HM Revenue & Customs Scam Alert

What You Need To Know

Action Fraud has experienced an increase in the reporting of malicious calls and voicemails, to members of the public purporting to be from Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC).

Fraudsters are spoofing genuine HMRC telephone numbers to deceive their victims over the phone. The fraudsters state that as a result of the victim's non-payment of tax or other duty, the victim is liable for prosecution or other legal proceedings in order to settle the balance. The fraudsters suggest victims can avoid this, by arranging payment to be made immediately by methods such as bank transfer or by purchasing iTunes gift cards

If the victim is hesitant or refuses to comply, the suspect makes a threat such as immediate arrest, sending bailiffs to the victim's address or, in some cases, deportation.

Often, the period for which the tax is allegedly due is distant enough to guarantee the victim will have little, if any, paperwork or ability to verify the claims. Once the money is paid the suspects sever all contact with the victim.

In genuine cases, HMRC will initially make direct contact with you via post/letter and potentially follow up that letter with a phone call at a later date.

If HMRC contact you via telephone

they will quote the reference number on the initial letter you should have received. HMRC will not discuss something you are not already aware of, like a tax investigation, and will NOT demand immediate payment.

It is vital that the public exercise caution when receiving messages or telephone calls of this nature.

What You Need To Do

- 1. Always question unsolicited requests for your personal or financial information. Just because someone knows your basic details (such as your name and contact details), it doesn't mean they are genuine. Instead, contact the company directly using trusted methods such as a known email address or phone number.
- 2. Legitimate organisations wouldn't ask you to pay taxes, bills or fees using an iTunes gift card, or any other type of voucher. If you're contacted by anyone that asks you to do this, you're likely the target of a scam
- 3. Don't be rushed or pressured into making a decision. Under no circumstances would a genuine bank or some other trusted organisation force you to make a financial transaction on the spot.
- 4. Report Phishing attempts. If you receive a call, text or email of this nature and have not lost money, you can report this as phishing to Action Fraud at:

Reeth Parish Council June 2019

Council members: The chair welcomed newly co-opted members Martin Bearpark, Helen Guy, Beverley Rutter and Paul Terry.

Constitution: An existing constitution used by another council had been adapted for use by the Reeth parish council and was circulated for consideration.

Memorial Benches: Coun Frankland was liaising with the families of the late Jack Alderson and Malcolm Terry regarding the placing of benches in their memory.

National Park: Forms were signed and returned for the ballot for a parish council representative on the board of the National Park Authority.

Electric cars: Following a suggestion from a Reeth resident that a charging point for electric cars would be of benefit to both locals and visitors, the costs had been investigated. The outlay was too great for an individual council but local authorities were able to apply for grants for installing charging points and it was understood that funding might also be available through the National Park. The clerk would write to Richmondshire District Council and the YDNPA to say that the council would be interested in supporting such a scheme if one was proposed.

Archaeology workshop: Information about a workshop on accessing funding for local history projects would be forwarded to the archaeology group.

Textile collections: A letter was received from RDC raising awareness of a number of fraudulent textile collectors known to be operating.

Green agreements: The requests for items to be placed on the green were discussed. It was noted that some businesses were putting out more things than they had permission for or were not taking them in overnight.

Notice board: Coun Longstaff would look into the possibility of providing a lockable, glass fronted case for official parish council notices.

Highways: Coun Frankland reported on a site meeting which he and Coun Longstaff had attended with representatives from the Highways Department to look at a number of outstanding items of concern around the parish. Items covered included curb stones, several drains, the footpath on School Hill, the retaining wall on the Healaugh road, tarmac patching, the wall opposite the former shop and problems with water on the road.

Highways would send a report on the various matters raised and what would be done about them. They had also confirmed that an area of tarmac near the Copper Kettle was not part of their remit.

District Council: Coun Good reminded the meeting of the RDC grants available for communities on the route of the UCI cycle event in September. He planned to hold a ward advice surgery for local residents in Hudson House from 6.00pm to 7.00pm on Thursday July 18.

Astronomy In The Two Dales

Is our Sun a variable star? Last month we took a brief look at the categories of variable stars and asked the auestion if our Sun shows some or all of these qualities.

The first category is that of a pulsating star, one that changes size over time, this is also the easiest question to answer, as throughout our history of astronomical observations, which is at least 5000 years and maybe longer, there is no record of our Sun expanding and shrinking.

The question of whether we live in an eclipsing binary star system, where two stars orbit each other or orbit around a point in space and block each

other's light, depends from which point in space you view our solar system.

From our perspective the Sun can only be eclipsed by the Moon, however, from an outside observers view point, our Sun would be seen to dim and brighten every 12, 30, 84 and 165 years as Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus and Neptune passed in front of the Sun and blocked its light. An outside observer may conclude that our Sun has several red dwarf or brown dwarf companion stars that form a quintuple star system much like TYC 3807-759-1 which is in the constellation Ursa Major and that one or all of these stars form an eclipsing star system.

