TLC @ Gunnerside meet on the 4th Thursday each month, and on 27th April we welcome a speaker from the Whiteknights Blood Bikes

During normal working hours, the NHS and Charitable Health Organisations use their own transportation systems to move Blood, Plasma, Tissue Samples, Documentation and other vital supplies between Hospitals, Hospices and Supply Centres.

Out of hours these systems may be limited, and the hospitals' reliance can fall upon private hire taxi companies, commercial couriers and, in exceptional circumstances, hospitals may have used emergency services such as the Police or Ambulance services.

The Whiteknights Blood Bikes volunteers provide an out of hours service which saves a substantial amount of money that can then be passed on to provide more appropriate frontline patient care. We estimate that for each £1 received in donations to the Whiteknights, the NHS will save at least £5.

Guests are welcome to the meeting at a cost of £2 - but this includes coffee/tea and cake!! Full membership of TLC is £5.00 pa.

Swaledale Festival shines a light on local talent

As well as bringing top notch national and international artists to Dales stages, this year's Swaledale Festival celebrates the remarkable talent and traditions that reside in the area. The line-up includes 21 events by local musicians, poets, puppeteers, choirs and visual artists.

Rebecca Lundberg is a first class trombonist and conductor from Leyburn. As a member of the famous

and prize-winning Fairey Band, she will take part in three concerts in the Festival fortnight. The first is a familyfriendly screening of ground-breaking animation Wallace and Gromit: The Wrong Trousers. 2023 marks 30th the film's

anniversary, and the Fairey Band has teamed up with its creators, Aardman, to celebrate the milestone with a screening accompanied by a specially adapted live brass band score. This is ideal half term entertainment for families, and a great way to introduce young people to the thrill of live music. The film will show at 13:30 on Sunday 28 May at The Garden Rooms at

Tennants in Wensleydale - the home of Wallace's favourite cheese. Afterwards, some of the band members will be on hand in the foyer to demonstrate and talk about their instruments.

At 19:30 on the same day, WFEL Fairey Band will perform a full evening concert at Tennants with Rebecca Lundberg soloing on trombone. The programme will include brass-band favourites such as film themes, marches and hymns, and some exciting new arrangements.

Rebecca is also the conductor of **Leyburn Band**. Under her baton, Lower Wensleydale's award-winning brass band will perform a concert on 30 May at St. Andrew's Church in Aysgarth. Expect an eclectic and rousing programme featuring repertoire from their forthcoming CD.



The Festival spotlights more Yorkshire talent with Lempen Puppet Theatre's Cardboard Carnival in Richmond's beautiful Georgian Theatre Royal on 31 May. Liz and Daniel Lempen are the tour-de-force behind Skipton Puppet Festival and creators of original shows that tour everywhere from tiny Scottish islands to international

festivals. In this exquisite performance, a series of ingeniously created animals will unfurl to Camille Saint-Saëns' evocative *Carnival of the Animals* music. The show is a magical celebration of the power of puppetry that will delight all ages.

In advance of the Festival, Lempen will run a series of free puppetry workshops for local children who will each assemble a puppet from everyday materials. The students will then share their creations in a unique Puppet Talent Show on 28 May - to the audience gathered for the Wallace and Gromit screening. The workshops will take place at Tennants on Sunday 14 and Sunday 21 May, and are suitable for children from years 5 to 8. The world-renowned lute virtuoso Jacob Heringman, who lives in Richmond, will perform a special recital with the outstanding mezzo-soprano Clare Wilkinson on 7 June in the delightful Holy Trinity Church in Low Row, Swaledale. You'll hear compositions by John Dowland, William Byrd, Thomas Morley and Stephen Wilkinson (Clare's father), as well as the world premiere of a new song by Joshua Brown.

David Francis, from Preston under Scar, plays the harpsichord with Manchester Baroque. Since its launch in 2019, this superb group has built a reputation for vibrant performances of historical music on period instruments. They will play solos, duets, sonatas and concertos by Handel, Tessarini and

Corelli on 2 June at St. Mary's Church in Richmond.

