We are recruiting on-call firefighters at a number of our fire stations, including Reeth. See Reeth team here:



On-call firefighters are trained firefighters who, rather than being based at a fire station, provide on-call cover from home and/or their place of work. They declare the periods in a week when they are available to respond to emergencies if called upon. They respond to emergencies when their pager alerts them, so must work and/or live within approximately four minutes travel time from the fire station as they travel from that location to the fire station, where they then travel to the emergency in a fire service vehicle.

The fire crew at Reeth attend between 50 and 60 incidents every year, this includes anything from fires to road traffic collisions.

So if you:

- Are aged over 18 or over
- Work or live within four minutes of the fire station
- Have a reasonable level of fitness (continued on next page)




good game from both teams and a welcome 9-6 win.



Want to be more sustainable ?

Editor Note: This article was not included in the December Gazette but I thought these tips apply all year.

In Britain, 70% of us are looking to 'go green' and reduce our environmental impact, avoiding plastic packaging and buying gifts made from recycled or ecofriendly materials. So how can we make Christmas special **and** sustainable? Here are a few ideas:

Buy experiences, **not 'stuff'** - treat someone to tickets for a concert or show, buy them a subscription, or book a day learning a new hobby or skill (try ArtIsOn in Masham).

Give your time and skills to help someone - offer your time to help with gardening, spring-cleaning, mending etc.

Buy things that someone actually needs, from local independent businesses – so your money helps our local economy. (Don't spend money with those companies that tax-avoid, like Amazon!).

Hunt down something pre-loved from a quirky reseller or charity shop. Try to buy fair-trade, ethical, plastic-free and durable things (follow Marie Kondo's advice - does it 'spark joy'?).

Make something – food usually goes down well – chocolate-coated fruit and nuts, jams, pickles and chutneys keep well, and cakes and biscuits can be frozen. And making a big batch means less time per present, and some left for you!

Make your own crackers using loo-roll centres (also great for the compost bin and as a 'root-trainer' for growing peas, beans and leeks). Search for jokes or mottos on the web and include sweets that you like.

Use newspaper/magazine pages instead of wrapping paper (or re-use fabric and ribbons), and save Christmas cards to cut out gift tags for next year.

Gardening - does it matter if our pollinators die out? (Spoiler alert - yes, it does). Let's talk about sex (Editor note: at last!). Female gametes, male gametes. Now, if you don't have your own way of getting one to the other, you're going to need a bit of help and this is where 'pollinators' assist... 



Tate Ancient: the Earliest Art

Dr Ben Roberts, Lecturer in European Prehistory at Durham University explores the earliest art in a lecture for The Arts Society, Wensleydale, at Tennants Garden Rooms, Leyburn on 14th January 2020 from 2-3pm. In 1864 the discovery of the first Palaeolithic sculpture of a woman fuelled the Victorian debate on human origins. The iconic Venus of Willendorf was excavated 1908. Subsequently, several hundred figurines have been found across Europe. The oldest is 35,000 years old. The famous Lascaux cave paintings were found in 1940 by a teenager. There are over 600 wall and ceiling paintings 17,000 years old. The caves were opened to the public in 1948 but closed in 1963 because of the damage due to 120,000 visitors a day. The oldest known cave art by humans, of hand stencils and geometric designs, are 40,000 years old. In 2018, archaeologists reported cave paintings made by Neanderthals in Spain. They identified them as 65,000 years old. 20,000 years before humans reached Europe, Ben, the former Curator of Early Prehistory at the British Museum, has published and lectured widely on Prehistoric Europe. He researched and cowrote the first 40 programmes on the landmark BBC Radio 4 series 'A History of the World in 100 objects'. Tickets are £10 (refunded if you join TASW). In the coming weeks, we hope to install some raised beds so if anyone has spare compost or decent soil that they would be willing to let us have please contact us. We hope to have the plot ready for sowing this spring.

On Tuesday 18th February 2020 at 7.30 pm in Low Row Institute, Paul Clark will talk about the 'Swaledale Night Sky' which will feature beautiful time-lapse videos and images. Light pollution is threatening our precious dark skies and there is increasing evidence of the negative impact it has on our environment. 

15/11/2019 (40) Team called by DEFRA as part of the national flood response to North Lincolnshire. 8 Of our water technicians attended for 24 hours. The rest of the team remained in the area, as we always keep full 24/7 operational status even when part of the team are out of area.

Each month we'll highlight an item of our rescue equipment; this is how we spend your generous donations.

This month vehicles. As a team we run 2 110 Land Rovers & 1 Nissan Navara. We try to deploy 2 vehicles to every call out. All vehicles are marked as Ambulances & are fitted with blue lights / sirens. All drivers under take 'Blue light' driver training. The 2 Land Rovers can be converted 'in the field' to carry a stretcher & the Nissan provides specialist support equipment for flood & cave rescues. We continuously save for new vehicles as

one day we'll need to replace them & it's a huge capital expense for a



charity.

The Dales Neighbourhood Police Team will be running a 'BE SAFE BE SEEN' campaign during the winter months.

At this time of year it's vital for parents and children alike to start thinking about safety and visibility. Although the number of child pedestrians and cyclists killed or injured on our roads has fallen since last year, every child killed or injured is one too many. With this new campaign, we are aiming to build on the good work that has already been done in increasing road awareness amongst children.

On winter evenings it's easy to forget that car drivers find it much harder to see you when you're out and about. It's often dark and wet, so make sure you're highly visible when out and about. Don't forget to take your lights out with you when cycling.

The Highway Code states that, at night, cyclists must have white front and red rear lights. Bikes must also be fitted with a red rear reflector and amber pedal reflectors. Having white front reflectors and spoke reflectors will also help you to be seen. Flashing permitted. liahts are but we recommended you use a constantlyilluminated front light, particularly if you are riding in areas without street lighting.