Now we come to the big question: Does our Sun fit the category of an erupting or catastrophic star? Well we know that the Sun gives off flares and coronal mass ejections, where vast amounts of energy and matter are hurled into space; but have these ever been large enough to effect any of the planets in our solar system?

On September 1st - 2nd 1859 a solar flare from our Sun hit the Earths magnetosphere and caused an auroral display that was seen as far south as Hawaii and telegraph lines threw sparks as they conducted the energy in the atmosphere. Energy from the Sun of



Grinton and Ellerton Parish Council July 2019

Council members: Stephen Porter had been co-opted for the council vacancy. Highways matters: Problems discussed at the previous meeting including bridges and retaining baskets along the beck side had been reported via the parish portal but with no obvious results as yet. There were also ongoing concerns over the state of the wall next to the moor road which had been reported several times previously. The clerk would forward all the relevant correspondence to District Coun Good for him to follow up.

The handrail on the footbridge over the beck had been reported to the National Park Ranger who had inspected it.

Coun Jones reported that retaining baskets of stones were also failing along the beck near the Grange. The clerk would check responsibility for these with the Ranger and also pass the information to Coun Good.

It was agreed that a site meeting was needed with representatives from the Highways Department to look at all these concerns.

Street lights: RDC had removed the light on Pedley House as it was no longer working and they felt it was too far back from the path to be of any use. There was now no light at that end of the bridge which was felt to be very dangerous due to the narrowness of the footpath at that point. The clerk would ask if there was an alternative fixing point, such as a telegraph pole, for a new lamp, pointing out the high number of pedestrians using the footpath to get from the parking field to St

Andrew's church when events were held there.

Hall Registration: Members agreed to go ahead with the registration of the village hall with the Land Registry and Coun Coates was looking into the costs involved.

Cycle event: Funding was available for communities wishing to do something to celebrate the UCI World Championship event in September. If it was possible to get costings in the short time available the council would request a grant for bunting and welcome banners.

Road safety: There were ongoing concerns from councillors and several residents about safety on the road to the moor, particularly with cyclists and others coming down the hill at speed but also turning from the main road onto the moor road without paying attention to oncoming vehicles or pedestrians. It was felt that it was only a matter of time before there was a serious accident. In the first instance the matter would be raised with Highways, proposing that additional signs were needed on the moor, warning cyclists and motorists of the very steep hill ahead. A notice had also been suggested at the end of the Swale Trail to warn users that they were now on a public road and should be aware of motorised traffic.

There had also been difficulties with very large vehicles using the road, including a school bus - this would be monitored and reported if necessary but it was understood that the police were also acting on the problem.

Next meeting: Councillors agreed to move the next meeting from 2 to 9 September 2019.

Our first small plot is up and running and lots of people have been entering into the spirit of it by planting their spare seedlings, so there's not much room left. There are French beans, runner beans, kale, strawberry runners, herbs, courgette and nasturtiums (which have edible leaves and flowers). We've added marigolds as 'companion plants' to help deter greenflies.

There hasn't been much need to water so far (early July), but with warmer weather on the way, things will soon start to grow. Keep an eye open to see how the plants are doing, and when things are ready, feel free to pick some (don't forget to leave some for others.) If you know of somewhere that could make a good village garden, get in touch and we can help you get started.

Upper Dales Family History Group

June's speaker was genealogist Sylvia Valentine with the fascinating story of the Dawson orphans, illustrating the wide variety of sources she'd been able to use to research them and how some lateral thinking had enabled her to tie them together into a whole.

In the Keighley workhouse correspondence book Sylvia had found a letter from 1838, copied to three men in different parts of the country, regarding the five sons of the late William Dawson who had been left to the care of the parish.

The letter listed the boys' names and ages. Parish registers enabled her to find their baptisms and the family address and showed that William had originally been a worsted manufacturer but later became a wine and spirit merchant: local trade directories showed that he had taken over the business from his deceased brother. Administration of the brother's estate gave the name of their father, Robert, and more delving into the registers showed that Robert was originally from Troutbeck.

Marriage licences

correspondence book and in newspaper reports but sadly, when the brothers lost their parents, sister and only surviving grandparent within a short space of time, there was no-one left locally to take care of them. An aunt sent money to the Board of Guardians to help with their support but with six children of her own she was in no position to take on five extra boys.

of the Church of England Clergy Database, census records, property transactions, court records and newspaper reports. as as documents in the National Archives and from John's Oxford College Wakefield asylum to trace the very varying careers of the brothers in a story which encompassed inheritances, insanity, suicide and running away to join the merchant navy, alongside the more mundane details of 19th century family life.

Summing up she said that the important things was to use multiple sources, comparing as many records as possible and never to take anything at face value.
