Astronomy In The Two Dales

May is when astronomers in these latitudes start to moan that the sun is riding high and we have to do gardening. But all is not lost, because if you stay up late enough, there are still things to see.

Jupiter should become visible as a very bright star towards the South from about 9.30pm. It's good just to be able to identify this wanderer (so called because the planets constantly change position in the sky), but if you have some binoculars, it is also worth a detailed look.

It can be tricky holding binoculars steady, especially after the evening wine ration. But if you can find a wall or something else to rest on, you can get a good view. (The late great Patrick Moore suggested using an upturned broom, but that can be a bit prickly). With binoculars you should be able to see some or all of Jupiter's 4 largest moons as bright points on either side of the planet. These change positions quite quickly, and appear in different places on different nights.

Jupiter is one of the first things to be seen after sunset because it is much brighter than any star. But thereby hangs a tale, because astronomers have a strange way of describing brightness. It all started with the ancient Greek astronomer Hipparchus who concluded that the brightness of stars was due to their size. So he divided the stars into categories according to their "magnitude". And since it is difficult to compare stars which are some distance apart in the sky, he decided to divide

them into six broad categories - first magnitude being the brightest, and sixth magnitude the faintest.

Hipparchus's system has been extensively refined over the years and turned into a precise form of measurement. But it retains the strange feature that high magnitudes represent faint objects, and low magnitudes represent bright objects, with the very brightest having negative values. For example, on average Jupiter has a magnitude of about minus 2.

But magnitude isn't the only strange way astronomers categorize stars. They use an odd system of describing their colour in terms of "classes", in which each class has a letter. But even these don't run in order. The main classes of stars are O, B, A, F, G, K, M, R and N which are often remembered by a politically incorrect mnemonic: "Oh be a fine girl, kiss me right now."

Everyone except the printer seemed to enjoy the night sky colour chart from last month, even if only as abstract art. So I have attempted to reproduce the actual colours of the first seven classes, from hot blue class "O" stars, to cool "red" class "M" ones. So do get out at night and have a look. Can you see any colour differences in the stars? (Thanks to Mitchel Charity from MIT whose article suggested the true colour values). The Starboy



Windows Vista - End Of Life

By the time you read this article, Windows Vista will be no more. Microsoft has now withdrawn support for the operating system that was pretty much a dead duck from the day they released it. Windows 7 was rushed out shortly after Windows Vista and was largely forgotten Microsoft from that point onwards. Now the ailing operating system has reached the end of its life as far as Microsoft is concerned and will no longer receive any updates (even for security issues). Of particular concern is that, as with Windows XP, if you use Microsoft Security Essentials for your antivirus then support for that is being withdrawn for Vista users too - if you are using Vista you will have seen the pop up notices.

If you need to replace your antivirus make sure you uninstall the current one before doing anything else - then I suggest you download the free versions of either Avast (www.avast.com) or AVG (www.avq.com) and install it to

remain protected – but no one can say how long these will continue to support Vista.

Other concerns are that Internet Explorer on Vista is very out of date and should no longer be used (and it properly with work websites). Depending on your hardware you may find Google Chrome is no longer supported and current versions of Mozilla Firefox do not install on Vista (though existing versions will get security updates for the time being). The upshot of all this is that, like Windows XP before it, it is now time to start thinking about upgrading to Windows 10 and realistically hardware running Vista is now quite old so it might be more cost effective and sensible to upgrade to a new computer. If you want to continue to use your existing computer, the upgrade to Windows 10 will cost approximately £100 but you may also have to upgrade the hardware to support it - I recommend a minimum of 4GB of memory - a lot of Vista machines came with 16b or 26b installed.

Upgrading may or may not be straight forward. It will mean backing up your data and performing a clean installation of Windows 10 on a blank hard disk, hoping that drivers are available during your setup for all the hardware devices inside your computer. (The biggest stumbling block I have found is wireless connection support of old devices). If the upgrade is successful you will need to copy your data back to the new operating system and reinstall all of your programmes. Many might need upgrades and old printers and other plug in devices may or may not work - certainly the original

CDs should not be used - go to the manufacturer's website and see if you can download new drivers and software.

