From Windows 8 onwards the F8 button no longer works consistently and in Windows 10 no longer seems to work at all - even on older computers. This does not mean safe mode has been removed you just need to know how to get there.

The first thing to say is that unless you prepare in advance, you can't get there any longer when your computer won't at least get to login screen in Windows

If you can get that far you just

need to restart your computer from the power menu while holding down the shift key and when the computer starts again you are faced with options including a Troubleshooting Option. Inside the Troubleshooting Options you can find the usual set of Safe Modes familiar from earlier Windows.

Where it gets a little difficult is if your system won't start up properly at all. In this case you need to have made a "Recovery Drive" when windows was working properly. To do this click on Start and just type "Recovery Drive" and you should see the option to do this appear. Click on it and follow the instructions. You will need a USB memory stick which you dedicate exclusively to this task.

Once you have a recovery drive you will be able to start your system again from the memory stick and use repair tools or backup your files, pictures and documents.


