Well, the results of the 2016 National Parish Magazine Awards were announced in December - too late to be included in the January edition. The award scheme is for 'editors and their fellow volunteers all over the country who devote an enormous amount of time and effort free of charge to producing parish magazines that service their communities every month of the year.' According to the

judges, 'the standard this year has been the highest ever and it has been hard work for them to decide the order.' (To be honest though, they said something similar last year.)

Anyway, the number this year is 6. Out of over 600 entries the Gazette achieved **6th place** in the A5 Category. Pretty chuffed with that.

The top six looks like this:

1st Wargrave with Knowl Hill Parish Magazine (Berkshire)

2nd Great Kingshill Newsletter (Buckinghamshire)

3rd The Dove (Somerset)

4th Roundabout Lightwater (Surrey)

5th Loddon Reach (Berkshire)

6th Reeth and District Gazette (North Yorkshire)

Sixth overall but when you analyse the results in detail, you may notice that the top five publications are all southern based. So, by my reckoning, that makes the Gazette the top magazine of its ilk in the north of the country.

This month's lecture is The Life of a 'Proper Theatre': the archive collections of the Georgian Theatre Royal, Richmond. It will take place at Middleham Key Centre, at 2.00pm, on Tuesday 21 February 2017

We are really fortunate to have the oldest working theatre in its original form in the U.K. on our doorsteps. Built in 1788, Richmond's Georgian Theatre Royal is also a living museum which offers tours of the playhouse and its attached exhibition.

The theatre's fascinating archive of over 4,000 items includes:

- playbills and ephemera from its Georgian heyday;
- documents relating its rediscovery and restoration;
- programmes, posters, photographs and autographs recording the life of a provincial theatre since 1963.

Susie Wood, the Heritage Learning Officer at the theatre, will discuss the history of the archive, its links to other archives and the use and care of the collection



Reeth Gazette Community Chest

This month's recipient is the group of students from Richmond School going to Peru. Matthew Short explains all:

On 16th July 2017, seven students from the Dales area have been given the chance to travel to Peru for a month with Richmond School and Camps International.

To get this place we all had to construct a letter of application on why we should be given a place. This was due to over 100 students from year 10-12 being interested in this once in a lifetime opportunity. This list later got narrowed down to the 35 students who are going. However we have to fundraise £4,170 just for the trip itself. It is going to be such a worthwhile experience and it will be a once in a life time opportunity.

While we are there, we will be volunteering and helping within the local communities in three high sierra regions of Peru: Colca, Moray and Titicaca. We will be taking part in project work, which will revolve around the improvement of school infrastructure, tourism development,

village or agricultural infrastructure like building greenhouses to help the crops grow, teaching of English and ICT and playing sports with local children.

These are really important projects not just for us, but the local community because it will help to improve their lives in a substantial way. Even though the projects vary from each trip, they will be still aiming to improve their lives in their own different ways.

Towards the end of the trip, we will be going on a five-mile trek up the Salkantay Trek, which leads to the top of Macchu Piccu where we will be put through our paces.

Upon our return on the 13th August we would like to share our experience with you all, with pictures and stories about projects in which we have undertaken.



Windows 10 Revisited

Just a quick reminder that the free Windows 10 upgrade from Microsoft was withdrawn last July. However, it has just come to my attention that you can still get a free upgrade if you have Windows 7 and Windows 8.

Whist there is much to dislike about Windows 10 we have to accept that it is here to stay and has seen a number of improvements and fixes that make it a stable choice if you take advantage.

I have no idea how long this will remain available but if you have a computer that is Windows 10 compatible it is probably a good idea to upgrade while you can.

To do this go to the Windows Upgrade page, download the upgrade tool and run it. Before upgrading it will check your computer is compatible and then you can either upgrade directly or download the upgrade programme and make a DVD or USB stick so that you can reinstall it in future.

Windows 7 or 8 you can automatically unlock Windows 8 Pro by entering a licence key. If you want full instructions there is an article to guide up here: http://tinyurl.com/zd-w10upgrade

Is Windows 10 driving you mad?

A couple of things you can do to make it more like Windows 7 are:

- 1) Download and install Classic Shell from www.classicshell.net which replaces the new start menu with the familiar Windows 7 start menu and hides all the tiled apps that many people just don't want to use.
- 2) If you don't want to have to login with an email address and password every time change to using a local account. You can do this through Start > Settings > Accounts > Sign in with a Local account. Once you have logged in again with a local account if you want to remove the password go back to the same place and select change password, enter the existing password for the last time and then leave the new password blank.
- 3) Change the power settings go to Control Panel (visible in Classic Shell or right click on Start) and type Power. Open the "Power Options" page and click on "Choose what the power buttons do". Click "Change settings that are currently unavailable" and then scroll down and make sure Fast Start up is NOT ticked and click OK. Fast Startup was introduced by Microsoft to make windows start faster - it does this by storing common settings when you shut down and reloading them when you switch on - this has caused quite a few problems recently with updates that had 'issues' - particularly wireless connections.

