First Thoughts . .

Tuesday 30th July 2019.Up to 113mm of rainfall in 3 hours

"The Environment Agency said the intensity of rain was a UK record".

Tuesday 30th July— 2pm+, I was working at home in Reeth stuck to the phone on yet another boring 2hr call, when I started to notice that heavy rain was battering our windows. That rain was replaced by the louder impact of hailstones.

The noise was so loud I had to leave the call and it was clear something extraordinary was occurring. So like many others, I found myself rushing round the house checking my windows and skylights for leaks. As it turned out we were very lucky and only our downstairs carpets were ruined.

Lucky because this was absolutely nothing compared to the dreadful events happening in Reeth and only a short walk away, down the hill in Fremington and Grinton. At that moment homes, businesses and farms were being deluged by a torrent of flood water. An unprecedented flood that within a short space of time brought danger, distress and loss.

The Arkle Beck had completely overflowed its banks. It had become a river. Its size, speed and power was frightening (see Cover Picture).

Early next morning already the recovery efforts had begun. As I walked down to Fremington, I witnessed the start of the clear-up. There was such a buzz of activity and community spirit and it was so uplifting to see how the community had come together to help. The Army, farmers, emergency services, highway services, local businesses and local volunteers were there comforting and helping those people and animals in distress.

Over the next few days as I talked to residents, the messages and thoughts were all for those most affected. For the majority of us the impact had been short-lived and inconsequential whereas for those who had been hit hardest, their problems will persist for a long time.

Since that Tuesday I have received an increasing number of positive messages and news items. These included people organising events to collect recovery funds, thank-you messages to those who helped, news of local businesses offering free food and accommodation to volunteers, the young farmers who flocked to rebuild walls and donations from cyclists from around the world who were going to attend the cancelled Ard Rock event etc. The list goes on.

This Gazette is a bumper size due to the flood event items. It has been tricky fitting all items in and some pages are very full of content. I felt this month is an exceptional gazette therefore I endeavoured to fit all in I could.

Finally, I feel so very lucky to be living in these dales, not just because of the natural beauty but especially because of the wonderful people. wonderful as proven by the items in this Gazette.

This Gazette contains reports & pictures of the horrendous flooding that affected so many on 30 July. I want to say thank you to so many.

Thank you to the fire brigade and police, with fire crews coming as far away as Malton. They all did an amazing job. The Swaledale Mountain Rescue Team worked all night and continued to assist for days to come.

The people of Swaledale and Arkengarthdale helped neighbours and friends who were so badly affected, offering beds and meals etc on the Tuesday night. The next day there was a swift response by ladies setting up in Reeth Memorial Hall that next day to provide hot drinks and food.

The Major Incident Response Team staff and volunteers from N. Yorks and Richmondshire Councils visited all houses and businesses to see what help they needed. A massive thank you to all those who donated food, cleaning material; individuals and well-known supermarkets all played their part. The number of volunteers who came to help that first weekend was amazing. We were also supported by the professional Rubicon UK, volunteers. Their experience of working in flood disasters was invaluable. The wonderful work of the Young Farmers Clubs is reported elsewhere. A team from Richmond Pride Came to help and I must say a very special thank you to a group of Muslims from Batley representing their organisation "One Nation" helping in so many ways, including supplying wonderful food.

For the first day the Police oversaw the initial Emergency response and since then the "Recovery Phase" is being led by N. Yorks Council, Richmond District Council, Yorkshire Dales Nat Park, Environment Agency, Yorkshire Water and more.

The RDC supplied the sandbags and

skips and paid for meals via the Buck Hotel and the CB Inn for those affected. The Council had staff working through both the first weekend and the second weekend. The Grinton & Ellerton Abbey Parish Council organised a public meeting in Grinton Church which was attended by the Senior Officers from RDC, NYCC, Yorks Water, YD National Park and the Environment Agency.

Arkengarthdale Councillors organised the clearing of the bridge at Whaw, then working with the National Park and 60 volunteers cleared the track at the side of Arkle beck.

The team from the Ard Rock bike event, that had to be cancelled, did an amazing job in the clear-up and raising a large amount of money.

MP Rishi Sunak and Government Ministers visited and the community looks forward to financial support. Several appeals have been set up.