The excellent **Jervaulx Singers**, a locally based professional group comprising eight of the country's finest choral singers, will perform a delicious programme of French music by Fauré, Debussy, Ravel, Honneger and Poulenc in St. Andrews, Aysgarth on 5 June.

Other local highlights include **Swale Singers** performing on 1 June in St. Andrew's Church, Aysgarth; **Reeth Brass Band** on 7 June in St. Mary's



Church, Arkengarthdale, and Muker Silver Band performing on 9 June in Muker Public Hall.

There are also poetry walks and workshops in the landscape with Dales poet Mary-Jane Holmes, a talk on the Northern Dales night skies by local astronomer Paul Clark, late-night moon-gazing on Reeth Green with the Reeth Informal Astronomy Group, and exhibitions by talented local artists including the exceptional painter from Gunnerside, Rachel Antill.



Leave Peat Where it Belongs

#PeatFreeApril

Did you know that 94% of our UK peatlands are in a decimated state, an environmental catastrophe resulting from more than 70 years of inappropriate farming policy and ongoing commercial extraction for the amateur and professional horticulture sector?

The encouraging news is that peat for the amateur gardening sector will be banned in England from 2024 with several retailers already selling good quality, peat free composts. Yet concerningly, there is no date when peat use in the professional sector will be banned. The RHS has pledged that all its gardens, show displays and plant sales will be peat free by 2025 (its bagged compost already is), yet your consumer pressure is needed to encourage other show gardens and garden centres to do the right thing and follow suit.

Top tips for going peat free this April:

- Visit: www.wildlifetrusts.org/actions/ how-go-peat-free for a list of which retailers are - and aren't - peat free!
- Check labels on potted plants, pellets, plugs and composts and only buy those that state they are peat free. 'Environmentally friendly' does not mean peat free.
- Stand up for peatlands: If they

- don't stock what you want in a peat free option ask for it and explain why.
- Experiment with ways of improving your soils naturally and organically.

- Share the #PeatFreeApril campaign message with friends and family.



If Trees Could Talk... 3 - The Grip of Iron (7,000 to 2,000 years ago)

After our visit seven thousand years ago, the clearance of the wildwood continued: slowly at first and mostly on the higher ground between the dales, but then as the human population increased and hunters were replaced by herders, the pace picked up, although the pattern of mixed deciduous wildwood dominated by oak in the dales with hazel above and between them held firm.



Muker: Wych Elm

A step-change took place when an event known as the 'Elm Decline' wiped out much of the elm, probably caused by disease (not unlike the modern Dutch one) combined with clearance (mostly for livestock but also for cereals) targeting soil preferred by elm. Widespread across Europe, the

Elm Decline reached Swaledale around 4,800 years ago.

With the Bronze Age came new farming practices and two waves of clearance with a brief regeneration of woodland in between. The clearance would again have been largely on the high ground where perhaps half or more of the woodland had been cleared for grazing by the end of the Bronze Age, with the dale sides and floodplain remaining more wooded.

The mix of trees also changed. After elm, lime also disappeared and during the period of regeneration birch recolonised marginal areas previously occupied by oak and hazel. Within the dales the bedrock often changes abruptly from limestone to sandstone to shale, and back to limestone. Being less acid, limestone supports richer, more varied cover, so that the treescape was a patchwork of species according to the rock, slope and drainage beneath.

The stark distinction we see today between upland (above about 300m) and lowland wasn't present at this time. The change in tree cover with altitude was gradual, with crops as well as grazing land being found at all levels above the floodplain.



Booze: Hedgerow Landscape

We find ourselves on Grinton Moor near the Youth Hostel facing northwest, two thousand years ago, just before Romans arrive. Behind us, on the high ground above Cogden Mill, some ground is turning to peat, but to our right, and to our left all the way across what is now Harkerside Moor, is a system of vast fields enclosed by walls and hedgerows. We can see the same pattern across the river around Marrick and above Fremington Edge, and again between Reeth and Healaugh where, almost up to the top of Calver Hill and down the other side to Arkle Beck, there are huge fields and small settlements within.

