

#### Message from the Swaledale Museum in Reeth

Thanks to all of you who have visited this year, helping bring the Museum back to life. We are now closed to the public but of course continue working on the collection and the building. It has been wonderful to see old friends and acquire new ones this season.

As a result of a bumper number of enquiries we have wonderful range of mysteries and questions to tackle. One of the more intriguing questions relates to a pair of dogs made from plaited card. Hand-sized, and found in the loft of one of the houses in CB Yard. Arkengarthdale. They seem to be guarding the premises. Has anyone seen anything similar? Are they representative of an old local custom? We have seen steel pins hidden under window and above door frames from a house in Healaugh, to keep the evil eye at bay. We have seen shoes and clogs put up chimneys for the same reason. However we have never seen anything like these Thank you to the lady who thought up a rather delightful dogs. Do get in touch if you can help us solve this mystery.

Another enquiry relates to the Police from the collection (see next page) House in Reeth, the 'new' one on the

road out to Richmond. A visitor has a photograph of her grandfather Police Sergeant Enoch Wilson who was the 'local bobby' here in the late 1930s, taken outside the house. She wonders if anyone remembers him. The photograph includes a small boy, dressed up, helmet and all, by his side, he had just won a fancy dress competition that had been held in the village. Is someone out there who was that small boy? The enquirer's father, Leslie Wilson and his older sisters Bessie and Eve also went to school in the village. Does anyone remember them?



wonderful birthday present, booking a special guided tour of the Museum, with the opportunity to handle objects

not normally on display. Perhaps we can tempt others to do the same? We also enjoyed the company of members of the Alderson Family History Society in early September who took a tour of the historic highlights of Reeth Green with us, after having visited the Museum, As a result of their visit one of the members is tracking down the owner of the little pair of hob nail boots we have on display. They were left on our doorstep a few years ago. All we know about the wearer is that he was called Alfie Nicholls and he died of diphtheria when young. When his mother's effects were being sorted out after her death, the poignant boots were left with us. We hope to reveal more soon.

Now here is another challenge. One of stalwart supporters. Barbara Buckingham suggested that we should have information on display about the Young Farmers' Clubs in the Dale, as their contribution to local life was so important. All we have connected with them is a fine red poster for an Arkengarthdale Young Farmers' Club 'Debate followed by a Supper and Dance' with music by The Ramblers. There is no year, but it looks, by the design and graphics, to be c.1930s-40s. Can you help us?

# The Station Master A wartime themed immersive dining experience Richmond 950

"Local musician creates new wartime musical drama"

As 'lockdown projects' go, writing a play is probably one of the lesser chosen options, but local artist and musician John Hunter was thrilled to be asked by Charlotte Porter, who runs the CJ Dancing School at Richmond Station, to pen an original musical drama to be performed as part of the 'Richmond 950' celebrations. "Charlotte knew that Jane and I had many years of experience with 1940s weekends - both performing and exhibiting my period aviation art" John said "This was the opportunity to distil that experience into a meaningful drama to encapsulate that period in Richmond".

With a small cast, some dancing of course and the four acts to be performed between meal courses, John and wife Jane began to create a drama that could portray the epic sweep of the war and its impact on 'ordinary' folk in Richmond. "The obvious idea was to locate the drama at the *actual* station in which Charlotte works, and base it on semi-fictitious characters who did, or could have worked in and around the station during the 1940s.

The whole plot revolves around the Station Master himself, portrayed by local thesp. Ken Haigh, and his family and friends. The story takes in the outbreak of war and local lads being recruited as soldiers, the arrival of evacuees, a rather more sombre third

act dealing with 'remembrance' and then a final section offering a lively VE celebration."

John has arranged all of the period music for the singers to perform, and also parts for his 'Good Vibes' trio, who, with the expert help of local clarinettist Adam Bradley and Jane on Vibes, will be playing the part of the 'Benny Goodman' trio -accompanying all of the songs, and also providing background music during the meal courses.

Several top local performers make up the cast including Gracie Will and Natasha Wood who starred in the award winning 'Sister Act' at the Georgian Theatre in 2019 (MD'd by John), and Sophie Montgomery, star of 'My Fair Lady' in 2018 at the Georgian, and who has recently performed with the Scottish National Opera in Glasgow.

