

### Message from the Swaledale Museum in Reeth

The Museum is now closed for the season. We will re-open as usual in the Spring.

Thanks to all of you who visited us. We have had some very encouraging and supportive messages written in our Visitors' Book which are deeply appreciat-John and Jennifer noted 'Wonderful Museum! So much interesting information, displayed with such care. I wish the towns I have lived in -& the village - had such a display! Mr. Hodgkinson thought everything 'Beautifully labelled, clear & understandable, I wish more museums would do this', while Sue and Geoff discovered 'A treasure trove of history' and Peter and Julia found it 'Superb! Stories that deserve to be told

While the season has been quiet for us, it has enabled us to catch-up with our cataloguing backlog. We have also received some wonderful donations, including material from Arkengarthdale School, which joins a deposit made by Fraser relating Arkengarthdale Chapel. Amongst the donation of books made last year made by John Sharp was a copy of Plantagenet Harrison's monumental 'The History of Richmondshire' which he began researching in 1830. Sadly the volume came to us in a rather battered state. the spine broken and suffering from red rot. Thanks to Will Swales it is now at a book binders in York, and the donor is covering half the £250 we will need to restore it. If there is anyone

else who would like to contribute funds to this project we would love to hear from you. Will Swales will also be giving a lecture on the notorious Plantagenet Harrison as part of next year's events programme when we hope to have the restored volume back in the Museum.

There is much to look forward to for next year. We hope to be working with the universities of Leeds and Huddersfield on a science and art based project, focusing on individual objects in the Museum. Pannal School have already booked in for their Grinton Smelt Mill exploration and hands-on sessions in the Museum. Stephen Eastmead has taken a large batch of photographs to add to our Online Image Archive over the winter. We hope the fruits of research based on our resources relating to house history, family history, education in the dale and local recipes will also be harvested, all showing what a useful and valuable resource your local Museum is. In relation to this I would particularly like to make acknowledgment of the indefatigable help of Tracy Little - who so generously shares her local knowledge and contacts. I am trying to find a local history problem that she can't possibly solve, however I don't think there is one!

Thanks to Eleanor from Castle Farm we have learnt a little more about the photograph we featured in last month's Gazette. The photograph was taken by Postgate's of Reeth, and features a 'wedding'. The central figure is the bride, played by Elsie Pedley. Elsie was born in 1908 and went on to become a rather famous local figure - she was Church organist at St Andrew's Grinton

for 65 years, sub-Postmistress at Grinton for 32 years, as well as being Clerk to Grinton Parish Council for 40 years and to Reeth Parish Council for 30 years. She was awarded the British Empire Medal in 1987. She died in 1993 and lies in Grinton Churchyard. We have a sampler stitched by her, aged 9, in the Museum, as well as the pair of shoes she wore to play the church organ! Eleanor notes on the back of her version of the photograph that the date is 'before 1930'. She also thinks that the WI met in the building that is now the Museum, perhaps in the headmaster's office, as they met 'upstairs'. The upper gallery in the building was only created in the early 1970s when it was converted into a Museum by Donald and Erica Law. 'Alice' played the role of the bridegroom, but what was her surname? Can anyone tell us any more? Does anyone else have a copy of this Postgate's postcard?

This month's photograph is a new acquisition donated to our archive by Barbara Buckingham. Can you tell us what is happening, when, where and why? This time we know, so we will reveal all in the next issue of the Gazette.

### **Mountain & Cave Rescue Team**

Incidents - Sep 9th to Oct 9th

On average we respond to between 50 to 60 calls each year. 8 Incidents this edition.

The teams focus during the Covid-19 outbreak has been to maintain an operational Mountain & Cave Rescue Service, we've held meetings on-line & limited equipment checks to reduced members of the team. Fortunately we are well stocked with the essential PPE to protect the team when deployed.

25/09/2020: Incident 38: Called to rescue an injured walker near Round Howe, treated by the team ambulance crew then evacuated by the team

23/09/2020: Incident 37: called to assist Teesdale MRT with a guys raise funds to purchase a new missing person search.

22/09/2020: Incident 36: Team search dog & handlers called to assist with an out of area search for a missing person.

22/09/2020: Incident 35: Called to injured walker rescue near Crakehall, treated by the team & ambulance crew then evacuated by the team.

22/09/2020: Incident 34: Called to rescue an injured walker near the waterfalls at Aysgarth, treated by the team & ambulance crew then evacuated by the team

21/09/2020: Incident 33: Called to rescue a dog walker who had been injured by a herd of cows, sadly the casualty didn't survive their injuries. Evacuated from the fell by the team.

