### **Memorial Concert**

### Shelagh Thomlinson and Duncan Bythell, founders of the Swale Singers

Gunnerside was the birthplace of the Swale Singers, and it is in Gunnerside Chapel where friends will meet on October 7<sup>th</sup> to celebrate the lives of the two people who were responsible for nurturing the choir since its beginnings, in 1989.

They both lived in Gunnerside; Duncan was the local organist, and Shelagh invited him, along with a few friends, to come for a glass of wine and a few songs round her grand piano. This went so well that it became a regular occasion, and more people joined the group. As they grew they moved from Shelagh's drawing room to hold practices at Low Row URC, and gradually West singers from Stonesdale to Scorton and beyond joined them. They gave a few modest concerts in local chapels, and then in 1995 they were invited to perform in the Swaledale Festival, and have done ever since

Meanwhile Duncan continued as conductor of Muker Silver Band; also he played the organ at regular services in Low Row and Gunnerside; a very busy and dedicated musician.

Shelagh died in 2021, at the age of 90, still singing in the choir, and Duncan died last year after a period of illness. They are much missed, by both choir and band. The motto of the choir was 'It must be FUN', and I'm sure that the memorial concert will be fun too, with

songs that they both loved, and band items that were Duncan's favourites. All are welcome at the event, which takes place at 7.30pm on Saturday 7<sup>th</sup> October in Gunnerside Chapel.

# Muker Parish Council Minutes of Parish Council Meeting Held June 2023

Present: Cllr Metcalfe, Cllr Reynoldson, Cllr Rukin, Cllr Calvert chair presiding.

Clerk: Mr Michael Cleminson.

A total of 7 members of the public, all residents of Muker, attended the meeting with regard to planning application R/06/149B to convert a garage and store into a 2-bedroom holiday let.

Apologies: Cllr Porter.

### Matters Arising:

Cllr Calvert is now confirmed as the Chair of the Parish Council. Cllr Rukin also confirmed as Councillor for the Parish Council.

Because of the attendance of seven members of the public the Chair Cllr Calvert decided to bring forward the item **Planning Ref. R/06/149b** so that any members of the public could leave if they desired to on its conclusion.

Each member of the public made concerning the application points raising many pertinent and relevant points reflecting their concerns for this planning application. All comments did not support the application. Councillors again studied the plans as members of the public commented. At the end of comments and discussion Cllr Metcalf proposed that the Parish Council does not support the application, and this was seconded by Councillor Rukin. Cllrs Reynoldson and Calvert also agreed the proposal, a unanimous decision. Clerk to notify YDNPA of the decision of the Parish

Council and to prepare a report for submission outlining all of the concerns raised. On conclusion of this item, 5 of the members of the public left the meeting.

6<sup>th</sup> June 2024 - **Beacon** to commemorate the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the D-Day Landings. It has also been decided nationally to move the National Fish and Chips Day to this date. The councillors agreed that if anyone in the Parish wished to erect a beacon, it would have their support. The Clerk to advertise this.

### **Highways**:

A response has now been received from Highways concerning the bridges at Usha Gap & Scarr House. A program of works to repair parapets and retaining walls is being prepared. It is intended to carry out works to both bridges at the same time. As both bridges are listed structures, approval will be required from YDNP authority before works can commence. Highways will also install more robust temporary barriers at Scarr House bridge to replace existing. It is anticipated that the new barriers will still allow traffic and pedestrians to cross the bridge safely without the necessity of traffic lights. The Clerk had also reported to Openreach that the cabling had become detached from the bridge and was under strain, this is recorded under reference NEOANP57. The precise location using 'What Three Words' is 'deleting.mimed.scouting.'

