Canons don't go bang

Military cannons do, but not ecclesiastical Canons (note the subtle difference in spelling just to avoid confusion). And it was as a Canon that Caroline Hewlett, our very own Vicar of Swaledale with Arkengarthdale, was installed in Ripon Cathedral by Bishop Nick Baines on Sunday 17 September.

Caroline was one of a group of seven being made Honorary Canons of the Diocese of Leeds at the splendid installation service, part of Choral Evensong in the Cathedral. Two were Area Bishops, including our own new Bishop of Ripon, Anna Eltringham. And one was a Capitular Canon (don't ask. Well, if you insist, a Capitular Canon is a lay member of the Cathedral Chapter. Hope that's all clear now).

The honour of becoming a Canon (as opposed to being canonised, which is rather different) is aiven in recognition of outstanding service and contribution to the church. S٥ Caroline was chosen because of her outstanding ministry in the parish of Swaledale with Arkengarthdale for 17 vears, her wider work across the diocese and beyond in developing and enhancing rural ministry, and her training and encouragement of curates in the parish.

The role of Canon has some specific responsibilities and duties. Caroline becomes a member of the College of Canons, an advisory body to the Cathedral, which meets three times a year and she will be asked to preach and preside at midweek Communion services at the Cathedral. She will, of course, continue working as our vicar in exactly the same way. Her full title is

now the Reverend Canon Caroline Hewlett.



Each Canon has their own designated stall in the Cathedral where they sit for services. As the pic shows, Caroline's stall is named after St Hilda, the founder and first abbess of the monastery at Whitby in the 7th century.



At the time of writing scaffolding is being erected and the roof renovation works for the Low Row Institute are about to commence! This is an exciting time for us all on the Committee and great news for our community! Completion of the roof will mark the

end of the Phase 1 works, which have included new external doors and windows, LED lighting upgrades and modern insulation in our forthcoming newly renovated roof!

Use of the Institute is sky rocketing, which is great for our community and the future of this Low Row community asset. Craft Fairs, Willow weaving, Christmas Wreath making, film nights etc, etc, are all making appearances in the





PINKtober

October saw Reeth swathed in pink bunting and a host of events raising awareness and funds for Cancer Research UK, all the brainchild of and driven by Reeth resident June Ashton.

June has been raising funds for Cancer Research UK for years in memory of her daughter Helen Ashton who lost her life at 13. June and her family started the Helen Ashton Appeal as Helen didn't want cancer to happen to any other family. Helen was posthumously Cancer awarded Research Young Volunteer of the Year in 2003 along with her younger sisters. Her legacy continues.

This year with the support of her local community, June turned Reeth pink with local businesses and craft groups supporting her to make it happen, highlighting the importance of Cancer Research UK's life-saving research. In particular PINKtober raised funds for CRUK's Breast Cancer Research as well as raising awareness of the importance of spotting the signs of breast cancer and spotting them early.

June said "One in two of us will get cancer in our lifetime. But all of us can support the research that will beat it. I am absolutely delighted with the response from this local community to my idea of PINKtober and it was wonderful to see us all coming together to make a difference.

The charity's fundraising spokesperson for the Dales, Jan Leafe said: "We are incredibly grateful to June and her supporters for their time and energy. In particular helping to raise awareness of the work, progress and aims of Cancer Research UK, both locally and nationally.

We know that Early Diagnosis saves lives. When breast cancer is spotted at an early stage, treatment is more likely to be successful. Events such as PINKtober help us to get the message across - if you do spot something unusual, take charge and speak to your GP'.

Sustainable Swaledale

New eco-labels for household goods New water efficiency labels will be introduced by 2025 for toilets, urinals, sinks, showers, dishwashers and washing machines to help consumers reduce their water and energy usage. The labels will mirror the A-F energy labelling used already.