20/09/2020: Incident 32: Called to rescue a walker above Muker, who had been injured from a fall. Treated by the team & ambulance crews the evacuated back to the village. Helimed attended but wasn't needed.

13/09/2020: Incident 31: Called to rescue a couple of walkers from steep ground near the River Ure.



# Reeth, Fremington & Healaugh Parish Council September 21

Kathryn Beardmore, Director of Park Services at YDNPA, spoke to the council about the Dark Skies Reserve Status application, which is one of the national park's management plan objectives. They have recorded enough support across the national park to meet the 80% requirement for the application, but would like to add Reeth, Fremington and Healaugh PC to the list of supporters.

Although none of the members were opposed to the objectives of the plan, after discussion it was resolved not to support the application due to concerns that it could lead to future restrictions affecting residents.

### Playground

The playground had been reopened following the RDC inspection and erection of Covid-19 signage. The clerk would order the new equipment required and reschedule the ROSPA annual inspection which had been put on hold during the closure. Recommendations would be sought for equipment to replace the zip wire.

### Arkle Beck

The ragwort previously discussed had been removed. The clerk would follow up concerns of a resident regarding wall repairs and maintenance and Coun Good would speak to the local ranger.

### **Benches**

A location near the quoits pitch had been agreed on for a new memorial bench. The council could not employ anyone to repair the bench at Fremington damaged in the flood as it was not on their land but had no objections to the work being carried out.

### Remembrance Day

Very little advice had been published so far regarding Remembrance ceremonies. The clerk would publicise the two services planned at the war memorial and would contact Reeth Brass Band.

#### Local Plan

Wensleydale parishes had prepared a joint response to the YDNPA Local Plan to cover issues which they felt were not sufficiently covered by the brief response form. Coun Peacock would forward a copy of this to the councillors for consideration with a view to presenting a united front on the issues.

### Village green

The clerk would check with the Land Registry on the status of the cobbles near the Buck. Councillors discussed the conditions regarding the use of skips - when they are placed on the village green or public land, permission should be sought in advance from the parish council, they should be surrounded by cones and lights and a contribution should be put in the honesty boxes.

### Bonfire Night

With regret the Fireworks Committee had decided to cancel the November 5th fireworks display and bonfire and the New Year fireworks due to Covid-19 health and safety issues. The parish council and the committee would take joint steps to prevent any possible fly tipping on the green.

### District Council

Coun Good reported that RDC had started a consultation re the Council Tax Reduction Scheme, whereby people on a low income receive a lower council tax bill. Continued work on the consultation re the proposed removal of telephone boxes. The recycling area is being used but is very untidy so he had asked for the backlog to be cleared.

### County Council

Coun Peacock had contacted Highways about the state of the road between Grinton and Richmond and was awaiting a response. She also reported that Covid-19 cases had increased in the area so NYCC had agreed that all of the support hubs are to be retained to assist communities through the coming months. The support provided by the Hudson House Hub has been extended until March.


Her findings from her family tree.





# ARKENGARTHDALE PARISH COUNCIL September 2020

#### Flooding matters:

An application had been submitted to The Two Ridings Community Foundation for additional flood resilience work in the dale; Notice of further extensions to Temporary Closure Orders to flood-damaged footpaths in the dale had been received from YDNPA. The installation of the new footbridge at Arkle Town was almost complete.

Repairs to church road: Two letters of thanks had been received from the members of the congregation of St Mary's Church and from the Church Warden respectively, for organising the repairs to the road surface by the Church gate.

Visitor parking: Complaints had been received from several residents about inconsiderate visitor parking in Langthwaite. The number of new visitors had been larger than usual this summer, owing to the Coronavirus travel restrictions, but general complaints could not be addressed unless a clear, specific issue was identified;

Access road on High Green: Complaints had been received about the access road on High Green being regularly blocked by cars outside one of the properties. A letter would be sent to the new owners of the property to ask them to make alternative parking arrangements as access was required at all times.

Consultation on removal of payphone at Langthwaite: A request from RDC to respond to a BT consultation on the removal of the payphone at

Langthwaite was considered. It was unanimously agreed to object to the removal of the payphone for the same reasons explained in the previous consultation last year.

Remembrance Day wreath: A wreath would be purchased from the local RBL representative.