I feel a bit a like a doom merchant but I have been asked about this recently by a number of customers and thought it worth sharing these thoughts.



Crime In The 2 Dales

Firstly, I would like to thank everyone who has reported any

incidents or accidents to North Yorkshire Police it is appreciated that you have made the effort and taken the time. Calls on the 101 number will vary in amount and type, daily, so you may sometimes have to wait awhile for someone to answer your call. We would encourage you if time permits to remain patient and wait until you get an answer.

The telephone number to ring in a non-emergency is 101. There is a telephone outside Leyburn Police station and one on the front wall of Hudson House in Reeth - both are free and will connect you directly to North Yorkshire Police Control room staff who can take the details of the job and pass on the inf-Ormation to an appropriate officer to deal with.

We are currently encouraging people up for North Yorkshire Community Messaging to receive the notifications latest crime community news happening in your local neighbourhood. You can sign up online at www.nycm.co.uk or fill in the form and hand or post to the local Police station. We are also running a Permanent marking scheme for all your property e.g. saddles, garden tools, farm tools, work tools, mobile phones and cycles. richmondshirepropertymarking@north yorkshire.pnn.police.uk or call the local Police station Over the last few months there have been several incidents regarding thefts of quad bikes and attempts on outbuildings. The two males who made an attempt to steal a quad bike in Marrick set off an alarm which alerted the owners and prevented the bike from being stolen.

In Angram an attempt was made on an outbuilding where a suspect vehicle was sighted several times thankfully nothing was taken.

In Muker unfortunately a quad was stolen. A quad and trailer were also stolen from an area near Healaugh around the same time but due to CCTV footage at this location and a tracker device as well as previous information provided about a suspect vehicle, the quad was found.

In Reeth two males in about their thirties were door knocking trying to sell a new boiler. The contact numbers given when called were unobtainable. If unsure as to a legitimate caller the advice is to not offer any information at all - just terminate the call immediately. The Police, Trading Standards or Action Fraud team can make the necessary checks. Simply dial the number 101 or contact Action Fraud on 03001232040.

In Downholme 25 feed blocks in a square red container were stolen from a pallet in a yard costing a considerable amount. Damage was caused to Surrender smelt mill site where bricks have been removed off the monument and used to smash a flag stone. Given this forms part of the slew system on a 19th century heritage site, it is obviously thoughtless as well as upsetting and expensive to repair.

Minding your business

£1,000 Tax Free Allowance from April 2017

From April 2017, there will be an allowance for trading income and another for property income.

What is the trading income allowance?

There will be a new allowance of £1,000 if you make money by selling goods or providing services. Basically, if your income is less than £1,000, you will not need to declare it to HMRC. This is helpful if you take on a small job, or sell a few things through eBay.

Previously, any income must be included in your tax return and, where appropriate, tax must be paid on it. However, from April 2017, any income from trading which is less than £1,000 will be covered by the new allowance. Therefore, you won't need to declare it to HMRC or pay any tax on it.

If your trading income is over £1,000, you'll have the option of either:

- working out your taxable profit in the usual way, i.e. by deducting expenses from income; or
- choosing to deduct the £1,000 allowance from your gross income. If you choose this route, the £1,000 will be instead of the actual expenses, not in addition to these costs. Therefore, this will benefit you if your expenses are less than £1,000 a year or if you'd rather save the time and effort of recording the actual expenses.

Example: Gemma has a job where she earns £35,000 a year. She also makes and sells some jewellery - she makes £900 per year from this. In the tax year ended 5 April 2017, Gemma will need to declare her income from her jewellery business in her tax return. She'll pay 20% tax on the profit. In the tax year starting on 6 April 2017, Gemma won't need to tell HMRC about the jewellery income as it's fully covered by the £1,000 allowance. Therefore, she'll pay no tax on this income.

What is the property allowance?

The property allowance works in broadly the same way as the trading

allowance. It will also be set at £1,000 and will allow you to receive small amounts of property income without including it in a tax return, or paying tax on it.