This is part of a plan to respond to increasing pressure on water resources. The latest regional water resource management plans state that as a nation we need to reduce our demand for water. More at: <u>https://</u> <u>tinyurl.com/nxsb6ver</u>

One Acre Meadow

The project to support the creation of new meadow and wild flower patches has been kick started with a talk by the Yorkshire Dales Millennium Trust Haytime Officer, Catherine Mercer, on how to create a meadow. Over 25 sites have been pledged varying in size from $2m^2$ to 2.5 acres taking us closer to a total of 2 acres. 30 kg of seed has been distributed and it is hoped that these plots will support pollinators and provide nature highways between existing meadows.

Sourcing local tree seed

Sustainable Swaledale members have been collecting **local tree seeds** for germination and ultimately planting out in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale in a couple of years. We are grateful to the Yorkshire Dales Millenium Trust and local landowners for their support for this project which aims to preserve the genetic diversity of locally rare trees.

State of Nature Report 2023

This annual biodiversity report shows that 41% of UK species have declined since 1970s. The report uses wildlife data from over 60 conservation organisations. Of the 10,008 species assessed, 16% (1-in-6) are now at risk of extinction with over half of flowering plants having declined in their range since 1970. Factors such as climate change, pollution and intensive farming are all putting pressure on wildlife. Lots of press coverage and commentary from environmental organisations who additionally express concerns over reports that the government is planning to push back on yet another green policy requiring biodiversity net-gain from construction activities. Yorkshire Dales Nature Recovery Plan Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority (YDNPA) has published its recovery new nature plan for enhancing nature across the Dales including our two. There is a general shift away from 'priority species' in favour of landscape scale biodiversity There are interesting sections on grazing, wood pasture and creating shade over upland watercourses.

The YDNPA in a Richmondshire Today article emphasises that such changes can only be achieved with more funding for environmental land management schemes.



A Service of Remembering

All are invited, and welcome to this service at Holy Trinity Low Row on Sunday 5th November at 11am, where we will remember those that we love, but no longer see.

Autumn is traditionally a time when Christians explore the big questions about life and death. Watching the leaves fall and the nights draw in is an opportunity for all ages to think about love and loss and remember in special ways.

The Church has ways of remembering those we love who have died. This happens at the start of November, at All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day. And a week later at Remembrance Sunday, we remember those who died in wars, and pray for peace.

At All Saints' Day (November 1st), the Church remember those Christians who have died, who we don't know personally. A "saint" is someone whose life shows us how to follow Jesus.

On All Souls' Day (November 2nd), we remember all those who we know that have died.

There are good ways to remember those we no longer see, for example, you could light a candle on important days and say a prayer. "Loving God, thank you for______ and help us to remember them well."

Aysgarth Falls National Park Visitor Centre turns 50

Staff at Aysgarth Falls National Park Visitor Centre are remembering 50 years of helping people to discover the special qualities of the Yorkshire

Dales. In 1973, disused railway buildings near the famous waterfalls became North

the famous waterfalls became North Riding County Council's first National Park information centre.

Today the site is still a magnet for visitors, with two Information Advisers and meet and greet volunteers on hand seven days a week during the summer, seeing an average of around 600 people a day.

To mark the anniversary, a display of photographs, memories and diary entries has been put together. A diary entry for 10 September 1984, for instance, reads: "Lady who got stuck in a stile in Wensleydale called in to thank us for the prompt action taken."

Aysgarth Falls National Park Visitor Centre grew out of the work of the second person to be employed by North Riding County Council as a 'National Park Warden', Norman Crossley. Bombarded with questions from visitors, he devised walks and wrote out the routes, setting up a card table in the car park at Aysgarth Falls and handing them out.

Present-day Information Advisor Alan Greenfield (pictured) said: "It all started with Norman by his table in a car park giving out routes - and after that the centre was born. The role of the Information Adviser has changed as technology and communications have

changed, yet we still have an important role to play to help visitors enjoy and understand the beautiful Yorkshire Dales National Park.

"We don't speak to everyone who comes through the door, but I might speak to around a hundred people a day. We had a lady last week who had never been here before; she came in the site for four days on the trot because she absolutely loved it. People appreciate having someone to talk to, to get the information they need, such as walking routes that keep them safely away from the road."