Communications 2017 style

It is unbelievable that the iPhone is having its 10th birthday. Who could believe smart phones have had such an impact on the way many live their lives.

Don't forget though that there are other ways to communicate with people. If you use Apple products you can use Facetime - but only with other Apple users. To keep in touch with friends there is the ubiquitous Skype - which is available on most devices (Windows, Mac, phones and tablets) and Skype to Skype calls can be video and are free - you can also send typed message and even share files quickly.

Another option is Facebook messaging and the Facebook messenger app. This allows typed conversations but also allows voice and video chatting and conferencing and is free. I don't find Facebook as smooth an experience as Skype but it is often more convenient if you are a Facebook user.

Finally if you like to make phone calls overseas a very good service I for used years www.telediscount.co.uk which supplies access numbers to different countries and is very low cost. There are no contracts - the access number appears on your bill. Just go to the website and find the country you wish to call and use the access number provided for landlines calls to or mobiles. IMPORTANT: the cheap rates ONLY apply if you make the calls from a landline - mobile operators will charge a lot more.

2016 was our busiest year ever for the team totalling 71 incidents: 51 calls from the Police or Ambulance Services; 5 out of area incidents; & we provided rescue cover for 9 events in our area. Our search dog & handler were called an additional 6 times.

Thanks to all the team for making this possible, on top of the rescues there is the mammoth task of running the team, maintaining all the equipment & fundraising. Thanks again for your continued support

We had a busy time over Christmas and the New Year with 6 incidents for the team.

08/01/2017: (02) 05.30hrs Team called to search for a person missing in the Tan Hill area. 3 search dogs, Kirkby Stephen & Teesdale MRT attended & located the missing person at 13.00 safe & well 4 miles into the moor. Thanks to the staff at Tan Hill for lending us the pub to run the search from.

03/01/2017: (01) 22.30hrs Our search dog & handler were called to assist Cleveland MRT with an ongoing search.

30/12/2016: (71) 20.30hrs Our search dog & handler where called to assist the Peak District teams with an ongoing search.

25/12/2016: (70) 13.30hrs While rescue 69 was happening we had a 2nd call to a collapsed walker on the fell above Cotterdale. The Air Ambulance had to turn back due to bad weather so the team & Ambulance did everything possible but unfortunately they didn't survive. The team evacuated the casualty back to the road.

25/12/2016: (69) 12.30hrs Just as most people were sitting down to Xmas dinner we were called by the Ambulance to rescue a walker with a fractured ankle near Walden, West Burton. Treated & evacuated by the team.

03/12/2016: (68) 08.30hrs Team requested to assist Teesdale MRT with a missing person search. Stood down en route.


Waterproofs update

Astronomy in the Two Dales

"It's coming straight for us," gasped the Starman, as he burst into the post office.

"What, exactly, is coming straight for us?" the Editor of the North's best local magazine calmly asked.

"Gliese 710, it will plough through the Oort cloud, scattering comets. We are doomed."

"Not again," he thought. "Last week it was space probe stealing aliens and now this. Well," he said, addressing the Starman, "I suppose you had better warn our readers."

Sensing disdain, the Starman left and drifted nebulously over the green.

The big news this month is a lunar eclipse, occurring when the moon is full, on the 11th of this month. The moon will pass through the earth's shadow, so it will not be totally dark. A full moon at this time of year is sometimes known as a snow moon or a hunger moon. The new moon does not appear until the 26th, and as the moon is rising at 10.00pm accompanied by the planet Jupiter, we have an opportunity to observe Mars and Venus setting in the west. Both planets will have set by the best time 9.00pm and observation is between 5.00pm and 7.30pm. earth's atmosphere as distorts the light from bright objects and makes them appear fuzzy.

Our solar system interacts with other star systems in our local area of space. These stars move toward and away from our solar system as they orbit around their own gravitational

centres, none of the stars in the diagram on the next page will approach closer than one light year, however, that may be close enough to disturb chunks of ice and rock that orbit our sun in the Oort cloud, creating comets that will head towards the sun.