John has previously composed several full scale stage musicals including 'The Bishop's Wife' - based on the 1947 film starring Cary Grant, and has performed around the globe on the piano. "Having had a father serve in the RAF during the war, I've always been surrounded by stories from that era, and have since enjoyed working with numerous '40's performers around the country. The music from that era is simply so memorable and a joy to perform in so many ways - we're particularly hoping that the audience enjoys the live 'trio' during the play!"

John and Jane have recently travelled to Wolverhampton for this year's 'Project Propeller' event – an annual 'reunion' for actual WWII flying veterans who are flown in, and home again afterwards. John entertains the troops with help from Jane, who additionally mans John's art stall! (see next page)



The tales these veterans tell are extraordinary, and whilst numbers naturally dwindle year by year, we had over 100 flying in last time - it's a fantastic day for everyone."

'The Station Master' will be performed on Friday 12<sup>th</sup> and Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> November.

The report State of the World's Trees was published by the Botanic Gardens Conservation International (BGCI) in September 2021. The report estimated that at least 30% of the 60,000 known tree species worldwide face extinction. #### **Swaledale Night Sky**

The night sky changes with the seasons as we orbit the sun and the dark side glasses. of the earth faces out to different parts of our universe.

A useful coincidence is that the lengthening of the nights in autumn and the seasonal changing of the night sky 'cancel' each other out. So, when it is from south-west to north-east. fully dark about 2 hours after sunset, the night sky looks pretty much the same from August through to the end of the year.

On a clear moonless evening this autumn, wrap up warm, grab a comfy chair, find a dark location away from lights with a good view to the south, sit back and explore the grandeur of our galaxy - the Milky Way. Give your eyes

time to adapt to the dark (at least 15 mins), use a dim red light for illumination and wear any distance/driving

The chart shows the night sky to the south a couple of hours after sunset this autumn.

The Milky Way can be seen as a hazy band of light arcing up over the sky becomes more west to east as night and months progress.

The chart is taken from Stellarium planetarium software, free to download from stellarium.org

For the next few years the two biggest planets in our solar system can be seen to the east of the Milky Way.

# From Bingen to Britten and beyond.

On Wednesday 1st September the extended Swaledale Festival staged a concert in St Andrew's Church, Grinton. And what a joy it was, not only for the audience to enjoy a live performance, but for the performers to experience a live audience once again! William Towers, countertenor, and Philippa Mo, violin, entranced us for well over 75 minutes with an eclectic programme which showcased the best of a glorious countertenor voice, and the virtuosic skill of a first rate violinist.

We were treated to an extra delight at the beginning, a piece by the modern composer Geoffrey Burgon, but very much in the style of Hildegard of Bingen, two of whose pieces followed. The soaring, pure tones of Towers' voice with his clear enunciation accompanied by Mo's skilful playing transported us back nearly a thousand years, and the serene surroundings of St Andrew's added to the peace and contemplation with which we became infused.

The rich tones of Towers' voice were well suited to the emotional sensitivity of the Four Shakespeare songs, and the violin joining in with a modern arrangement of 'Sigh no more, Ladies', was so very beautiful.

More folk songs followed: including from Gustav Holst, and the Russian composer Lena Langer, some unaccompanied, others with modern arrangements. I found the arrangements interesting and very clever. At the beginning of the piece my brain said, 'Oh I'm not sure I like this' as dissonances came and went, but by the middle of the piece I was hooked, and by the end I wanted it to go on forever. The inter-

mingling melodies of voice and violin, and in some cases a second violin or a guitar played by Towers, evoked strong emotions, and the beauty of his voice almost reduced me to tears, especially in 'O Waley, Waley'.

I must draw attention to the mesmeric playing of Philippa Mo. She performed some passages from a Fantasia by Telemann: witty, elegant and in the Italian style. The audience was so stunned by her playing, that we just sat there and didn't even applaud. The solo violin pieces she played were quite breath-taking and her technical ability cannot be faulted. She included a short but glorious composition by the Australian composer Wendy Hiscocks, 'Caprice for solo violin', who is known to love Yorkshire and whose soaring melody was that skylark I had witnessed on Grinton Moor, singing his heart out.

The programme concluded with a Benjamin Britten arrangement of the Corpus Christi Carol, sung by Towers and with his own accompaniment of electric guitar complimenting Mo's violin. An odd combination one might think, but it was skilfully done and added to the richness of the piece.

We were very lucky to receive an encore: a glorious piece of Handel for which Towers' voice is so well suited and with another superb accompaniment by Mo. Would that the programme could have continued for another hour. We all departed from St Andrew's in a mood of peace and contentment, just so happy to have experienced such wonderful, live music.