If you're cycling in dark or dim conditions, you should:

• Ensure that you have front and rear bike lights with you (and take back up lights or spare batteries if possible);

• Check that all your lights and reflectors are clean and working before every trip;

• Wear light coloured clothing;

• Invest in some high-visibility clothing or reflective 'slap-wraps' to maximise visibility.

Any cyclists seen in dark clothing or without lights on their bike will be stopped by uniformed members of the Neighbourhood Police Team and offered safety advice about the importance of keeping themselves visible and high-vis cycling products to help keep them safe on the roads - e.g. flashing armbands, high-vis rucksack covers, neck scarves and bike lights.

Please take a moment to look at your or your child's bike and cycling kit. Think 'Be safe, be seen'.

WHO:

The Community First Responder (CFR) Scheme is a partnership between Yorkshire Ambulance Service (YAS) and volunteers living within OUR community. We provide life-saving treatment to residents and visitors in OUR area in the vital first minutes of an emergency until the ambulance clinicians arrive.

WHAT:

CFR's are trained by YAS (free of charge) in basic life support skills, cardio pulmonary resuscitation (CPR), the use of defibrillators and administration of oxygen.

<u>COULD I REALLY DO IT</u>?

CFRs come from all different walks of life and volunteer for many different reasons. Anyone who wants to help their community can become a CFR. No previous medical experience or training is necessary although you will need a caring attitude and be able to cope with potentially distressing situations. We currently have 7 volunteers utilising the two CFR kits stored in Reeth and Low Row. Everyone has varying amounts of time available to be "oncall" but we work on the philosophy of anything is better than nothing and no one is put under any pressure.

You need to: be aged 18 or older; hold a valid full UK driving licence for at least 12 months with no more than 3 penalty points; have access to a car; be prepared to undertake a Disclosure and Barring Service check; be prepared to undertake occupational health screening; be prepared to take a CFR course held in the local area.







Reeth Parish Council November

Flood matters

Work was ongoing to clear the Arkle Beck from Fremington Mill up to the parish boundary at Sleigill. Following requests from local landowners it was agreed to also clear from the mill down to the river, if sufficient funding was available, in order to prevent future problems as the width of the beck there had been narrowed. An application would be made to the organisers of the Scott Trial who had offered funding for this purpose. Information on grants from Bettys to fund tree planting would be forwarded to landowners as this might be a way of strengthening the banks in future. Coun David Jeffels attended the meeting on behalf of the York and North Yorkshire Flood Risk Partnership to discuss the causes of the July floods and how to prevent similar events in future. The group plan to hold a public meeting early in the New Year to hear from members of the local community who can contribute to understanding the situation prior to finalising a report for DEFRA and the Environment Agency.

Standing Orders - The clerk would distribute a set of proposed standing orders for consideration by councillors.

Village Green - After seeking advice on the legal ownership of the damaged tarmac outside the Copper Kettle the council would get quotes for repairing/ replacing the surface. They had been advised that the drain was not their responsibility.

Playground - Following ongoing problems with the zip wire and a number of other items needing attention it was

agreed to close the playground for maintenance over the winter while an ongoing programme of repairs was considered to avoid future problems.

Remembrance Services - A vote of thanks was given to the chair and District Councillor Good for organising the Remembrance parade and services, with members noting that it had been particularly encouraging to have a number of young people taking part in the events.

Christmas Events - The Christmas tree had been ordered and would be in place in good time before the village carols on December 22.

Phone boxes - Members agreed that because of the poor mobile phone coverage in the area they would object to the removal of public phones at Healaugh and Reeth. Coun Good would follow this up with RDC. Coun Peacock reported that the County Council would support parish councils who wished to keep their phone boxes.

School Hill - Overgrown bushes alongside the footpath to the school would be reported to Highways.

District Council - Coun Good reported that RDC were looking at green issues in the area and would be setting aside money for this. He would also pass on details of grants for community schemes to the clerk.

Street Lights - Coun Frankland pointed out that there was no street lighting in the new development at Overton Garth. Coun Good would follow this up.

Want to buy a stake in the Kings Head?

The current owner has offered to sell the pub to a community group on very preferential terms. This presents an opportunity, which may not come again, to secure the future of the Kings Head, Gunnerside.

With advice from The Plunkett Foundation, who supported local pubs including The George and Dragon in Hudswell and The Green Dragon in Exelby, we are in the process of creating a Community Benefit Society (CBS). Investors would buy shares in the CBS at £500 per share. Shareholders become members of the CBS and are entitled to one vote regardless of size of shareholding. Shares will also bear interest, giving a modest return on the investment. In the last few weeks we have received substantial promises to purchase shares but we are still short of our financial target. We have told the owner of our intention to buy the pub, but we can't make a formal offer until we have formed a company, issued a prospectus and raised enough cash from investors.

There is not always room in the article to provide all the information sources that I use. I stated in the article " I have marked all the floods that have affected Swaledale and Arkengarthdale". After the recent flood it seemed rude and churlish of me not to include Arkengarthdale . It is good not without reason that Arkengarthdale is sometimes referred to as the forgotten dale.

The floods of 1893 and 1937 have records indicatina that no Arkengarthdale was affected, and I refer you to the above for the reason why they were not included. As to R. Macdonalds statement " .. the amount of CO2 in the atmosphere has increased...and the physics that links this fact to storm intensity and frequency is very well known ". If this is true, can R.M explain how between 1890-1899 the Swale flooded 20 times, with a CO2 level of 294 ppm, yet between 2010-2019 the Swale flooded 3 times (2010, 2015, 2019) when the CO2 level

is now 411.39 ppm? Starman.
