MUKER PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 12 December 2019

Road Hump Ivelet - Cllr Metcalfe informed the meeting that he had not received any correspondence from Highways. Clerk to contact Highways.

Village Sign - West Stonesdale - Cllr Peacock had confirmed that £250 was available from NYCC, towards the cost of the est. £450 sign. The Parish Council agreed to provide the remaining £200. A representative from West Stonesdale should be involved regarding the positioning of the sign. Clerk to contact Highways and Cllr Peacock to arrange.

Water on Road - Crowtrees - Cllr Porter said that this was still an issue and with the recent cold weather causing ice, this is very dangerous. Also that there were no grit heaps on the Swaledale side of the pass, Clerk to contact Highways and Cllr Peacock.

Finance - An order to pay and a cheque had been raised, £90 for the refilling of the Grit Bin at Thwaite.

An order to pay and cheque was raised for £41.94 to Cardiac Science for the replacement Electronic Pads for the defibrillator at Keld.

Parish Precept - It was agreed that the Council request a precept of £2000 an increase of £100 to cover the ongoing cost of the replacement parts for defibrillators.

Water on the Road - Cllr Calvert raised an issue regarding water on the road in a number of places. 1. Shivery Gill, 2. The first bend after the T Junction at Tan Hill, Stainmoor road, 3. Level Hill - Clerk to contact Highways.

Articulated Vehicles - Cllr Calvert

again raised the issue of Articulated Vehicles using the B6270 when the A66 is closed. The road had been blocked on the 1st November with a large vehicle. Cllr Calvert suggested that there needs to be more signage further down the Dale and said that he understood that Cumbria County Council had erected signs advising not to use Satnavs on certain roads. Cllr Metcalfe stated that Usha Gap bridge had once again been hit and damaged by a vehicle. Clerk to contact Highways.

Buttertubs Pass - Cllr Metcalfe stated that the Buttertubs had not been gritted on the night of the 11 December and was unsure whether it was being gritted at present, N Turner, Clerk informed the meeting that it had been agreed with Highways at an Area Partnership meeting in September 2016 that the due to its altitude the Buttertubs Pass would be gritted, whenever there was a risk of ice. irrespective of whether adjacent, lower roads needed arittina regardless of its Priority rating. Clerk to contact Highways, Cllr Peacock and Cllr Metcalfe also Cllr McMullon. raised the issue of a number of cats eyes missing on the Buttertubs Pass. Clerk to contact Highways.

Richmondshire D.C - correspondence had been received from RDC regarding how it communicates with local Councils through e-mails and the Area Partnership Meetings. The Parish Council were in agreement that existing communications were sufficient.

YDNPA - Planning Applications for Scarr House and Aygill Farm have been approved Conditionally. Parish Briefing November - Clerk to e-mail the briefing to Councillors.

Dark Skies Update - A letter had been received explaining the YDNP Dark Skies Reserve Status application and requesting the Parish Councils support. A discussion took place regarding the merits of the Status. Councillors were concerned regarding the section on new replacement lighting and possibility of this becoming an issue for homeowners and businesses regarding planning. Whilst they welcomed the status in principal and its promotion of the area, they had reservations regarding the possibility of further tiers of planning restrictions. Clerk to write to YDNP.

Correspondence/AOB-The Chairman read out the Dales Police Report for November. Cllr Reynoldson raised the issue of a street light not working in Thwaite, Clerk to contact RDC, Cllr Metcalfe raised the issue of a window which had been replaced at a house in Muker. Since the previous meeting he had now seen the window and was concerned that it was not in keeping with the area and that YDNP Planning should be made aware. He questioned whether there would be conditions placed on the building with it having previously been a Chapel. Clerk to contact Planning. Cllr Reynoldson asked whether there had been any news on the plans to remove the phone box at Thwaite. Cllr Whitehead said that the issue was ongoing, but that objections had been raised by RDC and the Parish Council. The Council would like to place on record their thanks to Mr Ken Guy for lighting the fire and setting out the chairs for the Councils' meetings over the last year.





