

Assessing Housing Need - we need your help!

As some of you will know, the Upper Dales Community Land Trust (UDCLT) is a local, volunteer-led charitable organisation, whose mission is to help alleviate the critical shortage of affordable, sustainable housing for people born, living or working in the Upper Dales. The Trust came into being in 2017 and since then has been working hard to establish funding, support and opportunities towards achieving that mission.

Our first project has involved the purchase and planned conversion of the former Methodist Chapel in Bainbridge into two affordable 2-bedroom flats, and we are excited that building work is to commence shortly on this Upper Wensleydale site.

In the meantime, it is so important that we get an accurate and up to date picture of the extent and nature of housing need in the Swaledale/ Arkengarthdale area. 'Housing Need' means a situation where a person's accommodation is for whatever reason unsuitable for their housina requirements, and they cannot afford to buy or rent a dwelling more appropriate to meet their needs on the open market. It can also include those who may have lived here previously and want to return

If you think you may be in housing need, the most important first step is to visit North Yorkshire Home website. Choice (NYHC) www.northyorkshirehomechoice.org.uk You will need to register and qualify with a local connection to he considered for properties in the future. You can find out more and check if you are eligible on the website or get there via the QR code below.

Please pass this message on to anyone you think may qualify.

In order for the UDCLT to respond to the housing needs of local people, we need those individuals or families to be registered with NYHC.

In addition to individuals registering their housing need, the UDCLT will be undertaking a simple survey of local businesses, asking about their employee needs in the next few years - so keep an eye out! In the meantime if you have any questions please email udcltrust@gmail.com.

Muker Parish Council Minutes of Parish Meeting Held October 2023

Present: Cllr Metcalfe, Cllr Reynoldson, Cllr Rukin, Cllr Peacock for part of the meeting, with Cllr Calvert, Chair presiding.

Clerk: Mr Michael Cleminson.

Apologies: Cllr Porter.

Matters Arising:

Community Buy Out - Farmers Arms Mr Richard Walls attended Muker the meeting and outlined the proposal to proceed with a community purchase of the Farmers Arms. Mr Walls said The Kings Head at Gunnerside was successfully acquired by a community buyout with the assistance of The Plunkett Foundation. A Board or Committee would be set up to outline the control and direction of the business, setting the expectations of how the business would be run. It was pointed out that a number of grants of up to £250k are currently available to assist with the purchase. Cllr Peacock said she had some experience of this and would assist where she could. The premises are currently registered as a Community Asset. The first step in the process is to approach the current owners to see if they would be willing to proceed with a Community Buyout, and then seek individuals who are prepared to invest in the business. The Parish Council unanimously agreed to support the application. Mr Walls and another person are to make initial contact with the owners, to begin the process.

Upper Dales Healthwatch (UDHW)

Central Dales Practice. The minutes are now available from the North Yorkshire Council website under Muker Parish. Uploaded by the Clerk when received.

Defibrillators. The Clerk pointed out that The Ambulance Service, in the case of an emergency, are directing the caller where appropriate to collect the nearest defibrillator. The Clerk is then notified of its use and must check that it has been returned and is in working order. The Clerk asked that if, in his absence, a Councillor would check that the used defibrillator is returned and working. The Clerk can then notify the relevant authorities.

Invitation to Online Planning Seminar. The Clerk took part last year, and it was not considered necessary to revisit this. Finance:

The electronic banking is now active **Highways**:

Scarr House Bridge & Retaining Wall repairs, preparation works commenced on Thursday 28th September. The road was closed on Thursday 5th October. A service road is in place for essential services ONLY. The Council is grateful to the landowners for allowing the service road across their land. The closure is necessary because the road has partly collapsed and will need to be excavated. These works are scheduled for 12 weeks until mid-December. however Highways hope to complete before then, weather permitting! Cllr Metcalfe stated that the movement of the retaining wall was first reported in August 2019 a response received stated the situation had been noted but it did not meet their criteria and it would be monitored. The Council were of the opinion that a prompt repair of this

could have prevented the current situation.

Downgrading of Priority Gritting from 2 to 3 on Silver Hill. The Clerk reported that Highways had informed him that there was no appeals procedure. The Clerk to write to Rishi Sunak MP to establish if there is a possibility of restoring this 50 year plus service to the community.

Surface Dressing between Thwaite & Keld. Highways have conceded that some of the potholes were not filled before proceeding, but they have since been examined and have no sharp edges and do not meet the criteria for further action.

Road Closure at Ivelet. Councillors asked if this matter could be expedited to remove the diversion, as soon as possible. The Clerk to contact Highways.

Pot Holes B6270 near to Smithy Holme. Councillor Calvert reported that there were 2 potholes, the 2nd one created by traffic avoiding the first one. Clerk to report to Highways.





