

Each month we'll highlight an item of our rescue equipment; this is how we spend your generous donations. This month we thought you might like to see our 2 search dogs, we have Ollie & Cassie. Both are air scenting Border This means they follow air scent not ground scent (like a Police tracking dog). Over a large search area dogs are about 20 times faster than a human searcher, they also never grumble about the weather!! It takes a massive commitment to train a search dog & we have a great network of supporters who 'hide out' for the dogs to find.

PARISH COUNCIL March 2020

Clark Stones: It was with great sadness that the passing of Clark Stones, former Chair of the Parish Council for over 40 years, was noted. His contribution to the dale had been considerable and he would be greatly missed by all. School building: Notification received from RDC of the six-month moratorium period for the school building was noted. The moratorium period would end on 12 June 2020. The School Building Community Group would be asked to confirm whether or not they intended to continue with their project for a community building in order that the Parish Council could withdraw the request for the moratorium if appropriate

Affordable housing: Cllrs Stubbs and Watkins had attended a meeting of The Upper Dales Community Land Trust in January 2020. The UDCLT were working with RDC and Broadacres Housing Association to assess the feasibility of converting the school building into four affordable homes subject to a site and structural survey. A survey to assess local need for affordable housing in the dale was also required and this was underway.

Flooding matters:

An invitation to attend Richmond Motor Club's presentation evening at The Buck Hotel in March to accept a donation towards the flood relief work was accepted. Flood-related work on the church roadway was due to start mid-April, weather permitting.

YDNPA had acknowledged the urgent need for reinstating the foot bridges across Arkle Beck, but had not as yet provided a schedule for the work. The ranger would be informed of the need for a bridge at Arkle Town for the annual duck race in May, and options would be explored for funding towards reinstating the foot bridges quickly.

Extensions to temporary closure orders for YDNPA footpaths in Arkengarthdale were noted.

Flood Report. Councillors had attended a feedback meeting with the report writers of the Section 19 Flood Report required by the government. The report had concluded that no further flood-relief government funding would be available for the July floods because the nature of the flooding was such that it was unlikely to happen again, and that the report team would work with the riparian owners of the land along Arkle Beck to minimise the risk of flooding to homes in the future.

A final report would be produced for the Two Ridings Foundation to account for the £10,000 community flood relief funds that had been managed by the Parish Council on the Charity's behalf.

NYCC Highways: Road closures for repairs to the Stang Lane and to the road entrance to Eskeleth were noted. Highways had been made aware of a range of road and drainage issues in the dale following the flooding in February and were in the process of attending to these. They would be informed of recent further damage to the retaining wall on the river bank above the recent repairs at Whaw.

Planning matters:

- (i) Planning application R/01/163 at Swallow Holm, Arkengarthdale, had been approved conditionally.
- (ii) There were no objections to a planning consultation for an amended description for application R/01/137A at Arkle Barn, Langthwaite to include 'short term holiday let'. Cllr Stubbs declared an interest in this application and took no part in the discussion.
- (iii) There were no objections to application R/01/164/OH at Kitley Cottage, Whaw, from Northern PowerGrid (North East) to replace poles and conductors.

Date of next meeting: All Parish Council meetings are postponed until further notice.