Nigel Metcalfe, an Area Ranger based at Aysgarth Falls National Park Visitor Centre, has remembered 1990, when scenes for Kevin Costner's 'Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves', including Little John's stick fight, were filmed at the falls.

He said: "One day Hollywood legend Morgan Freeman - who was playing Azeem - came into the centre and asked to use the telephone. The member of staff on duty didn't recognise him and, as was the policy at the time, politely asked him to use the public phone in the village.

"Once the film was shown in cinemas

children could be seen fighting on the rocks with wooden sticks during the summer months. I'd pick up many sticks from the car park at the end of the day, dropped by weary young fighters." Member Champion for Promotina Understanding at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, Derek Twine, added: "Gathering materials for this 50th anniversary display at Aysgarth Falls has been an emotional and enthralling trip back in time for staff. It's reminded us of how it all started with a National Park warden equipped only with a Landrover and some home made leaflets.

"Like Norman Crossley, today's staff just love to talk to people about this astonishingly beautiful area and explain the work that is going on to conserve the landscape and wildlife."

Following the opening of Aysgarth Falls National Park Visitor Centre in 1973, a purpose-built centre opened in Malham in the spring of 1975. Two further visitor centres opened in Hawes and Grassington. The National Park Authority also supports 'partnership centres' in Reeth, Sedbergh, Kirkby Stephen and Kirkby Lonsdale.

Muker Parish Council Minutes of Parish Council Meeting Held August 2023

The Parish Council meeting was held on the 31^{st} August 2023.

Present: Cllr Metcalfe, Cllr Reynoldson, Cllr Rukin, Cllr Calvert Chair presiding.

Clerk: Mr Michael Cleminson.

Matters Arising:

Surface Dressing of **Potholes Thwaite to Keld**: A number of Parishioners had noted that some quite deep potholes had been surfaced dressed without being filled first. The Clerk posed this question to NYC but received no response. A complaint was made, a response has been received, but it does not address the issue.

Permission to **Refurbish 2 Benches** and the Noticeboard situated in Thwaite: The Councillors supported and welcomed this initiative.

Benches, Muker Village Institute: One of the benches is rotten and requires attention. A member of the public has offered to install a new memorial bench to replace it. Louise the Hall Jupp, secretary to å Institute, posed the question of liability. The Councillors stated that they merely grant permission and are not liable for any benches situated in the Parish. This responsibility lies with the owners of the benches. Clerk to advise the Secretary.

Defibrillator at Tan Hill Inn: A recent inspection by the Clerk revealed that the Defibrillator was missing. Contact with staff revealed that it had not been working for some weeks and

had been removed. The Clerk informed them that the defibrillator has to be returned to the USA for repair and a loan obtained. It was reported by the Clerk that a number of the pads will need replacing in the next few months. Clerk to install loan when received and source replacement pads when necessary.

Emergency Plan for Muker Parish: Following advertising for volunteers, one volunteer replied. The decision was that this person should be put in contact with Richard Lewis, who developed the Melbeck's Emergency Plan. The Clerk to facilitate this.

Commons Act 2008: Application re Right of Entry - This application was made by Mr and Mrs Hill. A Notice was placed in Muker Village Notice Board, the Parish Council have no comments to make on this application.

Finance:

Barclays Bank have confirmed Cllr Reynoldson as the new Treasurer, who is within days of activating electronic banking for the Parish Council.

Highways:

The Clerk reported that the loose broadband cable on Scarr House bridge had now been temporarily secured. Cllr Metcalfe reported that the nearby road and wall collapse is an emergency repair, and will involve a full road closure. Highways are considering a number of options to get children to and from school, without having to use the Askrigg diversion. Provisionally the works may commence on 11th September. Following a submission of a letter by the Clerk to Rishi Sunak MP, matters have progressed very quickly.

