

The Children's Society – Annual Box Opening

Too many families are living in poverty and teenagers in particular are suffering as a result. Often they take on their family's money worries, desperate to find a way to help. Our house box collections are so important as the Children's Society works to make sure the teenagers (who are children too) can get the right support as soon as they need it.

House Box collections like ours raised more than £720,00 last year and the Children's Society supported more than 72,000 children across the country.

When Eva was younger, things were really difficult. Her relationship with her dad was challenging, leaving her feeling rejected and confused. It made her feel overwhelmingly sad and it impacted on her confidence and mental health.

Desperately unhappy, Eva began to look for ways to regain control of her life and her emotions. Healthy eating and fitness seemed like a good outlet, but it quickly became obsessive. Eva was referred to the local children's mental health service for help with disordered eating but after a year's wait, support was refused. That's when a family friend suggested The Children's Society and Eva met Emily, one of the specialist project workers.

Working with Emily, Eva regained her confidence and was introduced to a community wellbeing clinic where Eva now volunteers and interacts with others. Today Eva is looking forward to the future.

Our House Box collections help the Society to provide therapy and

wellbeing support for thousands of children every year.

It is now time for the annual opening of our boxes. This will take place on Wednesday 8th October from 2.00 pm - 4.30 pm at the Vicarage, Langhorne Drive when the money will be counted.

We appreciate that many of you do not use cash now so may not have much money in your box. Ride The High Country By John Hunter

We're returning to 'classic' territory

this time, and one of my favourite western films. Here we have a (soon to be) maverick young director, two ageing stars, two 'new' young stars, a bevy of familiar character faces, but at the time such a small budget that it played as the lesser half of a double feature. Released in 1962, just two years before of 'spaghetti the era westerns' began, and seven before the

director's uber-violent 'Wild Bunch' - a western depicting the very final days of the 'wild west' but still dealing with themes of trust, honour and loyalty.

Opening with Joel MaCrea riding into town and being confronted with a racing camel, a policeman and very early motor cars, the audience is caught off-quard, but very soon we're back in more usual surroundings - a brawl, gunfights and a dangerous set of unstable brothers seekina vengeance. The ageing MaCrea is joined by Randolph Scott playing an old friend (but intent on duplicity), his young friend (newcomer Ron Starr) female and vouna (Marietta Hartley's first starring role) on a trek to gold mining country, where gold and money is to be exchanged. A hasty wedding (in a brothel!), an attempted assault, a double-cross and a final showdown resolve a tense vet movina plot very satisfactorily.

Scott and MaCrea bicker and reminisce throughout (often referencing plots from their actual earlier movies) and remind us what great actors they were, while Sam Peckinpah directs with a sure hand showing only glimpses of the


> violence that marred some later works. There is terrific from score (unknown to me) George Bassman and superb location photography (by the great Lucien Ballard) of the Inyo National Forest and Bronson Canyon. The supporting cast is veritable who's-who of western characters - the violent brothers played by LQ Jones, John Anderson.

Warren Oates and the 'Virginian' himself James Drury. RG Armstrong scores heavily as the fanatically religious father of the girl whose harsh treatment of her sets the main plot in motion

There is one other key player involved—the supposed 'judge' at the mining camp who officiates at the 'wedding'. In the tradition of earlier articles about well-known faces, I'll leave you with his picture and reveal the name next time. You will have seen him in countless westerns (and starring in his own series

shown over here in the early '60s) - see if you can name him. We'll feature more of these well-known but 'nameless' faces in future articles.





Bike park plans approved after mum's campaign

A new community bike park is set to be built in North Yorkshire after council planners approved the scheme.

Louise Raine launched a campaign for the park in Richmond after she had to travel for 45 minutes to find a suitable one for her three children to use.

North Yorkshire Council approved the proposal for the free-to-use facility, which will see a network of graded bike trails built in fields off Green Howards Road

Although planning officers said the development would affect the heritage of the town, they agreed any harm would be outweighed by the benefits to the local community.

Ms Raine told the meeting: "Because Richmond has no safe and purpose-built space at the moment, kids are riding on the pavements, in car parks and at Richmond School, where there's fencing going up currently, which will put that out of bounds as well.

"I started having conversations with the community and this was a snowball effect. I got so much positive feedback from families, from local children, from parents, and then from the town council, local groups, organisations and businesses."

She said she was grateful to members of the local community who had offered their help to get the scheme off the ground.

'Tremendous opportunity'

According to the <u>Local Democracy</u> Reporting <u>Service</u>, Richmond division councillor Stuart Parsons praised Ms Raine for doing a "magnificent job" in getting the community to support the scheme.

