

A Word from the Vicar— Sabbatical

I have been granted a Sabbatical from 1 May to 31 July this year. The word is similar to Sabbath - a rest, a break, a change of focus. This is the first time that I have been able to do this, and it comes after 18 years in my current role.

Some of this time will be for rest and recreation and will give me some extended time to spend with my family, who all live south of London, and whom I don't see very often.

A clergy sabbatical also has to include a 'project', so I will be working with theological colleges in Salisbury and Oxford, learning about and contributing to their training for student vicars about rural ministry.

In Oxford, I will give a talk about my life and work as a vicar in the dales and offer a case study about our 2019 flooding for their course about Disaster Management. In Salisbury, I am going to talk to the students and visit local vicars, to do a small research project on how the training that is offered about rural ministry impacts their decisions about the kind of parishes that they decide to work in later on.


All this means that, while I will be at home for some of time, and you will see me around during the summer, I am officially 'not at work' in Swaledale and Arkengarthdale for those 3 months.

Our curate, Rev Linzi Blundell, will be stepping up to run things day to day, and she will be the first point of contact for Sunday worship, funerals, baptisms, weddings and other church matters. This should be good experience for her, as she is coming to

the end of her curate training ('apprenticeship') and will soon be looking to move to take on her own parish.



Comedy and music in one hit

The award-winning Montana native Rich Hall is renowned for his expertly crafted tirades, quick-fire banter with audiences and delightful musical sequences. Rich, who has won the Perrier Award (Edinburgh Comedy Festival) and featured in BBC One's QI, Live at the Apollo and Have I Got News for You, will perform his oneman show Shot from Cannons on 30 May at Tennants in Leyburn. 



We received this intriguing enquiry from Simon R Wilkinson, one time locum for Dr Bell in Reeth in 1974. If you can shed any light on this, please contact the Editor.

Many years ago now, while waiting in the fish and chip queue in Gunnerside we got talking with an elderly man who had been in the army and told us the story of Operation Gunnerside from WWII. He knew we'd be interested as we now live in Norway where the operation led to the successful blowing up of the facility which the Germans had been using in Rjukan, Norway, to supply heavy water. His tale said that the original plan had been for training of a joint UK/Norwegian team up the gill, but in the end only the Norwegians participated. I have never read about this story in any Swaledale literature and wonder if any of your readers might know anything about it?

Muker Parish Council Minutes of Parish Meeting Held January 2024

Present: Cllr Porter. Cllr Reynoldson, Cllr Rukin, Cllr Metcalfe and Cllr Calvert Chair presiding.

Clerk: Mr Michael Cleminson. Apologies: Cllr Peacock.

Matters Arising

Transparency code. The Clerk informed the meeting that the council is required to make all documents and finances accessible to the public free of charge on line. At present this function is hosted by North Yorkshire Council (NYC). However, the hosting 2025. will cease on 25 March Therefore, the Council needs to develop a way to ensure all of its documentation is available on-line At present the Clerk uploads documents to NYC, who load onto their site to be accessible to the public. The Clerk has been in contact with Cllr Peacock, who said that Hudswell Parish Council did not have a website either and face the same problem. The creation of a website is probably required. Cllr Metcalfe suggested the Clerk contacts Yorkshire the. Local Association to see if they can assist and advise. The clerk should also explore any other opportunities to enable the Parish Council to fulfil its transparency obligations. The Clerk pointed out that Arkengarthdale Parish council have a website that is suitable for a small Parish

Circulation of minutes. The Clerk informed Cllrs that many Councils make their minutes available after the

meeting rather than waiting until the following meeting. Councillors agreed minutes be circulated once approved by the Chair.

Emergency Planning. The clerk is in the process of arranging a meeting between representatives of Keld and Muker Village Halls to submit grant applications to fund generators.

Car parkina Muker. Cllr Metcalf informed the meeting that a resident of the Parish had been issued with a parking ticket for parking on the land on the left before the car park and Muker bridge. Cllr Metcalf and a member of the Moor committee believe this is not part of the Highway. previously used as the site for the village bonfire. The resident appealed the ticket but this was rejected on the grounds that Highways own the land up to the wall. The moor committee are hoping to establish that this is common land. The Clerk to correspond with Highways and the Parking Enforcement to outline the Council's concern that restrictions should not be applied on this land and the appeal reconsidered.

Finance:

An order to pay was raised for 2 new defibrillators batteries for Thwaite and Keld, also 3 defibrillator pads for Muker, Thwaite and Tan Hill a total cost of £885.60.

Highways

Cllrs noted that works had been completed at Scarr house, beyond Usha gap farm to Muker and Ivelet.

Cllrs wished it be noted that the works had been professionally completed in good time. Scarr House and Usha Gap bridges are still waiting planning approval by National Parks.