Gliese 710 is a rogue star, not bound to any one point in space and at this moment it is heading straight for our solar system. At present we cannot calculate its speed, only how it increases in brightness, as it is coming at us head on. There is no way we can see a side view of its movement to assess it's speed. So, at present, our calculations indicate that Gliese 710 will pass through or near to our solar system in 1.35 million years . . . or maybe sooner. The Starman



Melbecks Parish Council December 2016

Drain at Gunnerside: This is still causing problems when it rains with water running down towards the village centre. Highways have inspected but nothing has been done yet. The Clerk will report this again.

Pothole at Low Row Institute: This pothole has been filled in by BT Open Reach, after they had been doing some work nearby.

Overgrowing bushes in Gunnerside: Cllr Calvert has spoken to the owners and they have trimmed the bushes and now the visibility has been improved.

Notice Boards: Grants have been received to replace the notice boards at Low Row and Gunnerside from Richmondshire District Council. Some quotes have been received to install notice boards, however it was agreed to look for further quotes as well.

Brocca Bank: drains have been cleared. Light at Toledo is still off, the Clerk will report this again.

Parish Precept: The Council agreed to request a precept of £1500.

Planning: the following applications have been received: 2 Lilac Cottages, Low Row - for demolition of existing rear extension and erection of single storey rear extension. Ralph Bank, Low Row, Reeth for subterranean ground floor extension to provide additional living accommodation. Tree Preservation order - Removal of one limb of an oak tree at Oak Tree Barn, Low Row. The following were approved conditionally: 3 Day Trial and Scott Trial.

BT consultation on payphones: The

Council noted that the payphone at Crackpot Lane has been included on the list of payphones which BT wish to remove, as it is claimed that it has not been used much in last few years. However, a letter was received from a resident who had tried on several occasions to use this phone when the phone service in Low Row was not working. In addition to this, there was no mobile phone service either. Each time the payphone was not working, so could not have been used anyway. As this payphone is not in Melbecks Parish but in Grinton Parish, and Grinton PC have written to say that they have no objection to the payphone being removed, the Clerk was requested to send a representation to Grinton PC to ask that this could be reconsidered.

Superfast fibre: Now that this has been installed connection speeds have improved greatly.

Great North Air Ambulance: A request for financial assistance was received from GNAA and a donation of £50 was agreed.

Mucking About In The Orchard Garden

We have a very good composting area behind the oak door in the Community Orchard. This is where I spend many a happy hour tending the compost. I think I am in danger of becoming a fanatical composter.

The compost pile steams on a cold day, the kitchen vegetables are usually fresh, the garden rubbish often has a scattering of fragrant herb cuttings and the newly mown grass smells beautiful. Yes it's true there are a few unpleasant pongs when someone has left garden material in water that has then gone stagnant, but, hey, it all wakens up the senses.

If you are tempted to get into composting, then here are some technical details. In the Orchard we use three wooden bays built on a concrete base. We begin the first pile with a layer of twiggy branches. This creates good air circulation and thereby, heat. We build up the compost heap once a week at the same time as cutting the lawns. Grass cuttings are a good activator and can be layered between the drier garden material that has been stacked up by the other busy gardeners during the week.

The idea is to layer up 'brown' dried material rich in carbon and the 'green' wet material which contains nitrogen. This mix also ensures that air circulates through the pile and the heat rises. The compost needs to be neither wet nor dry but somewhere in the middle. Cardboard, paper towels and egg boxes all help to reduce the wetness of a soggy compost heap.

We avoid composting nasty

spreading weeds although less vicious weeds can be composted. We turn the pile twice and it takes twelve months to mature, which is long enough and hot enough to kill off ordinary weeds.

The whole pile is tucked up under a piece of old carpet. It is then covered by a tarpaulin and weighted down with stones.

We keep adding to this pile during the summer and autumn and turn it into the next bay in the early spring.

Turning reintroduces the air and the compost heats up and breaks down even more. We leave this pile to cook away during the summer and begin another pile. We then turn the original pile into the third bay in the autumn. It will stay there over the winter and be ready to use in the spring.

The combination of plant material and uncooked kitchen waste seems to be a good mix. We do not need to use any commercial accelerators or add any water. We also have comfrey growing in the orchard. This is rich in potassium and is an excellent natural accelerator.

If you do not have space for wooden compost bays the same principle of turning and layering will work with conventional compost bins. The concrete base means that the compost doesn't just sink away into the ground.

If you are starting a concrete based heap you may have to introduce a few worms to get the whole process going. Composting is quite a task but a great way to recycle and the end result of beautiful crumbly dark compost is well worth the effort.





Muker Sign: The sign is now in place. Thwaite and Hoggarths Bridge: Cllr Blackie is continuing to pursue this matter.