Clive World, from Richmond Town Council, also spoke in favour of the project at the meeting.

He said: "We are unanimous in supporting this application and delighted that the officers have also recommended granting it.

"This is a tremendous opportunity as there are no similar facilities within approximately 35 miles.

"Backing for this scheme has been overwhelming."

He said there had been concerns about the availability of parking and the existing car park on Whashton Road would therefore be extended by 15 spaces.

Knowing where waxcaps and other grassland fungi are thriving helps organisations to pinpoint where fragments of ancient meadows survive, so they can protect them for the future. Ingleborough National Nature Reserve expands by 179ha

Ingleborough National Nature Reserve (NNR) will almost double in size to 1,186 hectares (2,930 acres), becoming the 12th area to be added to the King's Series of National Nature Reserves. The site supports nationally important wildlife species including curlew as well

as the black grouse and ring ouzel both on the red list of threatened birds. It is also just one of four places in the UK where visitors can see Teesdale violets, one of two places in Yorkshire where purple saxifrage only place that grows, and the Yorkshire sandwort can still be found. Ingleborough is also known for having some of the best-preserved examples of limestone pavement, which have been protected since the 1990s. Cleaning up Barney Beck well underway

In 2023, Parliament adopted a legallybinding target to halve the length of rivers polluted by harmful metals released from abandoned metal mines by 2038. In Swaledale, there are 150 km of rivers that are polluted by metals (including lead, cadmium and zinc). Of these, Barney Beck in Upper Swaledale is one of the most heavily polluted. Old mining activities in the area left behind loose, metal-rich soil which washes into the beck when it rains, impacting water quality and ecology. Pollution is also caused by contaminated groundwater (mine water) which flows out of the drainage tunnels built by the miners. Using innovative methods, the Tees-Swale funded project aims to reduce heavy metals entering the river by encouraging vegetation to grow, while

Local Housing Needs survey

The Results are In!

Back in May this year, most residents in Arkengarthdale and Upper Swaledale received a Housing Needs Survey through their letterboxes. In addition. the Upper Dales Community Land Trust (UDCLT) rang round the majority of businesses in the area with a short telephone questionnaire. Thanks to all those who responded to either or both of these surveys. The UDCLT and North Yorkshire Council's Rural Housing Enablers wanted to formally assess the level of shortage for affordable, sustainable housing for people born, living or working in the Upper Dales - and the results are in.

The published Survey Report summary states: "Based on the results of the Needs Survey, Housing it is recommended that a total of affordable homes are required to meet the housing need identified across the Parishes surveyed." It goes on to say: "It is also important to note that although we currently have an identified need of 17 affordable homes, experience has shown us that once any scheme starts under

construction a hidden need may come forward which has not been included in this report."

The results provide solid evidence to back up the UDCLT's long-held beliefs around the shortage of affordable homes for local people living and working in the remote Upper Dales. The Housing Needs Survey Report also energises the Trust's ongoing Chapel Garth project: to build four new sustainable and affordable homes in Arkengarthdale, the northern-most Dale in the National Park. The scheme has outline planning permission and the UDCLT, in association with North Star Housing Group, will be exploring funding and partnership opportunities. We will also be consulting and involving the local community along the way to make sure that everyone is kept in the picture.

Although we have a challenging time ahead we also know that we've succeeded before - with the beautiful affordable homes created at Bainbridge's former Methodist Chapel - and we've also built some incredible partnerships and relationships along the way, essential to making our vision a reality.

Local Plan examination begins

In August the Yorkshire Dales National Park Authority submitted the Yorkshire Dales National Park Local Plan 2025-40 to the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government for inspection.

It marks the beginning of the formal, independent examination on the Local Plan, which is a set of planning policies guiding development in the National Park until 2040.

Following the submission of more than a hundred reports, assessments or other evidence papers, the National Park Authority notified all consultees and has published a new Local Plan examination webpage:

https://www.yorkshiredales.org.uk/parkauthority/living-and-working/planningpolicy/local-plan-2025-40/examination/

The Local Plan considers what kind of development local communities need, as well as how best to protect the National Park's special qualities.

Member Champion for Sustainable Development Richard Foster said: "We have reached the legal milestone where we hand over the Local Plan process to a Government planning inspector, for independent examination and scrutiny.

"At this stage we don't know when the hearing sessions will be or what are the main issues the inspector will choose to focus on. However, we know the examination hearings will be held at the National Park Authority's head office at Yoredale in Bainbridge, and that they are expected to take place during the autumn."