As with the trading allowance, if the income is over £1,000, you can choose whether to calculate your profit in the usual way, or by deducting the £1,000 allowance from your gross income.

As with the trading allowance, this will benefit you if your expenses are less than £1,000 a year or if you'd rather save the time and effort of recording the actual expenses.

Please note: this new allowance doesn't affect the option of receiving income from letting a room in your house tax-free under the rent-a-room scheme.

What is rent-a-room scheme?

Income from renting out a room in your home to a lodger may qualify for 'rent-a -room relief', if:

- your gross rent-a-room income does not exceed £7,500, for the tax year ended 5 April 2017 (before the deduction of any expenses), and
- the source of the income relates only to one residence

If the above conditions are met, the income is exempt from tax and you may not claim any deductions for related expenses. You do not need to do anything for the exemption to apply; it will apply automatically unless you 'opt out'.



Reeth Community Orchard



In the past at this time of year in the Orchard we have been busy taking cuttings, splitting herbaceous plants and potting up in anticipation of our Annual Plant Sale in May which has always been one of our fundraisers. Then a couple of years ago we stood back and took stock and decided it made more sense to keep our plant stall and shelves at the gate well-stocked most of the year round as far as possible. Plus it was less concentrated hard work than carting trays of plants down to the gate, putting up tents and praying for fine weather.

It also meant we weren't holding on to plants in order to have plenty to sell on the day but could start putting them out as soon as they were ready. Cuttings need a minimum of six weeks to make sure they have properly established roots and we do always try to sell decent looking plants that are good value.

We are fortunate in having very good friends who bring us lots of spare plants from their own gardens which helps us to maintain our stock.

So if your garden suddenly develops a few bare patches at any time come along and see what's available in the Orchard to fill them. Alternatively come anyway to enjoy the beautiful blossom at this time of year.

Tree Works

These have now been completed and if you have a family grave at the western end of the graveyard that has previously been obstructed from view then hopefully the completion of these works will now made all graves visible and have opened up the view of the river from the churchyard. It was

unfortunate that the works were necessarily undertaken during a rather wet period but the ground has already made good recovery and should continue to do so. A happy addition of two new dwarf fruit trees [damson and apple] have been planted to benefit the resident bees and diversify the range of trees available in the churchyard for foraging [both insect and human]!

The Bells, The Bell.

We are at a good place with this work and the maintenance on the existing bells and final tuning of the 8 bells now in place has been completed. Only a bit of work now on making the bells a little easier to learn to use which requires either a sally guide or possibly a new floor in the tower to complete these works.

The Bees

Back down to two hives again as we began last season. One of the original colonies was lost in the late autumn due to losing the gueen and being too late in the season for human intervention. A common situation. The bees are now busy foraging and seem to be increasing in numbers indicating healthy colonies though it's too early in season to risk a look inside the hives to confirm. Chris our beekeeper won the Richmond and District Beekeepers' Association Novices cup last year, though he says that that was "more down to the bees and local plant life than me."

Reeth Parish Council March 2017

The meeting began with a time of silence in memory of three councillors who had died in recent months - James Kendall shortly before the previous annual meeting; David Allinson in 2016; and Richard Beal earlier in March.

Several groups had expressed the wish to contribute to some sort of memorial for Coun Beal and consideration would be given to placing something suitable on the green.

Annual Parish Meeting: The parish accounts and Memorial Hall accounts were received. The chairman, Coun Cluderay, reported a successful year with an ongoing programme of repairs carried out around the parish and the installation of posts and chains to protect vulnerable parts of the green which had been damaged by vehicles. The weekly market was going well and a note of thanks would be sent to Colin Gardner the market manager for his hard work in ensuring its continued smooth running. The slots for charity stalls were also well booked up for the coming year.

Following on from a query at last year's meeting, the chairman read out a letter written in 1977 setting out the historic background to the Bonfire Hill charity which had originally been specified to fund four half crowns to be shared between poor widows in Healaugh. The clerk had not yet collected this year's contribution but would do so when convenient.

Green agreements: The clerk would redraft the green agreements before circulating them to business owners in order to clarify the restrictions on

what they were permitted to place on the green and cobbles.