Young Farmers Help After Flood

More the 100 Young Farmers travelled from across the county to Reeth to help with clear up efforts following flash floods in Yorkshire. Reeth, Wensleydale Young Farmers and other farming associations, formed a human chain to start rebuilding stone walls washed away by the force of flood water. A priority was to ensure that the annual Reeth Show would not be cancelled, by rebuilding the area that is to host the event.

Georgina Fort, chairman of the Yorkshire Federation of YFCS, spoke of her pride at their efforts to help flood victims "We were all so busy working, there was no time to get emotional but when we stopped for a moment and looked out at what had been achieved, it was a very special moment"

Georgia Hird, secretary of Reeth YFC, said: "The mums from Reeth YFC put on a picnic lunch for the volunteers and the local fish and chip van kindly served us tea".

The YFs then visited various other affected places – inc livestock producers in Fremington and Arkengarthdale.

YFs elsewhere have also swung into action, with Newport Pagnell YFC in Buckinghamshire donating hay and straw to the community.

Freemasons give £25,000 to victims of Flood

Two Ridings Community Foundation Appeal

Friday 9 August 2019

Victims of the recent flash flooding that hit hundreds of dales homes including are being helped by a grant of $\pounds 25,000$ from Yorkshire freemasons.

The grant includes $\pounds5,000$ each from freemasons in Yorkshire West Riding and Yorkshire North and East Ridings, as well as $\pounds15,000$ from the Masonic Charitable Foundation, the freemasons' national charity.

The money is being given to the Two Ridings Community Foundation, which has launched an appeal to help householders and local businesses. Local freemasons' lodges are also raising funds for the Swaledale Mountain Rescue Team as well as a small local charity in the village of Reeth.

The grant will help the vulnerable, elderly people and families to get back on their feet by replacing items such as carpets, basic furniture, white goods or by assisting with repairs.

This support is especially needed by those who were not able to afford insurance or for those who had flood cover refused by insurance companies. It will also provide assistance to local businesses in the area facing hardship as a result of the floods. This could include replacing tools, equipment or to tide people over due to loss of earnings, while businesses recover.

The Masonic Charitable Foundation is funded by freemasons, their

families and friends, from across England and Wales. Jan Garrill, Chief Executive of Two Ridings Community Foundation said: "We're hugely grateful to Yorkshire freemasons for their generous grant, which will allow us to help the hundreds of local people who have suffered serious losses, It can take years to fully recover from a major flood and so immediate help can make a massive difference."

Jeff Gillyon from Yorkshire freemasons said: "I'm very pleased we've been able to help local dales people who have suffered in the floods. Damage and disruption from a major flood can be a terrible blow for anyone. Especially for elderly people, the very young or those with disabilities. I'm delighted that the freemasons are able to do their part in helping our community recover." Jan G

Tributes paid to 360 years of education at Arkengarthdale School

Blue skies, sunshine, inspiring displays, over 200 visitors with memories to share, were the perfect ingredients to create a day to remember in the history of Arkengarthdale School.

With the unique Arkengarthdale landscape providing a stunning backdrop for the event, crowds flocked to see the exhibition which tracked the schools extraordinary history. To add to this, visitors enjoyed delicious strawberry teas on the playing field, where there was a great atmosphere, as everyone caught up with old friends.

The rich heritage of the school was celebrated with visitors from across the country, reaching out to those who were evacuated to the school during the war. It was wonderful to welcome such a large alumni which included Clarice Grimshaw (nee Hird) who, at 88, was the oldest ex-student at the event. Clarice was joined by Bill Martin, his sister Eileen, and Norman Patterson who were evacuated from Gateshead and London.

It was an extra-special day for Clark Stones, the oldest ex-student resident in Arkengarthdale, as the celebration coincided with his 85th birthday. Clark was delighted to attend the event and together with his sons Robert and Philip, and grandchildren Jack and Olivia, represented three generations of his family educated at the school. Clark said: "It is a great honour to have been a student at this School which has served the dale so well for 360 years. As a pupil, I remember the surge of children and

staff as the evacuees joined, many of whom returned to live here in later years. Throughout the school's history one thing is constant and that is the marvellous support from staff, children, families and friends. This has ensured our students have always received an excellent education and the very best start in life, going on to great things." As well as the Stones family, there were other families present who had attended the school for many generations. This incl. the Atkinsons from Faggergill, with three generations of ex-students.