Grass Cutting: Highways have inspected and concluded that it did not meet their criteria for action.

Buttertubs Rut: Highways have inspected and found that it did not meet their criteria for repair.

Baby Changing Facilities: Cllr Blows is continuing to pursue this matter with RDC.

Winter Gritting: Buttertubs Pass: There had been no complaints so far regarding the gritting. People are reminded that if they have any issues regarding the gritting of the Buttertubs Pass to contact Cllr Blackie, but again this is in no way a criticism of the gritter drivers.

Removal of Phone Boxes: Cllr Blackie informed the meeting that he had been in contact with BT regarding a number of phone boxes within Wensleydale and Swaledale. which were earmarked for removal and/or were currently not working. He asked the Parish Council to inform him of any boxes within the Parish which were not working. The Phone Box in Thwaite had been found not to be working and the door did not shut correctly. Ivelet was still to be checked. RDC are opposing the closure of many boxes including any that might be indicated in the Upper Dales. Cllr Blackie was himself opposing all closures of phone boxes and in particular where there was no mobile phone coverage. However Cllr Blackie

also noted that BT had apparently detected a phone signal at Ravenseat.

YDNPA: Planning Applications had been for Crow Trees. SSSI aranted Arkengarthdale and Nine Standards Rigg. A Planning Application had been received for roofing over sheep pens at Usha Gap: The Parish Council fully support this application which, helps farming and helps the environment.

Election of Richmondshire Parish Representative YDNP: Henry Allen Kirkbride had been elected.

YLCA: The Chairman read out an e-mail regarding Dependant Carers Allowance for Parish Councillors and completed a questionnaire. An e-mail regarding the increase in YLCA Membership had been received. The Parish Council agreed to continue their membership.

Correspondence/AOB: NHS Draft Sustainability Plan: Communication had been received regarding the NHS Plans. Blackie Cllr stated that Consultation will start in June.

NHS Step Up Step Down Beds: Communication had been received regarding the facilities at Sycamore Court Bainbridge. There were two beds which were available for either respite care, convalescence or as an alternative when it was felt that a patient may benefit from care away from home for a short period of time but necessarily requiring α admission. It was felt that this service was extremely beneficial to those that need it

Superfast Broadband: A letter had been received from Superfast North Yorkshire regarding the roll out of

charged for the services then the superfast broadband in Keld, which was scheduled to be upgraded by the end of Summer 2017. Cllr Whitehead asked whether the service would reach Angram and other areas around Keld, as Muker's broadband was able to reach Cllr Blackie Thwaite. said understood it depends the technology that is used, so will not know until nearer the time.

It was felt that the situation would only deteriorate. particularly at the height of the tourist Cllr Blackie is currently pursuing this matter with a view to having a cash machine installed and filled by HSBC free of charge as is the case in Masham. Cllrs believed that this would have a severe impact on both residents and tourists within the Upper Dales and that the inability for people to obtain cash in Hawes would clearly have an impact on other businesses within the surrounding area.

Highways: The Highways department were aware of concerns about further subsidence on the main road to Richmond which had been reported to them by the district and county councillors for the area. They were monitoring the situation but there was no indication of when any repairs would be carried out. Repairs to the road at Under Banks were scheduled to begin on January 9 with two days of 9am to 4pm road closures during the week commencing January 16.

An out of order street light by the cattle grid would be reported.

Speeding: Coun Barningham reported that a speed check had been carried out on the moor road but the equipment had been installed during a week of icy weather at a time when there were few visitors in the area; consequently no excessive speeds had been recorded.

Hospital services: Blackie Coun updated members the ongoing on campaign to retain 24 hour critical care at Darlington Memorial Hospital rather than centralising them in Stockton which could leave many residents in the upper dales with a round trip of over 100 miles to access accident and emergency, or consultantled maternity and paediatric services.

Payphones: Following objections from the district council no payphones in the area would be removed. As a result of Coun Blackie's correspondence with BT on the matter it had been discovered that a number of public phones listed for removal due to low use were actually out of order, some for several

years, in spite of repeated requests for repairs. These were now being dealt with and he asked for any others to be reported.

Footbridge: Preparations had commenced for the replacement footbridge to be installed in the next month

Bus shelter: The clerk had obtained an estimate for repair work to the roof of the bus shelter and councillors agreed to accept this.

Council elections: The parish hall had been booked for a county council election on Thursday, May 4.

Ward boundaries: Coun Blackie encouraged councillors to attend a forthcoming meeting at which proposals would be discussed on reducing the number of district councillors by changing the ward boundaries. He felt that some changes could be to the detriment of the more rural wards in the district.