Playground: The report from the district council on the playground equipment had been passed to Mr Whitehead to carry out the necessary work.

Best Kept Village Competition: The clerk would find out if Reeth, Healaugh and Fremington could be entered individually in different categories rather than together as one parish.

Maypole dancing: Permission was given to set up a maypole for local school children on the village green on April 12, weather permitting.

Street lights: The light in the Mews was now working but one was out at Fremington and would be reported.

Healaugh: There had been an offer from one resident to have defibrillator sited on her house wall. This would be looked into.

Grass cutting: The old lawnmower would be sold and a new strimmer would be bought.

Repairs: Coun Frankland reported that a second flag was now broken near the shop at the bottom of the village. Delivery drivers would be asked to avoid parking on the pavement and causing further damage. Drains on School Hill and elsewhere in the village were blocked and overflowing. The clerk would report these to Highways. Two loose flags near the Kings Arms would be fixed.

Notice boards: Quotes have now been received for the notice boards and it was agreed to go ahead with the purchase of these boards, and we will arrange installation ourselves. It was agreed to keep the board in the same position at Gunnerside, however it was thought better to move the one at Low Row next to the bus stop, where it would be easier for people to stop to read the notice board, and to put up notices.

Trees in Gunnerside Ghyll: Cllr McCartney has been in touch with the YDNPA ranger, Michael Briggs who has advised that they do not have any volunteers available at the moment, but he has no objection for us to do some work ourselves. Some of the smaller growth could be cleared easily, however a tree surgeon would be needed for the larger limbs. It was agreed to contact a tree surgeon to get some quotations. This work will need to be done before the bird nesting season starts.

Finance: The clerk's salary plus expenses were agreed and paid.

Wall at Lodge Green: The clerk advised that this has been reported to highways, and has been added to their programme of works.

Light in Gunnerside: The light that had been off was reported and this has now been repaired.

Drain at West End Cottage: This has been

causing problems in heavy rain again, and the clerk was asked to report this to highways again.

Drains on Brocca Bank: These are still not clear, and the clerk was asked to report this to highways again.



Upper Dales Family History Group

March's speaker was Kate Hurst on the priests in her family tree - quite a lot of them, as well as a number of nuns. Kate had always been aware that a great uncle who died before she was even born had been a priest but when she began to research her family she had discovered several others going back into the early 18th century.

Kate began with an overview of Catholicism and some of restrictions which had been applied to practising Catholics over the centuries, ranging from fines for not attending Analican church services to extra taxes and bans on travel, inheritance and entry into some of the professions such as law - she also had examples of some of the ingenious ways in which families had got round these laws. Following the failure of the 1745 Jacobite rebellion the restrictions were gradually lessened, up to the time of the Catholic Emancipation Act in 1829.

Her own family had lived in Lancashire for centuries and had sent sons abroad to be educated for the priesthood as, at the time, there were no Catholic schools in England but English speaking colleges had been set up especially on the continent to fulfil the need.

In the 1740s two young brothers, John and William Hurst, travelled to Douai in France and Kate had used the documents from the college to trace their education there. John eventually returned to England to be headmaster of a school in the midlands before

periods as a private family chaplain. His brother had a far more dangerous career, remaining to teach in France where he was caught up in the French Revolution. In the next generation two nephews went first to the school where their uncle was headmaster, then to a college in Lisbon. Both were on the continent during the Peninsular Wars when the students were sent back to England for their own safety and the seminaries were taken over by the military.

Kate ended with a round up of useful sources for tracing Catholic ancestors and a list of publications, many of which are available online via Google Books and similar sites, such as 'A List of Roman Catholics in the County of York in 1604' edited by Edward Peacock and 'Also English Catholic Nonjurors 1715 with a summary of their estates'.

This month's meeting is on Wednesday, May 24, at 2.00pm in Fremington Sunday School when Dr Joan Heggie will be speaking on 'Women and Property in the North Riding'. Dr Heggie has been carrying out a pilot study using the register of deeds at NYCRO to explore women's involvement with property in the North Riding of Yorkshire in the 18th & 19th centuries.