Charles Cody, Chair of governors, concluded: "The event was a fitting tribute to a school which holds a special place in the hearts of so many. The afternoon could not have been better and was made possible by an incredible team of volunteers who stepped forward to offer their help and support. It is perhaps this wonderful community spirit that will leave a lasting legacy. It certainly made the day even more special and demonstrates, despite the closure of the school, the underlying and enduring strength of our community."

Our annual vaccination day will be held this year on **Thurs 26th September between 1.30pm & 3.30pm** at the practice. Just to clarify, eligibility is defined by those people over the age of 65; those who are registered as a carer, or those who suffer from the following conditions:

 \cdot Chronic Respiratory Disease (COPD, asthma, etc)

· Chronic Heart Disease (e.g. heart failure, angina)

- · Chronic Kidney Disease
- · Chronic Liver Disease
- · Chronic Neurological Disease (e.g. Parkinson's Disease, strokes)
- Diabetes

 \cdot Immunosuppression (suppressed immune system due to disease or drugs

Those of you who have had 'flu will know it is a miserable experience. For some people in the groups above it can even be life-threatening.

I can't recommend the 'flu vaccine enough to you, and wholeheartedly recommend it to those of you who are eligible. I will be joining you with my annual jab.

Pregnant women and some young children are also eligible for a 'flu vaccination, but the practice will contact you directly to arrange vaccination.

For regulars, you will know that this is all about the tea, cake and gossip and a brief interlude for the vaccination! No appointments are needed and please just attend between 1.30pm and 3.30pm.

If you are unsure about whether you are entitled to a vaccine, please ask at reception. There will be a few catch up clinics held later on for any who miss the date.

Muker Parish Council June 2019

Matters Arising:

Silver Hill: A site meeting is still to be arranged.

Retaining Wall Gunnerside: No response received from Highways. Road - Scar House Bridge: Highways responded to say the area had been inspected. It did not meet the criteria for repair. Cllr Metcalfe queried why this repair was urgently required. Clerk to contact Highways to re-iterate the urgency and ask them to readdress.. Blocked Drain Thwaite: Highways had responded, that there was an order with a contractor to empty and jet the aullies.

Finance: An Order to pay and a cheque was raised for £290.34 to Cardiac Science to pay for the defibrillator Battery for Thwaite and the electronic pads for Thwaite and Muker. The Financial Risk assessment was reviewed. and all were agreed. The Risk Assessment was signed by the Chairman Treasurer. The Certificate and of Exemption and the Annual Governance Statement were signed after the Chairman had shared the details. All approved the signing. The chairman also shared the Annual Accounts and again all were in agreement and signed. The

Notice of Public Rights and Publication of Annual Governance & Accountability Return were set for Friday 28 June – Monday 29 July 2019.

Highways:

Muker Parking: The Owner of the Village Store & Teashop Alison Stringer had brought to the attention of Cllr Metcalfe the problem of parking on a small area of the Beckside and the potential risk to road safety this was causing. There is insufficient room to park a car within the lines and therefore these cars are stuck out into the road. Passing traffic ends up in the middle of the road facing a blind bend and in the path of oncoming traffic. It

was decided that the Parish Council should contact Highways to propose that roadside bollards be placed to prevent cars parking in this area. **Ivelet:** Cllr Metcalfe noted that it

"A Swaledale Shepherd " and the Thwaite flood.

This account was written in the 1940s or 50s by my father Edmund Cooper.

For 20 years George had worked a 300 acre hill farm which his father had held before him. His children had married, and so he and his wife decided to retire to a cottage in the village. Life of course became busier still, as it often does when experienced men give up a job they do well.

For the summer months George was appointed shepherd for the 4 mile stretch of moor and common land known as Muker side. A dozen or so farmers had their sheep 'heufed' on this part of the Dale. Each separate flock kept to its own area, but sometimes odd animals strayed and it was the shepherd's job to drive them back to their own stretch of moorland. He also had to attend to those which got into difficulties. Shakeholes, potholes and Peat bogs abounded and occasionally sheep became trapped and would starve to death or drown if not discovered early. There were illnesses which had to be reported to the owners. George would also be involved with the clipping and sheep dipping.