Highways: Work at Whaw bridge was continuing without problems and further clearance work was still to be done under the bridge. The retaining wall needed additional attention. Eskeleth bridge also required attention and underneath needed clearing out. There was still a hole in the wall of the bridge on Stang Lane; Two NYCC notifications of road closures on the Richmond and Leyburn roads for repair work to bridges at Cogden Beck and Cogden South (Grinton to Reeth) were noted; Potholes on Arkengarthdale Road between Langthwaite and the car park and also in Arkle Town would be reported to Highways; The issue of salt storage was considered as the Environment Agency had concerns about salt run-off and a permanent container was required if the gritting service was to continue.

Affordable Housing: The sale of the school building had been agreed and was now underway with a private developer. UDCLT's bid for an affordable housing project had not been accepted. It was noted that this decision had been conducted legally, and that UD-CLT had questioned the morality of the sale.

Planning matters: Planning decision: Home Farm, Arkengarthdale R/01/120A: approved conditionally. Planning application: R/01/132C/OH at

Whaw Village, Arkengarthdale from Northern PowerGrid (North East) Plc for replacement poles and conductors. No objections.

Use of Booze-only bins by visitors: A complaint from a resident about visitors placing rubbish in the Booze residents' bins in Langthwaite car park had been investigated and councillors had come to the conclusion that all the bins. including the recycling bins, required emptying more often. Signage would be considered to make it clear that the Booze bins were not for public use. A mobile temporary CCTV camera would be requested from RDC to monitor the bins for one month. It was noted that holiday cottage businesses should be provided with orange bags for household waste.

Grass-cutting: It was noted that the Parish Council paid to cut the grass verges although these were the responsibility of Highways, and this had contributed to the rise in grass cutting costs since 2018.

BT Fibre Broadband: It was noted that a survey had recently been undertaken in the dale by BT assessing the installation of superfast broadband.

Delivery service volunteers: Councillors expressed their thanks to all the volunteers who had provided a much appreciated daily delivery service for the residents of Arkengarthdale during lockdown and acknowledged the time and effort involved by all, and in particular Richard Smith, Neil Sivyer and Susan Dray.

Date of next meeting: Monday 2 November 2020.

#### **Post Office News**

Firstly, thank you very much to all those of our customers who are abiding by the measures we have put in place to make the shop and Post Office as Covid -safe an environment as possible:

#### **HANDS**

Sanitise your hands on entering the shop

#### FACE

Wear a face covering

#### SPACE

Only two customers on the premises at a time (This applies to the shop area and post office counter as one)

We know some shops have one-way systems in place, but we do not think that would be appropriate in our shop and we rely on the common sense of our customers to keep a suitable distance from others. It is extremely helpful to us if you check at the door to see if it is OK to come in. Staff have an understanding of the tasks people are carrying out and during busy times we may allow a third customer into the shop if social distances can be maintained.

Christmas is just around the corner and the team at Reeth Post Office have given a lot of thought to how we can make the Christmas experience as stress free as possible for both staff and customers during this busy period. We want all our customers to feel comfortable and not rushed so they can get all their shopping done when it's their 'turn' in the shop. We want you to feel you have done all your jobs without being rushed. To help us achieve this, more than ever this year consider posting early.

For customers who feel vulnerable or would just prefer to be at the Post Office counter on their own, we are offering an appointment system at the PO counter between 8.00am and 9.00pm from November 2nd to December 21st. You can phone to make an appointment (884201) or book one beforehand when you are at the PO counter. Please note though that we can only process items for posting during this time and that payment will have to be made using a card. All other Post Office counter services do not come online until 9.00am.

As usual at busy times, both counters will be open and we have prided ourselves in the past that with two of us processing mail, there have not been many occasions when people have had to queue with Christmas post, so let's hope we can keep up that tradition. But please do remember that with only two people in the premises at a time it is inevitable that there will be some queueing outside, so please do remember to dress appropriately for the colder weather when waiting outside the shop.

As well as sending off your Christmas post, you can collect items from us. Royal Mail have a service called Local Collect where you can have post delivered to the Post Office for free, to be collected at your convenience within 18 days. So if ordering anything online, check to see if the retailer offers Local Collect (delivery to a PO branch) and designate Reeth Post Office as your collection point. We look after the item until you can collect it and there is no charge to pick it up. It saves you having to wait in for a parcel to arrive.

Remember also that the banking services available through the Post Office counter have been extended in recent years and there are many banking activities you can carry out without having to visit a bank. Most banks allow you to pay in cash and cheques and take out cash at the PO. Please call in and check what is available with your bank if you are not sure.