Friend of the Museum Alan Gibson has sent us a picture of an advertisement for the Show printed in the Yorkshire Gazette. 31 November 1841, that includes the list of prizes. not just for 'the working miner who has brought up the greatest number of children without parochial assistance'. but also for 'the female domestic servant, under thirty years of age, who had lived longest in the same service'. Who won the first premiums for these? For the former it was Mary, the widow of John Bell of Castle Bolton, and for the latter Isabella Hammond, servant to Mr Thomas Nelson of 'Merrick'. Mary was awarded £3, which in 1841 was equivalent to 15 days pay for skilled tradesman, a quite substantial win, while Isabella received £2. THE ARTS SOCIETY WENSLEYDALE

Oriental ceramics expert, Hanne Sutcliffe, examines the "Ancient Art of Afghanistan" at Tennants Garden Rooms, Leyburn on 5^{th} February 2020 from 2-3pm.

This lecture considers the magnificent gold, silver, ivory, bronze and glass objects excavated in the of Bactria kingdom (ancient Afghanistan) that illustrate a unique fusion of Greek, Persian and Indian motifs. Greek and Macedonian refugees fleeing the depredations of Alexander the Great settled there in c300 BC

The exquisite archaeological finds range from Bronze Age gold and silver to 1st Century AD carved ivory, along with 20,000 gold artefacts found in six tombs in Tillya Tepe, Northern Afghanistan.

This rich heritage was believed to have been lost after thirty years of war and anarchy. However, thanks to the courage of Afghan museum staff who hid the treasure, often risking their lives to do so, it survived and remerged intact in 2002. It has subsequently toured the world: a magnificent cultural symbol of hope for the future of Afghanistan.





February Food Focus

Did you know we throw away the equivalent of 1 in every 5 bags of food shopping? That's a lot of wasted money, food, packaging and farming!

This adds up to 7 million tonnes a year across the UK, and LoveFoodHateWaste.com tells us that reducing this could save £70 a month for the average family of four - over £800 a year.

Some food 'culprits' include milk (mostly because we don't use it in time), potatoes (170 per household each year), 860,000 apples and 20 million slices of bread every single day, What items do you tend to waste? Should you buy less, or get creative with ways to use them?

A tip for all that bread is to slice and freeze it, then defrost when you need it. It can be toasted from frozen. For stale bread, grate it (or use a food processor) to make breadcrumbs (which you can freeze), and use these for a crunchy topping on baked fruit, veg, or mac'n'cheese - try adding some herbs, grated cheese and drizzle with vegetable oil or dot with butter.

Did you try Veganuary? Eating less meat reduces the environmental impact of the food system. On average, we feed 10 calories (as grass or other crops) to animals so they can convert it into just 1 calorie of human-edible food. If this is pasture in upland areas like Swaledale, that's a good use of land that would be difficult to farm for

human-edible crops - but problems arise from using prime growing land for animal feed, or even worse, cutting down rainforests to grow soy and other grains that we then feed to animals.

Making meat a treat, and choosing local, pasture-fed (and ideally organic) meat from happy animals helps reduce your footprint, and support biodiversity and local businesses.

Incredible Edible Swaledale is part of a global movement to involve people in planting, looking after and harvesting beautiful fresh fruit and veg that's grown right on our doorsteps, using public or otherwise unused spaces. Our project in Reeth is starting to take shape, and we are planning some raised beds and a herb garden. Could you help out with spare compost or decent soil? 

Dales Police Report January 2020

The following incidents of note have occurred in the Dales area -

Between Tuesday 10th and Thursday 12th December 2019 the ATM located on Hawes Market Place was damaged with a drill. We believe this was an attempt to steal cash from within. If you see suspicious activity around an ATM please call 999 at the time with descriptions of suspects and any vehicle involved.

Overnight 15th December 2019 a '16' plate red Suzuki quad was stolen from a secure outbuilding on a farm at Thwaite Bridge between Appersett and Garsdale Head.

Geocaching in Swaledale

Did someone mention cash? Well yes, although that's 'cache' as in stash rather than 'cash' as in attic. But before you lose interest, here's the key takeaway. If you want to get your kids into the great outdoors but can't get them away from their mobile phones, aeocachina may be the Geocaching is a twenty-first century form of orienteering. It involves using your mobile phone plus detective work to find hidden goodies stored away in waterproof boxes concealed all over the Dales (and indeed, all over the world). It costs nothing to take part.

There's a dozen geocaches within two miles of Reeth and fifty or so upstream from Reeth in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. Nine of these were created bν Dr Karen Griffiths. Interpretation Officer for Yorkshire Dales National Park. These are good caches as the National Park ensures are they well maintained. Karen explained why the National Park got into geocaching: 'We don't like to litter the countryside with information panels so when I came across the idea of using the sport of geocaching as a way of discretely providing information about a place, hidden in a cache for people to find, it really ticked all the boxes, especially as kids love it'.

