Last Christmas

What is your all time favourite Christmas song? It's a very difficult question to answer and can change each year...BUT for me it's 'Last Christmas' by Wham!

I remember Christmas 1984 when it lost out to 'Do they know it's Christmas' by Band Aid, for the no.1 spot. It's arguably the best song never to get to No.1.

'Last Christmas' was written by George Michael, then aged 21, in the summer of 1984. It was composed in his childhood bedroom whilst Andrew Ridgeley (his Wham! partner) was downstairs watching television and probably blow-drying his hair.

The song was then recorded August 1984, in a studio full with Christmas decorations. Incredibly George wrote, produced, performed and played every instrument, even though he had no musical training.

George died Christmas Day 2016 (what a sad coincidence) and before that he had already given permission for this years Christmas film, 'Last Christmas' to be made. The film is written by Emma Thompson who in a recent TV appearance, said of meeting with George, "He was just the loveliest guy you could imagine."

The story of the writing of another of his classics, 'Careless Whisper' is again impressive. He wrote that song sitting on a bus age 18 for pete's sake.

The genius and maturity of George Michael at such a young age is clear to see. I have no idea how he was



so wise about life, love etc. He left a wonderful legacy of songs. Happy Christmas George.

On-call firefighters are trained firefighters who, rather than being based at a fire station, provide on-call cover from home and/or their place of work. They declare the periods in a week when they are available to respond to emergencies if called upon. They respond to emergencies when their pager alerts them, so must work and/or live within approximately four minutes travel time from the fire station as they travel from that location to the fire station, where they then travel to the emergency in a fire service vehicle.

The fire crew at Reeth attend between 50 and 60 incidents every year, this includes anything from fires to road traffic collisions.

### REETH WALLATHON

19 - 20<sup>TH</sup> OCTOBER 2019 '225 metres of wall restored in 2 days'

The devastation to the walls in and around Reeth were brought to our attention by our Patron, HRH The Prince of Wales. I received a phone call from the Prince's personal assistant at Clarence House. This was the start of the process. The DSWA has organised a few Wallathons in recent years in Cumbria and Dorset. We contacted all of our branches and used our website to spread the word and the 'Call to Wall!' The response was outstanding.

The Reeth Wallathon was a tremendous success, with wallers coming from as far afield as Dorset and the west of Scotland. We even had 2 wallers from Japan, In total, over 110 wallers took part over the 2 days and achieved the restoration of a mammoth 225 metres. There are still plenty of walls that need to be restored after the devastating floods in July, but it is hoped that the walls rebuilt this weekend will help the farmers manage their land over the winter. A further Wallathon in the Reeth area next Spring is being organised where we can again help to rebuild more of the 3,500 metres of dry stone wall destroyed in the floods.

The Wallathon was truly a cooperative effort with The Prince's Countryside Fund working alongside The Dry Stone Walling Association who

were, in turn, liaising closely with local farmers particularly, Paul Brown who was a key player in the success of the Wallathon. Phillip Dolphin DSWA Master Craftsman was involved from start to finish; he worked with Paul Brown to identify the walls for repair and also in advance of the weekend set up all eleven stints with profiles to work to. I and the DSWA are very grateful to them both.

The communal effort from the people of Reeth in feeding and 'watering' all the wallers was wonderful and very much appreciated by everyone. The Wallathon weekend was a real community event where everyone pulled together to make it a great success.

Peter Isherwood is a Master Craftsman waller who came along to the wallathon because he believes it is so important that communities work together to help each other in times of crisis. He offered this quote: - "It's great to see so many wallers from all different parts of the country coming here to help the farming community in Reeth. The passion and enthusiasm for dry stone walling is what brings us together. There's been a great team spirit this weekend and a willingness to work together to get the job done."

A further quote from Ray Stockall, Chairman of the Dry Stone Walling Association: - "Everyone has had a super time and the farmers and others from Reeth have really looked after us. We have managed to rebuild 225 metres of

make life a little easier for the community in Reeth."

As part of the PCF Stepping Stones Project, the Dry Stone Walling Association trained 9 apprentices from the North Yorkshire Moors National Park up to the Lantra Level 1 qualification in July / August 2019. We contacted them to see if they would like to come along to the Wallathon and they were extremely enthusiastic. 10 apprentices and supervisors came to the Wallathon and were given the task of rebuilding the garden wall of the local vicarage.

The whole Wallathon weekend was enjoyed by everyone who came and they all said they are looking forward to the Spring event.