When in his seventies George put in a 5 day week. Followed by his dog he tramped 6 to 8 miles a day over rough, rock covered slopes, gullies, across heather and peat hags. One day I gladly accepted his suggestion that I go with him to the 2,000 feet summit of Lovely Seat. Although 10 years his junior I struggled to gain his approval. We sat down for "puffs" at our pipes. Below us lay the tiny hamlet of Thwaite. George was reminded of the flood which, over 50 years ago, caused great damage to the houses. If the watershed on Shunnor Fell had not divided the deluge into both Wensleydale and Swaledale, either Hardraw or Thwaite would have been obliterated. He was in Thwaite at the time, having taken a horse to the blacksmith. Suddenly he saw a "breast of water" 6 feet high, coming down Thwaite beck. Returning to the smithy he found it surrounded by swirling water. It took him 1 or 2 hours to get to his horse which had been standing patiently as the waters receded. A muddy tide mark showed that the water had reached halfway up his sides

As we continued over the moor we separated a few sheep who had roamed over from Wensleydale, we found a lamb born as late as June. George said that an enterprising 'tup' must have got in with some of last year's 'hoggs' and this was the result. Year-old 'glimmer' yews are considered too young for breeding, he said, but if accidents do happen, as in this case, they make good mothers.

Once in the valley George told me how his father had taught him to salve sheep when he was only eleven. Each fleece had to be parted with one's fingers and a mixture of tar and old butter or grease rubbed into its roots to prevent scab and other diseases.

The knowledge he had gained was superseded soon afterwards by chemical sheep dips being introduced. Instead of treating a dozen or so sheep a day with the old method, a hundred or so can now be dipped in a morning. In the past the annual event of washing sheep occurred. Deep pools were made by damning the streams to create 'dubs'. The sheep were driven in 3 or 4 at a time while the farmers, dressed. In their oldest clothes, stood up to their waists in the water, turning the sheep over till they were well soaked. Sheep washing was a combined effort in the community, and sometimes entailed the consumption of a fair amount of whiskey.

George died some years ago, but no one was appointed as shepherd in his place, so an expert knowledge based on an age-long experience was lost.



The Langworthy Affair: A Victorian Scandal by Dr. Tony Nicholson

1887, Mildred Sabine Palliser Langworthy (Milly), the daughter of an Irishman who had fallen on hard times. Milly learned of her father's crisis and travelled to England. 





On average we respond to 60 calls each year. There were nine incidents this month.

Incidents July 9th to Aug 9st

08/08/2019 (29) Team called via the Police to search for a group of overdue walkers on Great Shunner Fell. Team leader travelled to Keld to meet the reporting person. While there the aroup turned up safe & well.

group turned up safe & well. 30/07/2019 (25,26,27,28) The Floods day. Multiple rescues & welfare checks in & around Reeth following flash flooding.

Initially called by the Police following reports of 14 people stranded in rising flood water between Grinton & Redmire, 1 team member made it through to wait with these trapped persons (the bridge had now collapsed) they were all escorted to safety later in the evening when water levels dropped to a safe level.

While responding to the initial call we were diverted to reports of a person & a cat trapped on an 'island' with rising flood water. Our water rescue technicians deployed our rescue boat to recover the trapped person & cat to safety.

Part of the team were then deployed to Harkerside to check on the safety of a number of elderly residents.

The team responded to reports of a number of donkeys trapped by the rising water. Our water technicians attended & made sure they were in a place of safety.

Our last call was to recover 5 trapped vehicles full of people who were trapped near Ellerton Abbey.



Between these rescues we worked closely with the Fire Service to undertake welfare checks, often in chest deep water in the Fremington & Grinton area. The first call was at 16.25 & the team returned to base just after midnight.

Over the next 3 days we supported the clear up operation & undertook a number of welfare checks on remote residents.

25/07/2019 (24) Called by the Police as part of a joint response with North Yorkshire Fire. We were called to rescue an injured person below the waterfall at Richmond. Fire, Police, Ambulance & Helimed all attended. Treated on scene & then evacuated across the river on our rescue sled. A special thanks to Barries Ices & Cafe for providing free water to the rescue services.

24/07/2019 (23) Called by North Yorkshire Police (initially to Upper Wharfedale Fell Rescue Association then passed to us) to rescue a lamb & a goat from a pot hole in Arkengarthdale, a small team went & recovered both safely.

Editor Note: It took persuasion to ask the team to provide additional detail about their rescues on the day of the floods. That's typical of the excellent humble attitude of these volunteer rescuers. As always the community admire these volunteers and are very grateful for their services.