In order to minimise queueing time, you are welcome to phone in or email (cluderay@reethpostoffice.co.uk) provisions order for us to box up for you to collect at your convenience. You are still welcome to look around the shop and pick up any items you have forgotten, but if the bulk of your shopping is ready for you on arrival, it will cut down on the amount of time you need to spend in the shop if that makes you feel safer. You can put your order in on any day, for collection on Monday, Wednesday or Friday. Because of deliveries arriving on Tuesdays and Thursdays, we cannot guarantee we will have the time to pick orders on those two days.

Finally, and once again, thank you for your co-operation.





#### **Sustainable Swaledale**

#### Environmental schemes

Tees-Swale Naturally Connected project: £5.7 million of National Lottery funding has been provided for a 5 year project to help restore some of Britain's "most important natural land-scapes in the north of England". The area covers 829km of Upper Teesdale, Upper Swaledale and Arkengarthdale.

The project aims to bring together farmers, landowners, communities and volunteers to boost diversity, mitigate climate change and enhance people's wellbeing. Objectives include restoration of both hay meadows and peatland; looking after the river; and creation of wetland and woodland

#### Flowers and trees

The Swale Trail is an example of an existing wildlife corridor. Resplendent in the summer with wild flowers, there is still plenty to see in November. Increasingly rare juniper stands can be found where the trail meets the road at Harkerside and the sheltered sections of lanes from Whita Bridge to Gunnerside may still have sloes on the blackthorn if you want to have a go at making sloe gin or sloe cordial.

Wildflower patches help to create wildlife corridors and the Reeth, Fremington and Healaugh Parish Council have agreed to leave the cutting of some small areas of grass until later in summer to allow the wildflowers to bloom and set seed.

Increasing woodland cover offers a natural climate solution. A Friends of the Earth report Missing in action: natural climate solutions in England's National Parks claim that there is more woodland cover in London than the Yorkshire Dales NP. The YDNPA is increasing woodland coverage faster than other national parks.

#### Planning

Sustainable Swaledale Group have sent in their response to the Government's Planning White Paper: Planning for the Future. While recognising that the current planning system is not perfect, it is felt that the proposals would reduce local representation without improving housing provision.

The Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority have also submitted their response. A Richmondshire Times article quotes the YDNPA as saying that "many of the plans would result in local communities having much less say, and at the wrong time, on the types and volume of development around them".

### GRINTON & ELLERTON ABBEY PARISH COUNCIL

The minutes of Grinton and Ellerton Abbey Parish Council held on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September 2020 at 7.15pm via Microsoft Teams Video Link

#### 1. Apologies:

#### 2. Minutes of Previous Meetings:

Cllr Peacock reported that a further £1,000 would be available from her Localities budget that could be used for the repairs to the parking areas. Also the RDC Area Partnership fund would soon be open for applications with awards of up to £1,000.

Wall near Mirgill House: The wall is still to be repaired. Cllr Sunter will contact Trevor Atkinson again to ascertain when the work will be done.

Trees, Swale Hall Lane: The Clerk had reported this on the Parish Portal but the case has been closed with a report regarding a street light. The Clerk will report the overgrown trees again.

Parking on Moor Road: All the information received from residents has been referred to the YDNPA Planning Officer as this is not something that

the Parish Council can deal with and residents should contact YDNPA directly.

#### 5. Correspondence:

Richmondshire District Council

BT Telephone Box Removal Consultation: The Clerk had circulated information received regarding the on-line access to the consultation documents. The Council will send a letter objecting to the removal of the box in Grinton stating that the mobile coverage in the area is not reliable and as the village defibrillator is situated next to the box it is essential for it to remain. Re-Organisation of Local Government: Information has been received regarding on-line discussion forums available to give further information regarding the model of two unitary authorities to replace the current system.

NYCC Re-Organisation of Local Government: Information regarding the proposed single unitary authority has been received. Following a discussion it was proposed that the Parish Council would back the NYCC bid, this was agreed unanimously. Cllr Peacock advised that any concerns regarding representation on the National Park Authority should be put in writing to NYCC. O'Reilly Provision of Payroll service: The Clerk has been notified that O'Reillys will no longer be able to provide payroll services to the Parish Council. It was agreed that the Clerk could seek provision from an alternative source.

Poppy Wreath: It was agreed unanimously to order a wreath for Remembrance Sunday.