Cllr Reynoldson reported the ridiculous situation regarding the **road closure at Thwaite**. It was considered that this closure was unnecessary, as the works involved less than one third width of the road, and that from 3pm Tuesday

27<sup>th</sup> June, the road was opened. However, on Wednesday morning at 9.30am the road was closed again, reopened at 10.30am by Highways, then closed again by Highways at 11.00am. As a consequence, because the road was clear and passable, members of the public moved the cones to one side, in order to pass through, which has remained the situation ever since. On Wednesday and Thursday 28th and 29<sup>th</sup> June 2023, no works were carried out on the site. The works were completed on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> June with no Demonstrating closure! that the closure was unnecessary, the hour long 35-mile detour over the moors was Clir Peacock considered extreme reported that Highways were having significant problems recently as much of the work is contracted out and they are not always responsible for the closures, and will take this example to any future meetings Cllr Peacock has with Highways.

Cllr Rukin reported that the **cattle grids** at Tan Hill and West Stonesdale were blocked with debris, thus allowing livestock to traverse them. Cllr Metcalfe reported that both grids at Ivelet were still blocked. Clerk to report to Highways.



# Melbecks Parish Council **July 2023**

Dog waste bin: The dog waste bin at Gunnerside has been removed by Highways, North Yorkshire Council, as it was irreparably damaged, probably having been hit by a vehicle. A new bin can be purchased at a cost of £270. unanimously agreed to Councillors purchase a new bin, however NYC Councillor Peacock will also make enguiries regarding this.

Highways The pothole at Hill Top, near Surrender Bridge has been reported again to Highways by the Clerk. Overgrown vegetation: The Clerk was asked to request from Highways that overgrown trees and bushes are cut back again

Trees Swaledale and in Arkengarthdale Conservation Area: Oak Tree Barn, Low Row. The council received notification to remove a sycamore, crown thin an oak, and reduce 2 yew trees, located at Oak Tree Barn, Low Row. YDNPA has no objection to the work taking place and has recommended that a replacement tree of native species is planted within the first planting season after felling.

# UK installs record number of heat pumps and solar panels

The green energy industry standards body, MCS, has reported that on average, more than 17,000 households have installed **solar panels** each month since the start of 2023 with the number of homes installing heat pumps reaching 3,000 a month for the first time. Battery installations also increased month on month with more than 1,000 batteries installed in homes and businesses across the UK since the start of 2023.

Small-scale renewable enerav installations in homes and businesses now have a total capacity of 4 gigawatts (GW), greater than the nuclear power plant being built at Hinkley Point and almost double the capacity of Europe's biggest gas power plant at Pembroke. Numbers are however, still way below UK government targets of reaching 70GW of solar capacity by 2035 and installing 600,000 heat pumps a year by 2028. Source: Guardian article

CPRE (The Campaign for Rural England) is campaigning for an **increase in the use of solar panels**. Research by UCL Energy Institute (<u>https://tinyurl.com/</u><u>mkxpwb7x</u>), commissioned by CPRE shows that at least 60% of the solar energy needed for the UK can be delivered through installations on new builds, commercial buildings and car parks.

Increasing the use of roof top solar panels would

- Cut carbon emissions and tackle the climate emergency



When located by the Police helicopter it was apparent that we'd be required to rescue the walker to the ambulance. Another quick job. **Incident 31: 02/09/23:** Called by the Police to locate a couple of lost mountain bikers. The fog had closed in and they'd ended up off route. A SARLOC was sent (this allows the phone GPS to appear on our mapping) pinpointed them not too far from a couple of team members. A quick drive and walk located them safe and well and they where quickly on their way.



**Incident 30: 29/08/24** Called by the Police to assist the Fire service with some of our specialist equipment to help with the extraction of a casualty from an urban location. Not our usual job, but always happy to help.

Incident 29: 19/08/23: Called by the Ambulance service to rescue an injured

walker following a slip on the very wet footpaths we currently have. Treated on scene by the team and then by the community first responder. Finally evacuated by stretcher to the road ambulance. Thanks to the Aske Estate for access.

**Incident 28**: 10/08/23: Called by the Police to search for a missing person on the Addlebrough Hill area. A search by the police, police drone and helicopter as well as our search dogs and team members resulted in the missing person still missing. A special mention for the help provided by George and the Dragon Aysgarth.