Swale Litter Picking - Saturday 21 September

The recent floods have added lots of extra rubbish to the river banks, so we're keen to get started with our first communal litter-pick: to clear litter along paths, banks, hedges and even the trees. We'll be getting together in small groups to pick-up along the footpaths and common land beside the Swale, between Gunnerside and Reeth. "Giant metal pipes used to repair bridge

The traditional dales masonry bridge over Cogden Beck, near Grinton, was left completely destroyed after torrential water carrying boulders and other debris brought down the bridge. This road which links the communities of Grinton and Leyburn also forms part of the **UCI Road World Championship route**, which arrives in the county in September. North Yorkshire County Council's engineers and contractors have been working round the clock ever since the devastating floods, to reconnect the dales communities.

On Tuesday, August 13, two steel tubes were delivered from Cleveland Steel and were rolled into Cogden Beck. They will divert the waterway so a temporary bridge and road can be built. If all goes well, the temporary crossing will also <u>allow the</u> <u>road world championships to continue</u> along its planned route. Gigantism in Swaledale

Whilst preparing one of this year's Swaledale festival walks up Cringley Hill, an unusual set of markings were found on one of the erratics (rocks). What they are is still contentious. So far there are two ideas. First, they are just an unusual set of sedimentary depositional marks, or second they could be the fossilised remains of a 'Meganeura' dragonfly dating from back 300 million years ago from the carboniferous period. The late carboniferous was a period of gigantism and dragonflies with 3-feet wingspan are known to have existed - is this one in the photo taken? John Russell

Is our Sun capable of emitting super flares, otherwise known as great solar flashes or micro nova?

A recent study published in The Astrophysical Journal 3/5/2019, investigated stars of the same type as our Sun and found out of 64 stars that give off superflares, 43 of them were single stars. The younger the star, the more often they emitted flares, older stars like our Sun emitted flares every 23000 years.

What evidence do we have that our Sun has in the past ejected its surface across the solar system? We would have to look for the following: signs of melted rock and sand on any solid planet, the rapid evaporation of liquid on a planet's surface and a frost line in the solar system. A frost line is a ring



of debris that rings a star, where water vapour and other elements ejected by a star have cooled down and formed ice. In our solar system we have the Kuiper belt, a ring of debris mainly composed of water, methane and ammonia, that extends beyond the orbit of the planet Neptune out into deep space. So, we have a frost line, how about signs of melted rock?

In Scotland there are the vitrified forts, stone walled hill forts where part of the rock has been melted, this kind of heat damage has been found elsewhere in northern and western Europe. Stone melts at 2072 degree Centigrade.

Have you ever heard of Libyan desert glass? The desert of Libya and Egypt is covered with pieces of melted sand that has formed into glass, we also have something called glass spherules, which are small glass beads formed from melted sand. Spherules form at 3000 degree Centigrade or higher. These spherules can be formed by volcanos and meteor impacts; however, the volcanic and impact types have gas bubbles inside them.

The heat formed spherules we see on Earth and the Moon both have the same chemical composition and do not contain gas bubbles, so whatever caused the sand to melt on the Earth and the Moon had to come from the same source. Glass spherules have also been found on Mars.

Finally, has the Earth, or any other planet, ever had a large amount of liquid evaporated from its surface? At the beginning of the last ice age sea, levels dropped 394 feet, how much heat would that take? There is only one source that is capable of raising the temperature on Earth to such a level, so such a volume of water would vaporise. Mars used to have seas and an atmosphere, but these are long gone, something boiled them away. So, is it time to bring the tomato plants in? Well, the more we discover, the more guestions we have.

One thing is certain , we live on a small ball of rock 94 ,000,000 miles away from a volatile ball of fire, and although this fire is starting to age it is still capable of temper tantrums and instead of throwing its toys out of its pram, it hurls fire.

Perhaps our Sun is that primordial dragon mentioned in the ancient texts, if this is so, what was St George?





Shooting Stars Evening

The Reeth Informal Astronomy Group open evening on the 12th August was attended by around 40 people.

A collection made at the event raised £157.50 for the flood appeal. The event was timed to coincide with the annual Perseid Meteor Shower, when the Earth passes through the orbit of Comet Swift-Tuttle and intercepts large numbers of small fast-moving particles thrown off by the comet.

The Reeth Evangelical Congregational Church kindly made their premises available for the event.

Those attending enjoyed talks on meteors and their detection. They were able to examine samples of meteorites including a fragment of a Mars meteorite.