The Vicar of Reeth, Caroline Hewlett, is delighted with their efforts as is the Bishop of Rippon, who sent this message: -

I write to offer my deepest gratitude to all at the Drystone Walling Association for the incredible work done to restore the wall at Reeth vicarage. I had seen some photos of the Wallathon, and Caroline had posted some excellent things on Instagram about it, so I am really quite overwhelmed that you should have extended your work to the vicarage. Thank you so very much indeed. This comes with my gratitude, greetings and very best wishes indeed.



Emergency response to flooding - councillors agreed to look into preparing a Parish Emergency Plan and this will be brought to the next meeting Two Ridings Community Foundation - the Parish Council will apply to the Two Ridings Community Foundation for funding to repair the road at Low Row, on the south side of the road on the east side of the village.

Great North Air Ambulance, Yorkshire Air Ambulance, Citizens Advice Bureau – it was agreed to donate £50 to the above organisations.


**Dog-waste bin** - the council agreed for the dog waste bin that is situated by Gunnerside Bridge, to be moved to a location in the centre of the village.

### **Police Report November**



The following incidents of note have occurred in the Reeth and surrounding area this month:

Overnight 17<sup>th</sup> October an outbuilding at Kersey Green near Marske has been broken into and a number of assorted tools stolen.

In the early hours of 28th October a red Honda quad bike was stolen from a farm building near Keld. The stolen guad is believed to have been seen driving towards Tan Hill with a Landrover Defender, it'self believed stolen from Cumbria the same day. Around the same time two farm buildings at Angram were broken into. although nothing was believed stolen. A further farm building near Gunnerside also entered and unsuccessfully attempted to steal a quad bike from within. Enquiries are ongoing regarding all these offences.

On the evening of 5<sup>th</sup> November a Honda quad bike was stolen from a farm building at Gayle above Hawes. Vigilant members of the public reported seeing a quad being ridden later down Swaledale in the Low Row area. It was in company with an unidentified 4x4 type vehicle. Officers were already in the area working on an

anti-crime operation. As such the quad was seen and followed by police as it travelled over the Stang area, where the rider abandoned it before running off. Forensic enquiries are continuing to identify the offender.

The above incidents are a good reminder to check the security again on outbuildings and vehicles. For your quads, please consider installing chaining posts sunk into concrete, tracker, immobiliser devices, sound padlocks, security lighting and cctv.

Please contact us at Leyburn Police station for further security advice. Also, please keep ringing the police when something looks suspicious.

# Three months on from flooding

# Update from the Swaledale & Wensleydale Recovery Fund

Just under 3 months ago flash flooding caused major devastation across parts of Swaledale, Arkengarthdale and Wensleydale. In response and thanks to generous donations from across the UK, Two Ridings Community Foundation opened the Swaledale & Wensleydale Recovery Fund to provide assistance to people affected by this flooding.

In addition to the contribution of £94,000 made by Two Ridings to start the fund, we have received donations of over £165,000 in the last 3 months. This means that the fund has £260,000 to distribute and to date £120,000 of the funds have been distributed to assist people affected by the flooding, meaning that 46% of the fund has been distributed already.

Jan Garrill, Chief Executive of Two Ridings Community Foundation said: "thanks to the generous support of many we have helped many of the people affected by the flooding but we know the fund also has to be there to help people in the long term, especially for key points such as when people move back into their homes. It is always a fine balance in terms of getting the funds out as soon as possible but also making sure there is support in the longer term. But you can be assured every penny will be spent on supporting local people affected by the flooding in Swaledale, Arkengarthdale and Wensleydale."

To date the fund has made 135 pay-

ments of £300 to people affected by the flooding, with a further 5 in the pipeline. As a result of the case worker team visiting people affected by the flooding 19 further awards totalling nearly £50,000 have been made to help people in significant hardship, including 4 awards to small businesses.

The money held in The Swaledale and Wensleydale Recovery Fund will be used to ensure that the families, farms and small businesses affected in Swaledale, Arkengarthdale and Wensleydale have long-term support to help them recover from the effects of flooding. This includes awards to the Parish Councils as well as payments to residents to help them with the costs of temporary accommodation, running dehumidifiers or replacing items such as white goods and essential furniture.

In addition, Two Ridings, with the help of Richmondshire Community Voluntary Action have regular drop-ins with a range of other support organisations (The Farming Community Network, Richmondshire District Council, NFU) attending.

This goes alongside the climbing helmets we already have:



We need to protect the team from falls while working on wet / dry / icy steep ground. We do this by providing some basic safety equipment so team members can secure themselves & the casualty immediately while waiting for the rest of our rope rescue equipment to arrive in the vehicles. We need to balance weight with comfort so we use a ski mountaineering style harness as a balance.