Downgrading of Gritting Priority from Grade 2 to Grade 3 - Silver Hill to

West Stonesdale, which effectively means the road will not be gritted at all in the future. On Friday 25th August a Microsoft Teams meeting took place with the Winter Review panel of NYC to discuss the downgrading. The Clerk and a representative for Cllr Rukin joined the meeting and outlined concerns for this downgrading. The main concerns were for the safety of school children and school bus driver, and local residents who have to use this route with its 25% gradient and 2 very sharp bends. It is believed that the decision was made to downgrade before the meeting took place. It was agreed a site visit with representation from the Parish Council to confirm the number of grit bins and appropriate locations. Councillors would be appalled if this decision is confirmed, and would wish to write a letter to NYC and to copy in to Rishi Sunak MP to outline our concerns for the removal of this service which has been in place for over 50 years. Clerk to action letter.

Cllr Rukin reported that the cattle grid at Tan Hill remains blocked but West Stonesdale has been cleaned out. Clerk to report to Highways. Councillors have noted that many previous reports have not been resolved. Clerk to contact Highways.

NYC

Plans to adopt 20mph speed limits across all 30mph areas, will not go ahead. However, Councillors can make application to reduce their speed limits, if it is felt appropriate. The Councillors were of the opinion that 20mph only had a place outside schools.

YDNPA

Planning Ref R/06/15F - and R/06/15G/ LB - High Smithy Holme/Anty John's Keld, The Parish Council supported both

applications to renovate and preserve for re-occupation of a former dwelling. Planning Ref R/06/262B/LB - Hope House, Keld - to replace single glazing with a double-glazed window. The Parish Council supports this application, as it will be identical to the existing and will maintain the building.

Both of these application are supported by the Parish Council.

Planning Ref 21/00523/LBC - Tan Hill Inn - this is a revised application for the one first submitted in September 2021. The Councillors noted the changes to the plans and consider the new plans to be more aesthetic and in keeping with the dales and supported the application. Only one concern remained regarding parking, which may be a problem in the future.

Planning Ref R/06/272 - Change of Use of Barn to Camping Barn at Skeugh Head Barn, Angram

It was noted that this application has now been refused.

YLCA:- A Planning information web page is now available to the Parish Council

Correspondence/AOB:

Gritting -Silver Hill to West NYC have renewed their Stonesdale. fleet of gritters with larger vehicles which cannot traverse Silver Hill. Councillor Rukin said that if the gritting is removed, drainage along the road needs to be addressed to minimise water on the road surface. Also a reflective post or marker board to be placed on the road to Tan Hill at Mould Hill, Ordnance Survey grid reference 889054 to improve driver safety. The Clerk to report these matters to Highways.

Scarecrows in Upper Swaledale - The Councillors have noted the positive

impact of the Scarecrows to both the Community and visitors, and wish to thank Jenni Hall from Hope House for organising this, and hope it will become an annual event. The Clerk to send a letter on behalf of the Parish Council.

Medical Equipment Recycling Scheme reaches 5 Tonne Mark

A community-led initiative encouraging residents to drop-off unwanted medical equipment has been hailed a success after five tonnes of items have been donated in just 12 months.

In October last year, new recycling bins were installed at household waste recycling centres (HWRCs) across North Yorkshire and York in partnership with Medequip, which provides community equipment services to local authorities and the NHS across the UK.

Since then, five tonnes of equipment have been donated, the equivalent of almost 7,000 crutches.

All of the items are assessed, safety

tested and either repaired and reused or stripped down for recycling.

Executive member for waste services, Cllr Greg White, said: "We would like to thank everybody who has supported the scheme and take this opportunity to encourage more people to come forward and donate.

"Recycling unwanted equipment is not only great for the planet, but also reduces the costs of buying new. Such items are designed to be kept in use for as long as possible and are simple to refurbish.

"By making the most of return and reuse schemes, we can help make a positive impact on the environment and help the vital NHS resources go further."

The average hospital could save £46,000 a year if just two out of every five walking aids were returned



for reuse. Faulty walking aids that are beyond repair can be recycled as scrap metal, generating income for the trust. North Yorkshire operations manager at Medequip, Darren Clark, said: "We understand how crucial it is to inform the community about the importance of returning equipment.

"We're also committed to simplifying the process of arranging collections or returning equipment to accessible locations.