The sky cleared long enough to go outside and observe Jupiter, Saturn and the Moon. Unfortunately some cloud later in the evening combined with the nearly full moon, prevented the planned visual meteor count from going ahead. We were however able to watch in real-time as meteors were being picked up by a radio telescope.

Volunteers Clear Flood Debris From Bridleway

Arkengarthdale residents including Parish Councillors and farmers were joined by keen walkers and mountain bikers from across the north of England on Saturday (10 Aug) for a post -flooding clean-up of Langthwaite bridleway.

Flash flooding on the 30th of July swept away the aggregate surface of the bridleway and created a gully into which walling stone and other debris was deposited.

After a midweek call for volunteers, promoted online by Dales Bike Centre in Fremington as well as Richmondshire Today, National Park Authority rangers ended up being joined by more than 60 helpers.

In the space of five hours, the team cleared an estimated 150 tonnes of stone from a 750 metre section of the bridleway. Any walling stone was placed by the bridleway for re-use, while rubbish such as concrete and tarmac slabs and baling wrap was taken away.

The National Park Authority's Area Manager (North), Matt Neale, said: "I would like to thank all the people that came out. They were just superb. The work rate was amazing. Everyone wanted to help and get the job done. There will be future events that will be publicised in the same way - so keep an eye out on social media for requests for help."

The Authority's Member Champion for Recreation Management, Nick Cotton, said: "Experienced rangers have said they've never before seen a volunteer effort like it. People came from across the north of England, from Kendal to Hull to Bishop Auckland, to help. There were walking and mountain bike enthusiasts, as well as residents. It was an unusual and unique gathering of people who came together for a common cause. The Langthwaite bridleway is not yet accessible along its full length, as there are at least three landslips between Langthwaite and Fremington, but there is a parallel public footpath that remains open for walkers.

Mr Cotton added: "Rangers are still receiving reports of damaged rights of way in Arkengarthdale and Swaledale, so are busy cataloguing and prioritising the repair work needed. It could be some time before everything is fully back to normal. Fortunately a large number of routes were unaffected by the floods, so there are plenty of opportunities to enjoy the two dales both on foot and by bike."

Arkengarthdale Parish Council July 2019

School buildings and playing field: The Council agreed to accept the transfer of the covenant of the school playing field from NYCC to retain it for public use after the school had closed. A letter from David Williams proposed that the Council consider holding a public meeting to identify what support there is from the community to work with Arkengarthdale Church to retain the school building as a community resource. The Council agreed to call a public meeting after the school closes on 31 August.

NYCC Highways site visit: 24th June scheduled visit by NYCC Highways Dept, to consider the road to Kitley Cottage from Seal Houses as well as various road repairs and drain-related issues, was cancelled by Highways. We waiting to hear from Highways, for a new date, that would also be convenient for Cllr. John Blackie to attend. Phone mast at Seal Houses: The Council took into consideration the objections of a lattice pole and had no objections to a monopole mast, providing EE would install the extended area services on the same mast as the emergency services network. EE had been approached about this, but a response had not been forthcoming.

This was being followed up. Future Parish Council meeting venue: The Council accepted the offer from St. Mary's District Church Council, Arkengarthdale, of the use of the church vestry for Council meetings. Waste enclosure in Langthwaite car park: A response from the RDC Waste and Street Scene Manager in June stated that quotes were being sought for the expansion and repair of the site. It was expected that works would be completed in the "next month or so".

Parking at Waterfall View,

Langthwaite: A resident has requested stronger, clearer signage at the entrance to Storthwaite Lane by Waterfall View, to ensure that cars did not block the access. The resident is to be contacted to form a statement to be considered at the next meeting of the council.

Land at the Old Butcher's Shop: A request had been received for the verge near the bridge into Langthwaite, outside the Old Butcher's Shop, to be kept tidy and grass cut. The ownership of this land would be looked into, as it was not thought to belong to the Council.

Planning applications: Conditional approval had been given for application R/01/147A, The Old Butcher's Shop, Langthwaite; Planning consultation for R/01/137A, Arkle Barn, Langthwaite for conversion and extension of the barn for local occupancy.

Annual Governance & Accountability Return: Now approved and signed, and is available on the Council website: <u>www.arkengarthdale.org.uk</u>. David Williams was thanked for undertaking the internal audit.

Fraudulent 'charity' collections: A request from RDC to raise awareness about fraudulent charity textile collections was noted. Information had been placed on the notice board in Langthwaite and would also be placed on the Council's website.