# Arkengarthdale Parish Council, Nov 2019

School Building: The nomination to register the school building as a community asset had been successful. A community meeting would be held on Thursday 9 January 2020 at 7pm in the Garden Terrace at The CB Inn. A representative from Arkengarthdale Church Council, the vicar and District Councillor Good would all be invited. Clarification would be sought on who would be the beneficiary of the sale of the building.

Affordable housing: Cllrs Stubbs and Watkins would attend a meeting this month with the Corporate Director and Monitoring Officer at RDC to discuss the affordable housing project. A proposal from the Chair to continue to commit to the project, should funds be secured, was unanimously agreed.

Flooding matters: The next steps in repairing flood damage in the dale were considered now that the work in Arkle Beck was complete. Fallen trees were in the process of being removed from along the beck. Flood-related repairs on High Green would be attended to next. An anonymous donation of £2.5k had been made via the Two Ridings Foundation for the long term sustainability of the dale. There were outstanding highways issues relating to flood damage and NYCC Highways would be contacted again to ask for repairs to Stang Lane and to the gutter and wall opposite Langthwaite bridge and to confirm a new meeting date for a site visit. The repairs to the roadside and the bridge at Whaw would be starting on 11 November 2019 for 12 weeks. NYCC would be advised of the urgent need for re-

pairs to potholes on the Eskeleth road, which would serve as the access road for Whaw whilst the road was closed.

BT consultation on telephone kiosks: BT's intention to remove the telephone kiosk at Langthwaite was discussed. The Parish Council had applied to adopt the kiosk, should the telephone be removed. RDC would be informed that the Council wished to keep the telephone on the grounds that it was in an area with no mobile phone coverage and appropriately sited close to a public car park.

Parish precept 2020/21: The precept for 2020/21 was considered in relation to annual expenditure, noting that no increase had been requested in 2019/20. A sum of £3700 would be requested for the forthcoming year.

Website: A new laptop had been purchased for web maintenance and 75 percent of the cost would be covered by a grant awarded by RDC's Richmondshire Area Partnership Fund.

Langthwaite waste enclosure: The old enclosure was in the process of being replaced by RDC.

Planning matters: Scott Trial: Section 73 application for variation of Condition 2 of R/01/100C to extend the date of the permission to 14/7/2030. A letter of support had been sent; Planning Consultation - Application: R/01/108B at Spence Intake. There were no objections. A letter of support would be sent; Amended plans for Application R/01/77E at West House, Langthwaite. A letter of support for the original application had already been sent. There were no objections to the amended plans.

Christmas lights: The Christmas lights had been damaged in the flood and were not working.

Alternative arrangements would be made and lights would be installed on High Green on Saturday 7 December.

at the war memorial by Cllr Stones;
Waterfall View/Storthwaite Lane parking sign: Following a request for a progress report on changes to the wording
of this sign, the resident who had requested the changes would be reminded

form of words; Streetlight: A streetlight on High Green that was not working would be reported to RDC.

#### Flood matters

Several areas of the beck between Fremington Mill and Sleigill had been identified as being in need of clearing in order to prevent further flooding as well as to carry out repairs. Councillors were liaising with the contractors to decide which sections were most critical with a view to the work beginning as soon as possible.

The council had applied to adopt the red phone box in the square at Healaugh. It was noted that a BT consultation on the removal of phone boxes was ongoing.

#### Bench repairs

Coun Frankland was thanked for carrying out emergency repairs to damaged benches in Reeth and Healaugh.

#### Memorial Bench

After much discussion, members agreed that with great regret they were unable to take up the street furniture licence for a memorial bench for the Alderson family due to the stringent conditions attached and the problems which would arise with it's maintenance due to the preferred position. It was hoped that an alternative option could be found.

#### District Council

In the light of Barclays decision to stop allowing their customers to make withdrawals at post offices, RDC were considering options such as a cash machine at Hudson House. The parish council would support this move.



# MUKER PARISH COUNCIL MEETING October 2019

The Chair welcomed Cllr McMullon to the meeting and wished her well in her newly elected role.

Road Hump Ivelet - Highways had stated that they were continuing to monitor the area during rainfall. Cllr Metcalfe said that this was not satisfactory and that there shouldn't be a huge cost to rectify the problem. It was suggested that a site meeting be set up to look at this issue. Clerk to contact Highways.