So where do mobile phones come in? All geocaches are listed on the website www.geocaching.com. A listing contains a brief description of each cache and crucially, the precise coordinates of where to find it. Because most modern phones have built in support for GPS, with the help of a free mapping app

such as ViewRanger (other mapping apps are available) the coordinates become a homing beacon to which a child equipped with their phone will be drawn like a moth to a harmless candle.

You may need to prepare your charges for what they will find, because there won't be a pot of gold. Instead, there'll be a plastic box containing a log book where you can record your success in finding the cache and read the comments previous high achievers (young folk can also log their comments online). These can be guite touching and make you feel part of a truly international community. There will also be small gifts and tokens - you can take one - but the rule is that if you do, you must add one too. What goes around ...

When the geocaching web site first launched in September 2000, there were just 75 geocaches listed. Now there are more than three million worldwide. There's one at the South Pole, and one at the Eiffel Tower. There's one in a Volkswagen Beetle and another at the bottom of a lake. However, if you want to start with something easier and closer to home, there's one near Surrender Bridge which is No, you'll just have to find it yourself. **RM**

Council membership

Flood works

A number of matters were discussed arising from correspondence from residents and from previous meetings.

It was noted that Richmond Motor Club had offered funding towards repairing flood damage.

A tree assessment had been carried out. A section of footpath near Blackburn Hall had been repaired by the ranger and quotes would be obtained for repairs to the wall opposite Mergill.

Planning matters

It was noted that planning permission had been granted for Shoemaker Barn.

Streetlights

Two lights had been repaired and one was in hand as the post had rotted.

Parish hall

Funding had been granted for redecoration work and this would be

carried out in the Spring.

National Park

Consultation was currently underway on the new Local Plan. The council response would be compiled at the next meeting but everyone was also encouraged to comment on it individually.

Dark Skies Reserve

The YDNPA was asking for support from parish councils for their application for Dark Skies reserve status. This was forthcoming with the stipulation that it should not adversely affect planning applications.

Next meeting

The next meeting will be held at 7.15pm on Monday, March 2, in the parish hall.





The team is made up of highly trained volunteers available 24/7 in any weather, any time. On average we respond to 50 to 60 calls each year. There were four incidents this month.

Incidents Nov 11th to Jan 10th

25/12/2019: Incident 46: Called out on Christmas Day morning to assist the ambulance service with a collapsed dog walker in the Leyburn area, despite the best efforts of all on scene the incident proved fatal. Our thoughts are with the family & friends of the casualty.

22/12/2019: Team search dog and handler called last night for an out of area search. Stood down en-route

16/12/2019: Team leaders called along with Upper Wharfedale Fell Rescue Association (UWFRA) following reports of 4 vehicles stuck in snow on a moorland track. Fortunately a local farmer was able to recover the vehicles to safety.

07/12/2019: Incident 45: Team called to rescue a walker who had fallen 50ft in a wooded ravine, treated on scene by the team, Air Ambulance & Yorkshire Ambulance crews. Evacuated by the team to the Aircraft.

05/12/2019: Incident 44: Team called by North Yorkshire Police to rescue an injured walker on Fremington Edge, above Reeth. Treated on scene

by the team & evacuated to the waiting Ambulance.

27/11/2019: Incident 43: While the team where hosting a joint training event with Ambulance staff from Yorkshire Ambulance Service, we were called to rescue an injured walker in Walden valley. Stood down as the first team members arrived as the Ambulance crew manged to deal with the injury.

Each month we'll highlight an item of our rescue equipment; this is how we spend your generous donations. However this month we thought you might like the only free bit of rescue equipment' we have, 'the team!' See the photo on the opposite page.

We have around 35 full team members on call 24 hours a day 7 days a week. All have 'normal' jobs & regularly give up time at short notice for rescues. We also have another 5 supporters, these people help run the team in the background doing essential admin jobs such as, treasurer, secretary etc, without them we simply could not operate.

On top of this every Thursday evening our Search Dog handlers have a dedicated team of 'Dogs Bodies' who willingly lie out on the hills waiting for our 2 search dogs to find them, dedication in deed!

Last but not least. We have all the wives, husbands, partners, children & employers, who frequently find themselves dining alone or explaining to friends why their other half has 'run off in a hurry' & trying to get the kids to understand why Mum / Dad isn't around on Christmas day or the employer trying to make a customer understand(continued on next page)