"Through our partnership with Yorwaste, we're making it more convenient and straightforward for everyone."

Medical equipment can be accepted, free of charge, at all North Yorkshire Council household waste recycling centres.

Equipment, including the following, can be placed in the Medequip bin:

- adjustable walking sticks
- adult crutches
- chair raisers
- commodes
- bed levers
- wheeled adjustable frames
- perching stools
- raised toilet seats
- pressure cushions
- toilet frames and trolleys

Between 1885 and 1916, Carl Fabergé made fifty jewelled eggs – Easter presents from Russia's last two

their emperors to wives. Since the brutal murder of the last tsar and his family in a Siberian basement, these eggs have become the most famous surviving symbols of the Romanov Empire: both supreme examples of the jeweller's art and the vulgar playthings of a decadent court. After going missing in

the Revolution, most of the eggs reemerged in the storerooms of the Kremlin, where they were

immediately identified as a source of much-needed foreign exchange. Their subsequent history holds up a mirror to the twentieth century and encompasses Bolsheviks and entrepreneurs, tycoons and heiresses, con-men and queens. Eggs have been sold and smuggled, stolen and forged. Now, as they return to Russia, their history - like that of Russia itself - seems to have come full circle. Then there are the eight eggs which remain missing. What prospect is there that they will ever emerge, and if

they do, will anyone believe that they are genuine? Toby Faber wrote Fabergé's Eggs: One Man's Masterpieces and the End of an Empire, described by P.D. James as a 'fascinating story which combines unique decorative art, contemporary culture, history and the murder of the Romanovs with the excitement of a crime novel'. The lecture, by Toby



Faber, is illustrated with pictures of the eggs today and their owners, and with archival material showing some of the missing eggs.

The lecture will take place at Tennants Garden Rooms, Leyburn, DL8 5SG on Tuesday 28th November at 2pm. Guests welcome, £10.



Swaledale Bus Changes


A reminder that bus services in Swaledale have altered temporarily due to a road closure between Muker and Thwaite.



The team is made up of highly trained volunteers available, 24/7 in any weather, any time Incidents Sept 9th to 9th Oct 7 Incidents this edition On average we respond to between 40 to 50 calls each year.

Incident 40: 08/10/2023: Called to check several small potholes in the Stang forest to make sure a missing dog hadn't fallen in. Unfortunately, nothing found.

Incidents 39: 07/10/2023: Called by the Ambulance service to rescue a fallen walker near Hardraw Fall in Wensleydale. Part of a well organised group. Assessed by the team, then assisted later by the Air Ambulance crew. Finally evacuated by stretcher to the waiting road Ambulance.

Incidents 39: 03/10/2023: Called by the Ambulance service to rescue a walker following a slip on the very wet terrain. Treated and evacuated to the waiting Ambulance. Incidents 38: 30/09/2023: Called by the Ambulance service to assist with a walker having a medical emergency, helimed and members of the wellequipped walking group assisted. Casualty evacuated from the fell by the team. Despite the best efforts of all the casualty didn't survive.

Incidents 37: 23/09/2023: Halfway through incident 35 we had another call to Rescue an injured walker following a 30 foot fall off the cliffs at Kisdon waterfall, Keld. Given the reported injuries we called for the Coastguard helicopter, the Great North Air Ambulance Service was also attending alongside **Yorkshire** Ambulance crews. We also had RAF Leeming MRT training in the area so called them too. With all assets on scene a horizontal stretcher raise was undertaken with the hope of the helicopter winching, unfortunately due to weather and terrain it wasn't possible, so we continued on foot back to the air ambulance. As always, a huge thanks to Rukins campsite and farm for running kit on the guad bikes. We made it back before dark too

Incidents 36: 23/09/2023: Α mountain biker suffered a medical on the fells above emergency Gunnerside, while calling the Police and asking for mountain rescue, they flagged down a passing walker who happened to be a team member. A quick assessment of the casualty and once the team vehicle arrived, they were driven from the hill to the village.

Incidents 35: 14/09/2023: Called by the Ambulance Service to assist with the rescue of an injured walker above