By the Iron Age, the uplands around Grinton, Reeth and Low Row had been largely cleared of trees, with mid and lower level land given over to fields, and the floodplain harbouring trees where farming was impractical. Further up dale, the dales sides were more wooded, but the imminent arrival of Roman ways increased land pressure and continued to open up the landscape to a point where (as pollen analysis reveals) the amount of woodland in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale would be much as it is today. The same can't be said of tree species. Larch, sycamore and horse chestnut, often 'feature' landscape, trees today's nowhere to be seen. And native oak. once common, has now essentially disappeared: fully consumed by Roman lifestyles, none remained locally from which to regenerate.



Fundraising for Richmond & Catterick Group Riding for Disabled Group

The Richmond & Catterick Group Riding for the Disabled (RDA) is looking for more funds to help it to continue providing lessons for its riders with disabilities. As a wholly volunteer-run charity, the Group relies entirely on funds and donations to support its work and it has just set up a Just Giving site https://justgiving.com/rc-rda to raise much-needed money.

This charity makes a worthwhile contribution to the community. There are numerous proven and life-changing benefits realised by bringing people with disabilities together with horses and ponies; confidence, relationship-building, enjoyment, social interaction, and physical and mental improvement.

Sessions currently run twice a week; consecutive lessons two on Wednesdays for children with disabilities from Mowbray school and private riders in term-time and two lessons on Saturdays throughout the year for children with special needs and adults with varying disabilities - all private riders. These are held at Catterick Saddle Club using their ponies and horses as well as our own two and the Saddle Club's arena facilities.

But it costs the Group a minimum of £8000 to £10000 a year to run these lessons as well as covering vet fees and insurance costs for our two horses, entry fees for competitions and just a couple of hacking days out for our riders each year, and the cost of

replacement of essential safety equipment and tack.

Testifying to the outstanding work of this RDA Group, chairman, David Summers said: "The improvement I have witnessed from so many of our riders is truly amazing, with some even competing in regional and national championships. And for those that do not achieve these heights, I know that they enjoy the sessions and gain the therapeutic benefits that riding brings.

"Every pound you give helps put a smile on our riders' faces. Every pound you can spare will make a huge difference to this worthwhile charity and its work so that all riders can enjoy the therapy and fun of horses.

Calling all Telescopes

We have some amazing dark skies in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale and many of us have been tempted to purchase an astronomical telescope. At that point one of three things tends to happen.

Some of us hesitate because we feel we don't know enough about it. If that is you, there is an opportunity this spring to find out a bit more to help you decide whether to get involved in this fascinating hobby.

Some of us take the plunge but, since astronomical telescopes aren't as easy to use as the adverts make out, the instrument ends up in the garage, cupboard or loft. If that is you, and you'd like some advice on how to get started again, or, if you would prefer to see your telescope rehomed, there is an opportunity this spring to get some advice and have your telescope evaluated.

Still others purchase a telescope and—with some persistence – learn how to use it. If that is you, there is an opportunity to join others in a collective moon and star watch on Reeth green during this year's Swaledale Festival.

Altogether there are four events coming up, run by a friendly group of amateur astronomers from the Reeth Informal Astronomy Group.

The first is from 7.30pm on Thursday 13th April at Fremington Village Hall (the old Sunday School building halfway between Reeth bridge and the Dales Bike Centre) when we will be talking about choosing and using a telescope and also sharing our latest night sky photography and the latest

Astronomy news.

The second is from 10.00am on the morning of Saturday 15^{th} April when we will be providing a telescope evaluation & advice service, also at Fremington Village Hall, after which, if you want to go ahead and sell or donate the instrument, we will take a picture and list it on our website and in the Gazette. (Regrettably we don't have space to take it off your hands ourselves).

Finally, if you want to have a go with your telescope, we will be putting telescopes up on Reeth green for people to look at the moon and stars on Saturday 27th May and Tuesday 30th May, starting at 10.00pm assuming it's clear. If you'd like to join us for either of these two dates please get in

touch (we need to know who is bringing a telescope for planning purposes). All these events are free - though there will be a bucket for donations with any



proceeds after costs going to local charities.