An update on the Swing Bridge path.

Many people, local and visiting, continue to ask about the footpath to the Swing Bridge and when it might be re-opened.

As this is by far the most popular path in the area I can understand the sorrow some folk feel at the route having been lost to the river. I can't say when the path will be available again but I am confident we will get it back in some form or another soon.

We commissioned a study from a company called Envireau Water (whose Hydrogeologist & Director lives in Reeth and has watched the river changing for years!) which gave us options as to what might be done to restore the Public Right of Way. However, in short, the conclusion was that any attempt to restore or protect the river bank would be prohibitively expensive, unlikely to halt erosion and could cause further and worsening erosion downstream of the site. The river Swale at this location is widely regarded as unique in its behaviour; being very dynamic and changing at an incredible rate. I'm sure many local people have their own memories of the river to confirm this.

At the current time we are looking to divert a short section of the original footpath to a new route slightly higher up the hill side where a change in underlying soils should be resistant to the river's forces. This will require some legal work, consultation and to negoti-

ate the changes with the land owner. This process is never simple or quick but it is underway. Fortunately the alternative route is available (not always the case) and it isn't a lot further so we will be asking all walkers to use that in the meantime.

Elsewhere things are finally returning to something like normal for the Yorkshire Dales National Park Rangers in Swaledale. I have made a full-time return to Hudson House and our Access Ranger (Roger) has been busy revving up our trusty gang of volunteers who do so much work in the area; their absence was beginning to show. We're still lagging behind in some respects but we continue to do what we can to keep footpaths clear and safe. Strimming back growth is a major task each year and this season it seems it has us beat in places.

You may have met or seen a few more folk in YDNPA uniform around the Two Dales as staff and trainees recruited to deliver the Tees-Swale: Naturally Connected project are now establishing themselves with farmers and landowners, youth groups and residents across the area.



#### No Time To Die Preview.

Even before Spectre had released all the way back in 2015 there were heavy rumours Daniel Craig was done with James Bond. In an interview with Timeout whilst promoting the film he stated infamously "I'd rather... slash my wrists" when asked if he could imagine another outing.

The quote was taken widely out of context and promoted all across social media, tabloids stating he was done. In actuality the rest of the quote was more forgiving and it explained, "No. Not at the moment. Not at all. I'm over it at the moment. We're done. All I want to do now is move on".

Whilst the international fame, acclaim and bank balance are surely warmly received, the role isn't an easy ride. Shoots can last months to a year, stunts (of which Daniel does a fair few) are dangerous and physically demanding.

He's lost teeth, his fingertip, needed surgery on his shoulder, damaged his ankle, sprained his knee, the list goes on. Once Craig was confirmed for his final entry, the production saw many challenges.

First director Denia Villeneuve was coined to take the coveted chair, Sam Mendes (director of Skyfall and Spectre) had declined, and Christopher Nolan had also abstained. The script was being written and in December 2017, Villeneuve dropped out to lead Dune. (Also released in October).

Danny Boyle, (28 Days Later, Slumdog Millionaire) made a pitch and was set to start in December 2018 but due to script disputes he dropped out by August. Cary Joji Fukunaga (Beasts of A Nation) was drafted in with short

notice, but widespread expectation.

The script was scrapped and a new one commissioned, and Daniel Craig himself requested Phoebe Waller-Bridge (Fleabag) to polish over the script before production began in April 2019 and filming began just a month before. With a release date originally of November 2019, it was tight and after Boyle left in December 2018, pushed to April 2020.


And then the pandemic hit. The world changed overnight, countries shut down, cinemas were left empty, just mere darkened barren auditoriums with no opening date in sight as the world watched COVID-19 unleash across the globe.

A date was set for November 2020 when things began to look up, but come October 2020 as the UK was about to enter another lockdown the movie moved once again to April 2<sup>nd</sup> 2021 which also as a result saw Cineworld shut down completely until May 2021.

In January the film changed dates once again to October 8<sup>th</sup> 2021 for the US and September 30<sup>th</sup> for the UK, parts of Asia and Europe. The film has recently been green lit for a Chinese release in October, in what is a hugely growing market for box office and last year was a bigger market than Hollywood & the US itself.

Along with Daniel Craig, returning cast members include The film takes place 5 years after the previous film with James Bond no longer a 007 or a member of his majesties secret service. However, it isn't long before he's drawn back into the world he's tried hard to escape and save the world one more time. For those of us within the cinema industry (see next page)