Winter Gritting Policy. The Clerk said despite this a reply had been received from NYC excellently concerning arittina of West it does not meet the gritting criteria. Clerk to inform planning. It was confirmed that the promised YLCA: nothing to report site meeting had not taken place. Cllr Date and Time of Next Meeting: aritted during the recent cold spell, Muker Village Hall. that he personally was gritting the hill. Further that Highways keep filling just the same 2 bins, instead of all of them. and some also need re-locating. Cllr Rukin also said that if Highways are not going to grit the roads then all the gulleys should be cleaned out regularly to prevent water running onto the road then turning into ice. It was agreed that a site visit was essential to ensure that this section of road can be made as safe as possible in the absence of gritting. Should a site visit take place, Cllr Rukin said he will take Highways up to Level Hill Top on the Tan Hill road bend, at the 90-degree which currently has no warning signage, this lack of signage and the potential danger has been reported twice recently. Clerk to contact Highways to arrange the promised site meeting. MP Rishi Sunak to be copied into all correspondence.

Cllr Calvert reported that the Grit Bins needed replenishing on Hoggarths Hill and surrounding area.

Treated by the Ambulance Service and team Dr / medics. Evacuated out of the gorge and carried, with help from the Ambulance HART. to the waiting Coastguard Helicopter. The casualty's party and team then hauled out. See picture right, stretcher haul out of Gayle Beck.

Incident 09: 28/03/2024: Called by the Police to locate a couple of missing walkers who had become benighted. Using our Sarloc Rescue technology we quickly found them safe and well and returned them to civilisation. Thanks to Neil White, the farmer for his assistance too.



Parish Council's Response to the Proposals for Secondary School Pupils from 2025

Taken from Muker Parish Council Minutes on 31st March. Full minutes will be published in June.

Proposal to move Senior Upper Dales school children to Kirkby Stephen 2025. The September Yorkshire consultation by North Council (NYC) to engage with the community has been poor, arranging meetings in distant locations, none in Upper Swaledale and at inconvenient times. A meeting could have easily been held in Muker Village Hall or Reeth to improve access for parents at convenient times. Parents have received no correspondence from NYC and Schools at Richmond and Kirkby were unaware of proposals until contacted by concerned parents. The concept of moving senior school children to the nearest school has not been thought through; there is no consideration of geographic and weather conditions experienced Upper Swaledale, particularly the route from Swaledale to Kirkby There are real concerns Stephen. about children's safety travelling to Kirkby Stephen. The road is currently not gritted and Cumbria Council will not grit Tail Brigg hill as some years ago a gritter left the road. The road is in a very poor state of repair having been neglected for some years, in sections there are no suitable passing places, erosion and passing vehicles have caused the shoulders of the road to collapse, reducing further the width

of this single-track road. The one person who was able to attend a consultation meeting understood that there was no certainty about how children would be transported to school. They were informed that the present arrangement is not financially viable. The Parish Council does not believe that the move from the catchment area to the nearest school is viable. The Parish Council is also aware that the move to transport children from Arkengarthdale Barnard Castle, and Reeth children to Leyburn School all involve traversing high ungritted moor roads. these proposals have a high potential of placing children at risk. All of these routes in winter are subject to adverse weather conditions and the severity can vary across the route from fine weather to heavy snow in a short space of time. Diversions on safe routes would be excessive and would shorten education significantly the increasing travelling times.

The children from Upper Swaledale have attended Richmond Schools for 70 years without issue. undoubtedly a cost-saving exercise for NYC with no consideration at all of the logistical consequences, safety to children and their long-term well-being and mental health. The Parish Council is firmly of the view that North Yorkshire, the largest county, is very diverse, ranging from City, Urban, Town, Village, Hamlet and remote rural dwellings. This one size fits all blanket proposal is not suitable for Upper Swaledale. The Parish therefore believe the policy proposal needs to carefully consider each area individually and exceptions in unique

circumstances should be catered for by NYC using its discretionary powers. Safety and child well-being must be paramount and financial considerations by NYC should not be the primary concern. It was agreed that the Parish Council should communicate far and wide with Rt Hon Rishi Sunak MP and senior officials at NYC. This proposal may be implemented from the September 2025 school term.

This month's recommendations

Gyles Brandreth may not be everyone's cup of tea, but one of his books has proved surprisingly popular with some of our readers. So much so that several have bought their own copy rather than hogging the one that we have in the library. The book is called Dancing by the Light of the Moon, subtitled "How poetry can transform your memory and change your life." Quite a claim.

At 10,565 lines, Paradise Lost probably isn't the best one to start with, but there are lots of easier ones in the book to set you off.

Other recommendations this month come from Yvonne Howard - The Rose Code by Kate Quinn, and The Zookeeper's Wife by Diane Ackerman. And William Manning suggests The Bright Edge of the World by Eowyn Ivey.

"A Matte of life and death..." by John Hunter

....No, not a typo, but a reference to one of my favourite movie tricks. As an artist I've always been fascinated by this process, and even as a young boy used to try and find 'matte lines' when watching the TV (not easy on the old B&W 425 lines!) - so, a short detour from the usual 'review' for a little look at how paintings can do things cameras can't and often increase the apparent budget of any film.