Details about the hearings will be publicised once the examination timetable has been prepared.

The archaeology and local history group's next regular monthly talk is on Tuesday 14th October, 7.30pm, in Fremington Village Hall, aka Fremington Sunday School. This will be the group's Annual General Meeting. It will be followed by a talk by Stephen Clark on 'The Rise and fall of the Marske Estate, 1597-1965'. Last month I looked at the Grinton-Fremington Dykes, as examples of large features in the landscape which often go unnoticed. Known as strip lynchets, these long, narrow fields along the hillside formed the Reeth West Field and probably reached the extent we see today in the early 14thC when population was at a maximum before the Great Famine of 1315-22 and later Black Death. The Scott Trial

Every year on a Saturday in October Marske, Marrick and Arkengarthdale are busy with the followers and spectators of the world-famous Scott Trial - an endurance motorcycle trials event.


The Scott trial, started in a similar fashion to the "reliability rides" that were popular in pedal cycling at the beginning of the last century. It was a test of machine as well as the rider. Alfred Scott had founded the Scott Motorcycle company in 1908 and began producing powerful motorcycles based on twin two-stroke engines. These fast machines won a number of Isle of Man TT races before the First World War. The first Scott Trial was in 1914 when the company challenged its workers to ride from their factory in Saltaire, Bradford to Burnsall, near Grassington.

Since 1950 the event has been based in Swaledale organised by the Richmond

Motor Club. The "Scott" typically covers 130km and is entirely off-road. Over 60 local landowners, farmers, land agents, and gamekeepers give permission for the Trial to cross their land - a special dinner is organised each year to thank them all.

The Scott Trial also requires a very large local volunteer effort. Simply marking the course requires 7500 flags to be put in place. On the day itself over 250 volunteers referee the course ("observers"), marshal spectators, and are on-hand at pit stops to add petrol to tanks ("splash and dash" teams). The Trial raises up to £10,000 each year for local charities and organisations.

The race starts in the morning at Park Top Farm. Competitors do the route "on-sight"; there is no chance to practice any part of the route beforehand. The route includes a number of "Observed Sections". Here, riders accrue penalty points if they put feet down whilst traversing challenging rocky ravines or crossing rivers. For example, a full stop with both feet down will lead to a 5 point penalty. The names of the Observed Sections illustrate the terrain: Cold Knuckles,

Goats Splash, Grand Canyon, Tank Trap, first time anyone has ever won five Surrender, and Rotten Wood. Typically, years in a row. only around half the 200 starters make it round the course in full. The team is made up of highly trained volunteers available, 24/7 in any weather, any time of the day or night.

MOUNTAIN & CAVE RESCUE TEAM

On average we respond to between 40 and 50 calls each year.
In 2024 we attended 53 incidents.

Incidents 10th Aug 2025 to 7th September 2025: 7 Incidents this edition

Incident 36: 27/08/2025: The team provided rescue cover for the Richmond boundary walk. This ancient 16 mile walk happens every 7 years.

Incident 35: 26/08/2025: A couple of team members

were flagged down outside the Kings Head Gunnerside following reports of an overdue walker Fortunately, couple of local residents had the located exhausted walker a way up Gunnerside Gill.

A couple of team members went up to assist the group down.

Incident 34: 24/08/2025: Called by the Police to assist with the rescue of two injured walkers on the Pennine Way above Keld. On arrival it turned out that the Great North air ambulance could manage.

Incident 33: 17/08/2025: Called by the Police to reports of a child in the water at Richmond Falls, we responded along with the other 999 services. Sadly, a body was recovered by the divers and evacuated by the team.

Incident 32: 15/08/2025: Our third call of the day, called by the Ambulance service to rescue an injured walker near the riverside at Round Howe. Treated on scene and evacuated to the Ambulance

Incident 31: 15/08/2025: As we cleared incident 30 the Ambulance service requested our help to evacuate an injured walker. The job was just onto Upper Wharfedale Fell Rescue Association (UWFRA) area so we gave them a call. A quick search and a bit of detective work found the casualty to already be in hospital, so we stood down

Incident 30: 15/08/2025: Called by the Police to rescue an injured paraglider on the hills above Hawes.



This month's training was held underground at West Scrafton Pot

Treated on scene by the Ambulance service and then later by the Air Ambulance. Evacuated by a mixture of North Yorkshire Police officers, Ambulance Service and Mountain Rescue. Each team member carries a short safety rope which allowed for a safety line to be added for the short haul to the aircraft.