Swaledale – an insider's guide

If you're reading this, the chances are you're pretty familiar with Swaledale, because most Gazette readers probably know the place reasonably well.

So you might think a newly published little book by Joe Willis, called "Swaledale: An insider's guide" wouldn't have much to offer you. But you could be wrong. The cover claims



"From Richmond to Ravenseat including all the beautiful in between." And it does just what it says on the cover. But this is no ordinary tourist's guide. Heading on a journey updale,



noting all the interesting places en route, it gives inside info on artists, crafts people, musicians, local characters, history, geography and much more. It be familiar to you, as he's the editor and founder of the online newspaper "Richmondshire Today", a great source of information on community events and goings-on.

Joe writes in a chatty and laid-back style, as though you're best mates and he's giving you handy hints and tasty titbits about the best things to see and do in Swaledale. While the book is an easy and entertaining read, I suspect that even octogenarian Swaledalians may come across something that makes them think "Good heavens, I didn't



know that".

Review by Elizabeth Bedford Images from the book by Ian Short

paints an informative and amusing picture of this unique part of the country. And if the words alone aren't enough, the photos are pretty stunning.

Phase 1 Complete

After much hard team work, sleepless nights, meetings and form filling, the Phase1 renovation works for the Low Row Institute were completed in time for our Christmas Craft Fair! Our new insulated roof, double glazed windows and doors, plus our new LED lighting are creating a warmer, more energy efficient and welcoming place for our

visitors and hall users. The total cost was £62,561 and we could not have done it without the generosity of Community First Yorkshire, local donations and the funds raised by wonderful our

100club and 'Friends of the Institute' groups. A huge thank-you also to our contractors. Calvert & Jenkinson, who bent over backwards to help bring in this project on a tight budget. It was great to use local contractors and help support the local economy as well. It's also extremely heartwarming to receive all the positive feedback we have been getting, and use of the hall is rising rapidly! The Committee are having a well-earned rest now before commencing the Phase2 works, which will completely refurbish the main hall whilst still retaining its character. Upgraded heating, insulation and dry lining of the walls will raise the thermal efficiency of the building even Additional lighting, further. audio, video & hearing loop systems along with

built in storage will create an all-round 21^{st} century facility for the community to use. A fire alarm system and full redecoration of the hall will complete Phase2. This will not be cheap. Estimates so far suggest we shall be looking at raising another £50,000 for this stage of the work. Work is not expected to start until the end of the year at the earliest, but plans are in place to give the old girl a tidy up and a lick of fresh paint until the full works

Last Link Restored after 2019 Floods

bridae over Slei Gill Arkengarthdale, to complete a four- Yorkshire work

A total of 13 river crossings were in Swaledale swept away Arkengarthdale thunderstorms on 30 July 2019.

The bridge at Slei Gill, which is on the route of a popular bridleway in an area steeped in lead mining heritage, is the last significant piece of rights of way infrastructure to be put back.

The Tees-Swale: Naturally Connected project, a joint venture funded by the National Lottery Rangers and volunteers have built a Heritage Fund and led by the North in Pennines National Landscape and the Dales National Park year programme of flood recovery Authority, paid for all the materials, which were sourced from Hartlington Fencing Supplies near Grassington.

> and In November those who had worked to following restore the crossing met local horse riders and cyclists (see picture). They tried out the new ford surface constructed from precast concrete panels. The job took six weeks for two rangers, who were assisted each day by Dales Volunteers.

Member Champion for Recreation Management at the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, Lizzie Bushby, "Through the Tees-Swale: said: Naturally Connected programme we have been able to improve six circular routes in this glorious part of the National Park. The Slei Gill bridge and ford make possible a circular walk or ride from Fremington and Reeth up to Langthwaite, where people can stop for refreshments at the Red Lion Inn, which itself was badly affected by the 2019 floods. It's really satisfying that this last link has been restored

"Sincere thanks are due to the 12 Dales Volunteers, including members of the Ragged Robin group, who worked on the bridge. Many hands made light work, especially when gathering stone from the beck to face the bridge abutments.

"Thanks also go to our contractors who lifted the concrete panels into place; the ford is now easier for riders to cross than it was before the floods. And the work simply wouldn't have been possible without National Lottery players and the support of The National Lottery Heritage Fund."

North Yorkshire Council delegates responsibility for rights of way maintenance in the Yorkshire Dales National Park to the National Park Authority. However the council has helped with repairs to the public rights of way network affected by the 2019 storm, including by replacing two 18metre footbridges.






"2023 best reads" book reviews

The Lincoln Highway by Amor Towles is the story of two young brothers, one recently released from a young offenders facility, setting out to find their mother upon the death of their father. They believe she is in California and she left their father years before because of his failures in all his business ventures.

The brothers encounter multiple setbacks and the plot twists and turns cleverly but plausibly. They get entangled with a sprawling cast of characters both benign and evil. 
