Message From The Swaledale Museum In Reeth

We are looking forward to welcoming Shaun Richardson and Richard Lamb to the Museum this month to start our lecture series. On Wednesday 5th June, Shaun will talk on: 'Landscape with Horses: Coal Mining at Tan Hill and Kings Pit Collieries'. Both collieries have a history of working covering a period of over 700 years. Using a combination of previously unpublished documentary research undertaken by the late Les Tyson, and new detailed measured earthwork survey carried out by Ed Dennison Archaeological Services Ltd. the illustrated talk will provide an outline history of the collieries and also focus specifically on the survival of structures associated with the raising/ winding of coal to the surface by horses. What remains of these structures at Tan Hill/Kings Pit will be compared and contrasted to those elsewhere in the Yorkshire Dales.

On Wednesday 15th June Richard Lamb will present his latest research 'Not once but twice: The introduction of innovative lead smelting technology into Yorkshire. But where? Marrick of course'. Richard tells us that the title is deliberately intended to be intriguing and poses all sorts of questions about what is called technology transfer. In

some respects it is also misleading as will be explained. Marrick is indeed an unlikely place for innovation but nevertheless the known history and surviving buildings allow an appreciation of what once happened here, not the largest or most complex site but certainly one of the most picturesque and best preserved in Yorkshire. It deserves full recognition of its place in history. Both talks in the Museum at 7.30 pm.

Richard will also be leading an ALL DAY FIELD TRIP on Saturday 13th July to Surrender and Old Gang lead smelting mills. Following the success of the two previous guided tours to Marrick and Grinton Mills, it was thought that something different would be in order. So this year, it is an all day event visiting the two wellknown smelting complexes of Surrender and Old Gang Mills situated on Barney Beck between Arkengarthdale and Swaledale. This will encompass all aspects of smelting in detail, together with a little history, and should appeal to the industrial archaeologist, local historian and researcher into the lead industry. The party size is strictly limited to 20 and will cost £10, payable in advance to the Swaledale Museum, Reeth. All participants will receive a PDF handout prior to the trip via e-mail providing background information and relevant some plans aid to interpretation. Booking essential.

We are a small and growing community group aiming to make Swaledale and Arkengarthdale environmentally an sustainable place to live, work and visit. People are finding our Facebook page, and we're creating website a www.SustainableSwaledale.org to help you to find out what's happening and join in. Please 'like' or link to us to help spread the word. New people are joining our meetings, and we now have a regular date of the first Thursday each month, starting with Thursday 6 June, 7.00pm at the Punch Bowl, Low Row.

Incredible Edible

This is a global movement to grow herbs, fruit and vegetables for anyone to pick and eat, in public and otherwise unused spaces. We're starting Incredible Edible Swaledale, hoping to involve people in planting, looking after and most importantly eating beautiful fresh food that's grown right on our door steps.

Our first small but neglected space is opposite the telephone box in Gunnerside - you will see it planted up and rabbit proofed. Signs will tell you

about the plants and when to pick them, and there may be space for you to add extra edible plants if you have some spare.

Please get in touch if you know of a small piece of land that could grow edibles near you, and/or if you want to get involved. We would love to have a least one communal garden in all the Swaledale villages. As many of you will know, freshly picked fruit, vegetables and herbs taste amazing.

Our 'quick tips' for more sustainable living.#1: Kitchen Cupboard Cleaning Products

Smelly trainers or walking boots? Bicarb of soda is a great natural deodoriser. Wrap a generous amount in newspaper and stuff inside your shoes, or sprinkle directly onto the soles. (Dry tea bags work equally well for this).

Stains or soap scum on your sink or countertops? Mix equal parts of water and vinegar (white or cider) in a spray bottle and spritz away. And don't worry, the smell dissipates when dry.

Hardwood furniture need a polish? Mix 1 tbsp olive oil with $\frac{1}{2}$ tbsp lemon juice and get shining.

Recycling

'Reduce, reuse, recycle' is a great mantra for making your lifestyle more sustainable. 'Reduce' sounds easy



enough, but what are the options for reuse and recycling in Swaledale?

A new recycling facility is being trialled on Reeth Green, to recycle paper and card, cans and plastics, and reduce incineration.

Recycling centres for residents are at Keld YHA, in the carpark at Muker, the Dales Centre at Reeth, and at Grinton YHA (a good bet if the Reeth one is overflowing). All of these take CLEAN paper/card, plastic and glass bottles, food/drink tins and cans. The Muker site also accepts mixed textiles and clothes. There is a small site at Arkengarthdale (not mentioned on the council website.) Tinfoil and cartons can go into your green box for collection. For more info, see the 'What can I recycle' page on the Richmondshire DC website https:// www.richmondshire.gov.uk/bins-andrecycling/recycling/what-can-irecycle/.

For stuff that might be useful to someone else, try posting the item on the Swaledale and Arkengarthdale Buy, Sell and Swap Facebook page; on Freecycle (www.freecycle.org, there is Richmondshire group); a Gumtree (www.gumtree.com); or Facebook Marketplace (www.facebook.com/ marketplace). For furniture that could have a new lease of life 'frade' (www.frade.co.uk) is a Tees Valley-based charity that may arrange collection of bulky items (call 01642 608791).

Hymns and Pimms - Sunday 7th July at 4.00pm


This service will be held outside if the weather is fine. A major part of the service is that we play hymns chosen by **you** so, if you would come to church if they played your favourite hymn - now





Standing on the green in Reeth in the evening, looking west over the roof of the Black Bull pub, there is a large orange star in the sky. This is the giant star Arcturus, part of the constellation of Bootes. There are 59 stars that are registered as part of this constellation, although only 29 are visible to the naked eye and only 9 make up the main shape, which is said to be that of a plough.

10 of the stars in Bootes have planets orbiting them, most of these planets are large gas planets much larger than Jupiter and only one star has more than one planet orbiting it. Contained within the bounds of this constellation are a globular star cluster and 2 distant galaxies, visible with only high power telescopes.

Yet Bootes hides a secret, a hidden and only recently discovered area of

space, The Bootes Void. First discovered in 1981 this empty area of space is 700 million light years from Earth and is 250 million light years across.




If you could look out of a space ship window in the middle of this void, the entire view would be BLACK, nothing would show to the naked eye, only a telescope would show that there was an edge to this expanse of darkness.

And yet, this is not the only void in space that has been found - there are many. The present day understanding is that as the universe expands the voids will join together to create supervoids or perhaps one area of nothing and that in the far distant future the universe will divide itself into an area of stars and light and another of absolute darkness.