Readers interested in the night sky may also like to know this year's Swaledale Festival includes an illustrated talk on the Northern Dales Night Skies by one of our members, Paul Clark, also on May 27th, from 16.00 to 17.00 in Reeth Memorial Hall. So why not book a seat and come to Reeth for the talk and a leisurely supper and then, if it is clear, join us on the green?



North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue Service

Do you know where you are ? There have been a number of incidents recently, that have been reported in the wrong location. If you're not 100% sure read the second half of this article for a simple solution!

Reeth Station

We've recently had some jobs that needed joint working with multiple agencies.

On our weekly drill night, Reeth were heading down to Richmond station to use their tower. En route we were tasked to a road traffic collision near Skeeby. As the first pump on scene the vehicle was stabilised and the occupants assessed for injuries. Meanwhile the officer in charge was liaising with the police to close the road and with oncoming appliances and the ambulance service to advise them on the situation.



We received a call out to assist Richmond appliance who were on the scene of a wildfire on MOD land. We arrived at the same time as Colburn and immediately extinguished fire that had spread into some trees and was threatening to jump the road and into a forest. Leyburn and Northallerton were also called out. There were nearly 30 firefighters battling the blaze. Comms with firefighters, MOD and police were of paramount importance for everyone's safety.

What 3 Words?

/// WHAT3WORDS

We're sure you will have heard of this

have heard of this before but if you haven't or you haven't got round to downloading it then aive this a quick read.

What 3 words is a free application you can download onto your smartphone. It brings up a map and is explained on their website as "We have divided the world into 3m squares and given each square a unique combination of three words.

what3words addresses are easy to say and share, and as accurate as GPS coordinates ". For example, the what 3 words address for Reeth station is

Getting the correct location for an incident is critical. Precious time can be lost if an incorrect address is given, but this can also be made difficult if the incident is located on moorland with no nearby named roads or landmarks. If you can give the what 3 words location to our fire control staff they can accurately plot the incident on our mapping system, removing that extra time lost due to searching for the incident. All emergency services are familiar with this app so its well worth having.

Scan the QR code on the right with your smartphone camera to download the W3W app for free.





In an emergency DIAL 999 ask for the POLICE then Mountain Rescue / Cave Rescue / Mine Rescue/ Flood Rescue

By the time you read this, the changeover process will be well underway. As far as our search and rescue operations go nothing changes - we're still the same team of dedicated volunteers available 24/7 365 days of the year. However, we have been given a new Charity Commission Registered number 1201870, which means we'll be changing all our collecting tins and reissuing them with labels displaying the new number. We think we know where most of them are and are in the process of swapping them over. Richmondshire District Council: the end of an era

Most people will be aware that on 31 March Richmondshire District Council ceases to exist. The new North Yorkshire unitary Council starts on 1 Richmondshire Council was April. established in the last major organisation of Local Government in 1974, when it replaced Reeth Rural District Council and many more similar small Councils. This mean all major Council services from dustbin emptying to education and social services will be delivered by the same Council. Council services will still be available from Mercury House in Richmond and on Fridays from Hudson House in Reeth. Parish Council will continue and may be offered more responsibilities by the new North Yorkshire Council.

I step down as a local Councillor on 31st March. It has been a privilege to serve as the Richmondshire Councillor for Lower Swaledale & Arkengarthdale for the past four years. I thank the six Parish Councils, local residents and businesses for their help and support. There have been challenges with the flooding in 2019, followed by the Covid 19 pandemic. The people of the Two Dales are very resilient and have worked their way through both.

There are currently three District Councillors and one County Councillor serving the Upper Dales Division, which includes Hawes, Upper Wensleydale, all Swaledale and Arkengarthdale. From 1st April there will be only one North Yorkshire Councillor serving the whole area. The current County Councillor Yvonne Peacock was elected last May as

the Councillor for the Upper Dales Division of North Yorkshire Council. Yvonne is a hard-working Councillor and I wish her well in her new role. Her email address is cllr.Yvonne.Peacock@northyorks.gov.uk