Originally called 'glass shots' because they were actually oil paintings done on sheets of glass - with areas of the picture left 'blank'. If the camera filmed through this sheet at the live action 'behind' then the illusion of 'fake' and 'real images should blend seamlessly - well that's the concept! Over the decades some real masters of this craft developed at the big studios, and many exteriors and interiors were created by these paintings, with the audience usually blissfully unaware! Peter Ellenshaw was the supremo at Disney (Mary Poppins etc) Mike Pangrazio in the 80s (Raiders of the lost ark etc) and the great Brit Albert Whitlock (see below) who razed San Francisco to the ground and made the Hindenburg fly again!

The process developed to include 'travelling mattes' where basically an object could be 'matted in' and move across a background (think Superman flying) - and many more complex variations still. From the onwards, much of the hard labour was absorbed by computers ('digital mattes' etc) although someone, somewhere

often created a 'traditional' painting initially. As this is essentially a 'visual' topic, I'll let these few pictures tell their story and encourage you to read further (and look out for the occasional 'fuzzy' edge where a painting meets live action!)

Everyone has seen the 'Love Bug' - here is Herbie's 'home' (totally fictitious) shown in the Alan Maley matte painting, along with the same scene in the film. The only live action is the garage door and road immediately in front of the building, where we see cars drive up hence the 'black' (blank) area in the painting (pictures 1 and 2)



"Swaledale Farmer" podcast on Sheep and **Nature**

Series Three of Voices From The Dales. Swaledale Farmer. has been produced by journalist Andrew Fagg, from the Hawes. with support of the Tees-Swale: Naturally Connected programme.

Professor Sir John Lawton, who chairs the Tees-Swale: Naturally Connected programme said: board. "'Swaledale Farmer' gives a voice to the farmers of Swaledale and Teesdale. We are working with farmers to share knowledge and skills, at a time when we need to make England's wildlife and

ecological network bigger, better and more joined up.

"I would warmly invite hill farmers across the Yorkshire Dales and North Pennines, as well as all those interested in land management in the uplands, to tune in to this fascinating podcast series."

Largely funded by The National Lottery Tees-Swale Heritage Fund, the programme is led by the North Pennines National Landscape team and the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority, working with farmers and land managers to enhance and connect

Hill farmers and people interested in land management are being urged to tune in to 'Swaledale Farmer'. a new series of the Voices From The Dales by the Dales podcast published Countryside Museum in Hawes.

15-minute episodes Six. feature Swaledale sheep breeders: Christine Clarkson from Muker, Sue and Ray Ridley from Kexwith near Marske, and Michael Watson from Harwood in Upper Teesdale.

The chief subjects are Swaledale sheep breeding and farming with nature, with elements of oral history -

habitats in these special landscapes for the benefit of wildlife and local communities.

Each episode of Series Three of Voices From The Dales, 'Swaledale Farmer', takes its title from a direct quote from the farmer contributors, while descriptions reveal the highlights of each episode:

Episode 1 - 'Deep Black' (Christine Clarkson part 1). Champion Swaledale sheep breeder Christine checks on tup Mo. (see picture left). She shares the story of her farming career and her thoughts on the direction of the Swaledale breed as well conversation between tourists overheard in Muker's famous meadows. Episode 2 - 'Eager To Learn' (Christine Christine speaks Clarkson part 2). about wildflower identification, hay meadow management and peat depth She reveals how the testina. authorities once regarded Kisdon hill being of insufficient environmental interest to warrant stewardship payments, and closes with

stirring advocacy of the importance of local communities.

Episode 3 - 'So Much Grass' (Sue Ridley). Sue describes the unique location of Kexwith Farm in lower Swaledale, with its moorland rights for sheep. She humorously rejects the title of 'farmer's wife', tells the story of the revival of a remnant of ancient woodland, and reveals how engagement with stewardship schemes has led to healthier stock and more grass.

Episode 4 - 'Side By Side' (Ray As Ray gives his beloved Ridley). White Park cattle a scratch in a rainshed. reveals battered he. Swaledale sheep numbers have come down over the years as stewardship schemes have come in. He describes how lapwings and sheep 'look out for each other', how 'scrapes' have been dug to provide habitat for the birds, and how he grew up on the farm wondering at the abundance wildlife.

Episode 5 - 'Maar Rain No Hay' (Michael Watson part 1, see picture below of Michael at Stoney Hill Farm). Michael fothers the sheep in a high allotment. He paints a picture of the scene in Upper Teesdale, and describes how much the stock means to him. The talk turns to the changing climate and Michael reveals that 2023 was the



first time no hay was made at Stoney Hill.

Episode 6 - 'A Big Part' (Michael Watson Rachel and part Watson) Michael shares his knowledge of bird life on the farm. stressing that there is as much wildlife about as there ever was. He describes how the farm business is dealing with the government's major change to farm payments. Michael shares his views on the Swaledale breed while looking over his gimmer hoggs, and there's a cameo from daughter Rachel who describes her attraction to a career in hill farming.

'Swaledale Farmer' is available from podcast apps such as Apple Podcasts, or Spotify, and is also available to listen at Buzzsprout or the Dales Countryside Museum website.