Mobile Network - A letter had been received from Rishi Sunak MP detailing the Emergency Services Network. The two masts within Muker Parish are part of a subset of 229 sites in the remotest parts of the UK. The Home Office has only recently formally asked EE to do the work to activate these 229 sites and EE have put forward a commercial proposal. The proposal is currently with the Home Office. His letter states that he will monitor the situation closely and pursue with his cabinet colleagues.

Removal of Phone Boxes - There is just one in the Parish earmarked for removal at Thwaite. Cllr McMullon said that there had recently been an emergency with the Little White Bus in Keld and that the driver had to rely on the phone box as there is no signal. Cllr McMullon would urge anyone to contact RDC or BT regarding the consultation and state their concerns regarding their removal. Clerk to respond to RDC. Village Sign - West Stonesdale. Highways had provided an estimated cost of £450 for two nameplates including in-

stallation. Clerk to contact Cllr Peacock to see if there is any funding available.

Finance - An order to pay and a cheque was raised for WEL Medical for a new base plate on the defibrillator box at Muker. UCI Grant of £823.50 had been received.

Highways - Cllr Porter raised the issue of water on the road at Crowtrees. he understood Highways were supposed to clear the gullies out some time ago. The water is now turning to ice and someone had an accident in their car last week, he also stated that there are no grit heaps. Cllr McMullon said that she had been made aware of the accident and had questioned Highways gritting policy for the road especially in light of the garage at Reeth being closed and residents now using the garage at Hawes or Woodhall. Cllr Calvert stated that he had travelled the road recently and there was ice all the way across at one point. Clerk to contact Highways, Cllr Metcalfe gueried why the grass had been cut on the roadside at this time of year. Whilst it had been a job well done, he stated that it would be better done in the Summer months.



# Astronomy in the Two Dales

When you wish upon a star, makes no difference who you are - Cliff Edwards.

Sitting 190 light years away from Earth is a star named Methuselah, it is in the constellation of Libra, and has been closely observed for the past 100 years. The reason for this close scrutiny is that Methuselah is estimated to be as old as the universe it'self, if not older. At present the age of the universe has been calculated as 13.77 billion years, yet



the age of Methuselah is 14.3 billion years plus or minus 800 million years, so at it's youngest this star is still 13.5 billion years old, and it is sitting in our back yard.

# **Upper Dales Family History Group**

Our October speaker was Anthony Atkinson to tell us about the life of Ada Lovelace, daughter of a short lived and volatile marriage between the science loving Annabella Milbanke of Seaham Hall and Lord Byron, poet and serial philanderer. Byron himself had a poor start in life, with a family history of mental instability, debt and suicide, and his father dying when he was only three The later deaths of his vears old arandfather and mother left him with a title and property but also a great burden of debt. Returning from abroad he met Annabella Milbanke who was enjoying her first season, and proposed to her. They married in January 1815 and their daughter, Ada Augusta, was born later the same year but within a month Annabella decided that her husband was insane and fled back to her parents, threatening to expose 'infamous crimes' which she had uncovered by reading Byron's private papers. He fled abroad to avoid the consequences and never saw his daughter again.

Annabella raised their child to be everything her father was not, educating her in mathematics and science and imposing a strict regime. Although often ill Ada was obviously a gifted student, helped by the quality of her teachers. In spite of all her mother's care however, the genetic influence of her father could not be escaped - in her mid-teens she was found to be planning to elope with one of her tutors with whom she had fallen in love.

Ada married William Turner, later First Earl of Lovelace. Around the same time she met Charles Babbage who was working on an early type of calculating machine which he called 'the difference engine'. This came to nothing but Ada became fascinated by the idea and worked with him on his next project the 'analytical engine'. Convinced that it was capable of far more than he imagined Ada demonstrated how it could be used to work out formulae and translated an article from Italian, supplemented by her own notes, which are often considered to be the first computer program.

Sadly Ada's personal life was following the pattern of previous generations. Her health broke down after the birth of her second child, she became addicted to strong painkillers and her fascination with mathematics led to an obsession with gambling with led to the breakdown of her marriage. She eventually died from cancer aged only 36, being visited in her last months by Babbage and Dickens, leaving behind a legacy which wasn't fully realised for almost another century with the development of modern computers in the 1940s. Her contribution to something which we now take so much for granted is recognised by a Lovelace Day and the Lovelace Medal.

This was a fascinating glimpse into the sometimes insalubrious life of the early 19<sup>th</sup> century and into the world of a woman who Anthony summed up as being a brilliant creature but deeply flawed. **Tracy**


